LAKWOOD HIGH'S SENIOR THIRD BASEMAN, RICARDO GUTIERREZ,
NAMED 5-A DIVISION BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989

Ricardo Gutierrez, coach Spud O'Neil's error-less senior third basemen who led Lakewood to the Moore League title this past season, has been voted 5-A Division Player of the Year by members of the First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles board of sports journalists.

Gutierrez, the Lakewood Lancers' leadoff man, batted a robust .447 with 36 RBIs and three homeruns. He garnered a near-CIF Southern Section record 52 hits and knocked in 36 runs. The 6-0, 160-pound senior had 14 stolen bases and was charged with no errors.

Lakewood completed its season 25-4, losing to eventual 5-A Division champion El Dorado in the semi-finals (3-2 in eight innings). The Lancers had previously defeated Crescenta Valley (6-4), Hawthorne (14-4), and Fontana (4-0) in the initial playoff rounds.

Coach Steve Gullotti's El Dorado Hawks (23-8 for 1989) won their first ever large school's baseball crown (won 2-A title in '76 and was runner-up in 3-A play in '81).

Finishing second in the Empire League (to Loara) El Dorado bested Nogales (5-2), Arcadia (7-2), Mater Dei (4-2), Lakewood (3-2 in 8 inn.), and then Moore League runner-up Millikan (2-0) for the title.

Millikan (21-9), which now has a 2-3 record in large schools title games, defeated Palos Verdes (4-3), Culver City (4-3), Simi Valley (6-3) and Wilson, HH (2-0) before being blanked in the championship round.

MARK MATTINGLY, CERRITOS HIGH SCHOOL SENIOR PITCHER, IS
VOTED 4-A DIVISION BASEBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989

Mark Mattingly, coach Richard Emard's ace right-hander, who led Cerritos High School to the 4-A Division baseball championship this past season, has been voted Player of the Year in his division by members of the First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles board of sports journalists.

Mattingly, who compiled an 11-2 mound mark, limited Hart High to five hits in the division final winning convincingly, 4-1. Prior to the title-decider, the Dons' ace was responsible for three playoff wins and one save. For the season Mattingly registered 105 strikeouts and boasted a 1.17 era.

Cerritos ended its season 26-6, as they eliminated Northview (5-0), Anaheim (7-5), Notre Dame (6-1) and Glendora (2-1) before going against Hart for the championship. Cerritos finished second to Downey in the San Gabriel Valley League.

Hart, a team averaging 11 hits in the playoffs before meeting Cerritos, completed its season 25-7. On the way to the finals Hart beat LaSalle (23-4), Walnut (10-5), Buena (10-7) and South Hills (14-0). Hart was Foothill League runner-up to San Gabriel.

The 4-A Division boasted five quality catchers this past season... two of them, Casey Burrill of Hart and Julio Vargas of Santa Ana, sharing first team honors. Both were second team members on last year's 4-A Division team.
