

**KIM THOMPSON (COMPTON) & MICHELLE STEVENS
(WESTLAKE) VOTED CO-MVPs IN 4-A DIVISION '85**

THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN 4-A DIVISION GIRLS BASKETBALL FOR 1985, WITH COMPTON'S KIM THOMPSON AND WESTLAKE HIGH'S MICHELLE STEVENS EARNING THE HONORS. AND YET ANOTHER PLAYER, MUIR HIGH'S PAULINE JORDAN, WAS NOMINATED FOR DIVISION MVP HONORS, BUT LOST OUT IN THE CLOSE BOARD VOTE.

The Compton Tarbabes captain over the past two seasons, Kim Thompson led coach Carolyn Montgomery's team to a perfect 26-0 season and number one ranking in the state. A member of last year's 4-A all-stars, Kim has been an all-Moore League pick over three years. She was the leader on a team that defeated Santa Monica (84-33), Pomona (86-43), Westlake (77-33), and Lynwood (60-46) before defeating Muir (24-2 for the season), 50-42. Thompson pulled down 15 rebounds in the title decider.

Michelle Stevens, guard-forward for Westlake (Marmonte League Champions), was Ventura County Player of the Year and three-year Marmonte League MVP. A three-year All-CIF pick, Michelle averaged 19 points this year and scored 1,408 points over her career at Westlake.

FOOTHILL HIGH SCHOOL'S JENNIFER OSUR NAMED TOP PLAYER IN CIF DIV. 3-A BASKETBALL FOR 1985 ...

THE FOOTHILL HIGH SCHOOL KNIGHTS DEFEATED PREVIOUSLY UNDEFEATED BREA FOR THE 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP AND COACH SHEILA ADAMS STAR GUARD, JENNIFER OSUR, REAPED SOME OF THE REWARDS AS SHE WAS NAMED DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. JENNIFER LED THE CENTURY LEAGUE CHAMPIONS TO A 28-3 RECORD DURING 1985, SCORING 19.8 POINTS PER GAME AND AVERAGING SIX REBOUNDS, SEVEN ASSISTS AND SIX STEALS PER GAME. SHE SHOT 54% FROM THE FIELD FOR THE 14-0 CENTURY LEAGUE CHAMPIONS.

It was a sad end to the Brea Wildcats dream of a perfect season. The Orange League Champions were 29-0 going into the title game, which they lost to Foothill, 63-34. The Wildcats had defeated Irvine, Orange, Loara and Riverside Poly before meeting Foothill. The Knights eliminated Kennedy (63-31), El Toro (63-50), Woodbridge (67-43) and Palmdale (54-50) before whipping Brea for the title.

KIM CRAWFORD, 6-1, SENIOR CENTER ON COACH HARRY BOTTORFF'S 2-A DIVISION CHAMPION SAN LUIS OBISPO TIGERS BASKETBALL TEAM, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1985 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. THE TIGERS, LED BY KIM CRAWFORD AND AUDREY ROCHA, DEFEATED LA QUINTA 47-45 IN THE FINALS, GIVING COACH HARRY BOTTORFF SOMETHING POSITIVE TO REMEMBER. HE IS RETIRING AFTER 25 YEARS OF COACHING.

Crawford, called by coach Bottorff, "the best overall player in the 2-A division," averaged 18.0 points. In the title game against La Quinta, Crawford had 14 points and 14 rebounds, plus four blocked shots. The Tigers fashioned a 25-3 season and as the Northern League champion, defeated St. Bernard (61-42), Monrovia (51-50), La Puente (34-32) and Chino (45-43) before the title decider. La Quinta wound up the year 26-5.

KIM FAIRCHILD, BORON HIGH SCHOOL CIF CHAMPION STAR FORWARD, VOTED SMALL SCHOOLS MVP FOR '85

BORON HIGH SCHOOL'S SENIOR FORWARD, KIM FAIRCHILD, WHO LED THE BOBCATS TO THE CIF SMALL SCHOOLS DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1985, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN HER DIVISION BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S HIGH SCHOOL BOARD OF ATHLETICS. FAIRCHILD, WHO FINISHED THE REGULAR SEASON AS THE SOUTHERN SECTION'S 11TH HIGH SCORER (23.2 POINTS OVER 17 GAMES), LED COACH BRAD WIGGS' CHAMPIONS TO A 19-3 SEASON...THE LAST 17 GAMES SETTING A SCHOOL RECORD FOR CONSECUTIVE VICTORIES.

Fairchild, who was a member of the Small Schools Division all-stars as a junior, averaged 14.6 rebounds over the season as the Bobcats won the Desert Inyo League title with a perfect 10-0 record. Fairchild is joined on the all-division team by teammate Maggie Aston, who averaged six assists and 9.5 rebounds during the year. Flintridge Sacred Heart, which lost to Boron in the championship game, 47-42, also placed two performers on the all-star team. The Tologs, Horizon League champions, concluded their season 22-4.

Boron defeated Newport Christian (49-20), Templeton (44-36), Ramona Convent (49-33), Rio Hondo Prep (71-50) and Flintridge Sacred Heart in the finals. Maricopa was small schools champion in 1984 and returned to the playoffs this year as Tri-County League champions. The Indians won their first two playoff games, but lost a close encounter to Trona in the quarter-finals, 63-57.

KEITH MALONE, SERRA HIGH'S SCORING LEADER, IS VOTED TOP 5-A DIV. BASKETBALL PERFORMER FOR '86

KEITH MALONE, SERRA HIGH SCHOOL'S SENIOR SCORING LEADER AND NUMBER SEVEN SCORER (25.6 POINTS) IN THE SOUTHERN SECTION OVER THE REGULAR 1986 SEASON, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 5-A DIVISION BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK/AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. MALONE LED SERRA TO THE CAMINO REAL LEAGUE TITLE (14-0) AND A FINAL BERTH IN THE DIVISION PLAYOFFS BEFORE LOSING TO UNDEFEATED (29-0) MATER DEI, 86-59. THE CAVALIERS WON PLAYOFF GAMES OVER MARINA (102-67), PIUS X (86-70) AND EDISON OF HUNTINGTON BEACH (61-57) BEFORE LOSING THE TITLE-DECIDER TO COACH GARY MCKNIGHT'S MONARCHS (86-59). MALONE SCORED 19 POINTS IN A LOSING CAUSE FOR THE CAVALIERS.

It was Mater Dei High School's second consecutive 5-A title and its third large division championship in the past four years. Among the most successful high school basketball programs in the country, Mater Dei carried a 59-game winning streak into the Southern California Regionals, where coach Gary McKnight's winning streak came to end...59-57 at the hands of Los Angeles City 4-A Division Champion Crenshaw. Following two undefeated seasons (Mater Dei did not compete in the State Championships last year) and a lone Southern Regional win over Edison of Fresno (81-74), Mater Dei's dominance ended in one overtime against the perennial L.A. City champions.

Mater Dei, on its way to another 29-0 Southern Section season, defeated St. Francis (72-61), St. Anthony (72-63) and St. Bernard (62-58) before closing out its 5-A Division undefeated season (86-59) over Serra. The Cavaliers concluded the '86 season 23-5.

Members of the 5-A Division all-star team will be honored at the 49th annual All-Southern California Basketball Awards Program sometime in early May. First Interstate Bank in association with the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles carries on this high school awards program dating back to 1937. Special framed scroll awards and medallions will go to honored recipients.
