ED STOKES, ST. BERNARD HIGH SCHOOL, UNANIMOUS MVP OF
CAMINO REAL LEAGUE, NAMED TOP PLAYER IN DIVISION I FOR 1989

EDWARD STOKES, 6-11 SENIOR CENTER FROM ST. BERNARD HIGH SCHOOL, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION I BASKETBALL FOR THE 1989 SEASON BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK- AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

In leading St. Bernard to the El Camino League title, Ed Stokes scored an average of 25 points per game and averaged five blocks. He was 5th in the C.I.F. Southern Section in rebounds with an average of 15 over the team's 29-game season (23-6).

St. Bernard advanced to only the second round of the Southern Section playoffs before losing to Citrus Belt League kingpin Redlands, 65-56. Millikan won the 5-AA title game, 62-59 in overtime, against Saddleback.

In the 5-A playoffs, Capistrano Valley won the title. The South Coast League Champions defeated league runner-up Irvine, 76-49, in the finale advancing to the Southern Cal Playoffs.

Neither Division I entry got past the first round of play in the state playoffs. Millikan lost to Fremont of Los Angeles (66-60), while Capistrano Valley was dropped by LA's Manual Arts (69-63).

All players named for all-star team honors will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles scroll awards. Players of the Year will receive medallion awards, while championship team coaches will be recognized with plaques.

All-star teams have been selected by the Athletic Foundation's All Southern California Board of Athletics for 52 years. All teams named by the Foundation's selection board are on file in the AAF library, located in the Paul Ziffren Sports Resource Center.

TRACY MURRAY, GLENDORA HIGH SCHOOL, STATE SCORING RECORD
BREAKER, NAMED DIVISION II PLAYER OF YEAR IN UNANIMOUS VOTE

TRACY MURRAY, 6-8, 220-POUND SENIOR FORWARD AND THREE-TIME BASE-LINE LEAGUE MVP, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION II BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

OVER A 31-3 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON, MURRAY AVERAGED 44.26 POINTS PER GAME...A C.I.F. SOUTHERN SECTION AND CALIFORNIA STATE RECORD. IN THE FINAL WEEK OF THE REGULAR SEASON, MURRAY HAD ALREADY BECOME THE STATE'S TOP ALL-TIME CAREER SCORER (2,705 POINTS).

Playing every position on the floor at one time or another during the season, Murray led the Tartans to the Baseline League Championship and into the Southern Section 4-AA playoff. Although Murray scored 41 points in the title game against San Bernardino, the Tartans lost 72-69 to the Cardinals who completed a perfect 30-0 season.

Both Glendora and San Bernardino qualified for the Southern Cal playoffs, meeting in the semi-final game. The Tartans defeated San Bernardino this time, 52-46 and then edged Dominguez, the Southern Section 4-A champ, 61-57, for the Southern Cal title.

Advancing to the State Championships against Menlo-Atherton of the Central Coast Section, Murray scored 64 points in a losing cause. Menlo School won the Division II crown, 89-83.

Dominguez, the San Gabriel Valley League champs, won the 4-A Southern Section title with wins over Cypress (64-33), Rosemead (86-66), Barstow (54-36) and Artesia in the final (78-49). Dominguez beat Monache of the Central Section (78-37) and Torrey Pines (78-70) before going down before Glendora (61-57)....in the Southern Cal Playoffs.

RICK SWANWICK, TRABUCO HILLS CENTER, WINS UNANIMOUS ACCLAIM
AS TOP PLAYER IN DIVISION III FOR THE 1989 SEASON

RICK SWANWICK, WHO LED THE TRABUCO HILLS MUSTANGS ALL THE WAY TO THE CALIFORNIA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP ONLY TO FALL ONE POINT SHY (62-61 TO CENTRAL VALLEY...NEAR REDDING), HAS BEEN NAMED THE SOUTHERN SECTION'S DIVISION III PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTER-STATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES AWARDS BOARD.

CALLED BY HIS COACH RAINER WULF, "THE MOST DOMINANT PLAYER IN EVERY ONE OF OUR GAMES THIS YEAR," SWANWICK SCORED EVERY SECOND-HALF POINT IN TRABUCO HILLS' LOSS TO THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIANS. AT 6-10 AND 225 POUNDS (HE HAD TRIMMED OFF 65 POUNDS OVER LAST SUMMER) SWANWICK WAS TRULY A "DOMINANT" FORCE.

Winner of the Pacific Coast League, the Mustangs had few problems in capturing the Southern Section 3-A championship. With wins over Rancho Alamitos (84-58), Savanna (75-68), Estancia (75-71) and San Luis Obispo (65-52) they advanced to the Southern Cal playoffs with a title-win over Corona del Mar (59-55).

In Southern Cal play, the Mustangs defeated Clairemont of San Diego (87-60), Lemoore of the Central Section (86-79) and Morningside of the Southern Section (60-57) to grab the Southern California gold ring.

SANTA CLARA JUNIOR FORWARD, SHON TARVER, UNANIMOUS SELECTION
AS DIVISION IV PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989 BASKETBALL SEASON

SHON TARVER, WHO LED COACH LOU CVIJANOVICH'S SANTA CLARA SAINTS TO THE SOUTHERN SECTION TITLE IN 2-A PLAY...THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CHAMPIONSHIP IN DIVISION IV...AND THE CALIFORNIA STATE TITLE IN THE SAME DIVISION, WAS A UNANIMOUS SELECTION AS PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN ANNUAL SELECTIONS BY THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' HIGH SCHOOL SELECTION BOARD.

Only a junior, the 6-5 Tarver draws high praise from his coach, Lou Cvijanovich. "In my 31 years at Santa Clara, 36 in the county, I have seen only one other player with Tarver's ability...that player being Keith Wilkes."

A transfer from Rim of the World High School where he scored an average of 29.5 points last year, he averaged 21.8 points this season. He averaged six rebounds, three blocks, 2.5 assists and 2.6 steals during the season, which saw the Saints go 27-3. Two of the losses were forfeits.

Tarver is joined on the Division IV all-star team by teammates Bubba Burrage and Art Santana. Both Tarver and Burrage were 2-A division second team members last year.

Two other players are back from last year's all-star team. James Loggins from Cabrillo was a 2-A division second-teamer in '88 and Jeff Zelenski of Paraclete was on the 1-A team last year.

The selection committee changed its format of selection this year following the state playoff bracketing (by enrollment). Also, any teams "playing up" in the playoffs are considered in that division for the selections.

MITCHELL BUTLER, OAKWOOD HIGH SCHOOL, UNANIMOUS SELECTION
AS SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISION V PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989

FOR THE FIRST TIME IN THE 52-YEAR HISTORY OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, A SOUTHERN SECTION BASKETBALL PLAYER HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR THREE YEARS RUNNING.

IN A UNANIMOUS VOTE BY SELECTION COMMITTEE MEMBERS IN THE BOARD'S 52ND ANNUAL MEETING HELD RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY, OAKWOOD HIGH SCHOOL'S MITCHELL BUTLER BECAME THE FIRST SUCH SELECTION. BUTLER WAS NAMED THE SMALL SCHOOLS DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN BOTH 1987 AND 1988.

A new selection format was used in this year's selection by members of the First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles selection board. Division V all-star team members are from schools represented in the state playoff format (by enrollment) and from schools playing in small schools and 1-A division play.

Should a school have elected to "play up" to a higher division in the playoffs, players from that school would be eligible accordingly

Mitchell Butler, headed for UCLA, led his team to an 18-6 record in '89 and to the 1-A quarter finals. He averaged 29.5 points this season -- 28.6 in '87 & 31.4 in '88 -- and led his team to the small schools title last year as a junior.

He also averaged 16.1 rebounds, 5 assists, 4.3 steals and 2.1 blocked shots.

Bel-Air Prep won the Small Schools title (64-58 over Newport Christian) and the Southern Cal title (50-49 over Immanuel of Reedley). Menlo School beat the Bruins 64-59 for the state title.

Mission Prep defeated Flintridge Prep 56-48 for the 1-A crown. Mission Prep lost to Immanuel of Reedley, 55-45, in the first round of the Southern Cal playoffs.
