E DISON HIGH OF HUNTINGTON BEACH WON THE CIF 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE CHARGERS' PREMIER CENTER, KRISTI SMITH, HAS BEEN ACCLAIMED THE DIVISION'S MVP BY MEMBERS OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS....A COMMITTEE OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS WHICH HAS MADE SIMILAR SELECTIONS IN THE SOUTHLAND SINCE 1937.

Named Orange County Player of the Year, Kristi was a 1-A Division selection last year as a player at Elsinore High School. She was this year's Player of the Year in the Sunset League and she matched her 20-points-per-game average of 186, as she led her team to a 31-2 season. Edison lost to San Diego champior Pt. Loma, 56-45, in the Southern Cal Regional finals.

Edison coach Dave White calls his 6-1 senior "the best player in the CIF." She led the Chargers to wins over Mira Costa (79-39), St. Joseph of Lakewood (70-47), Compton (60-56) and Santa Barbara (61-49), before defeating Buena (52-46) for the 4-A title. Kristi scored 21 points in the championship game.

Two of the southland's top prep girl basketball performers -- carrie egan of brea-olinda and andrea knapp of Louisville -- have been named co-players of the year for 1987 by members of the first interstate bank - amateur athletic foundation of los angeles board of sportswriters.
