LISA LESLIE, MORNINGSIDESIDE HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR, WINS ACCLAIM
AS PLAYER OF YEAR IN DIVISION I GIRLS BASKETBALL FOR 1989....

LISA LESLIE LED HER MORNINGSIDESIDE MONARCHS' TO SOUTHERN SECTION,
SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AND STATE TITLES IN 1989 AND IT WAS, THEREFORE, NO
SURPRISE THAT ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL NAMED HER
PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION I.

Morningside, ranked number one in the state, won its last 23 games
of the season finishing 32-1. The Monarchs only loss was to Southern
High of Louisville, Kentucky.

In the 5-AA playoffs, the number one seeded Morningside dominated
the competition including a 71-48 win over Fontana for the Southern Sec-
tion title. In the Monarchs three other 5-AA playoff encounters the
team won by an average of 33 points.

Advancing to the Southern Cal tournament, Morningside whipped Mar-
shall of Los Angeles 88-47, Washington of Los Angeles 53-46 and San Diego
champion Pt. Loma, 45-44. Pt. Loma went into the title game 32-1.

Back in Oakland where last year Leslie had missed a six-foot jumper
at the buzzer to lose to Fremont 53-52, Morningside was not about to let
history repeat. In the 60-50 over last year's champs, Leslie scored 21
points, had 14 rebounds and four blocked shots.

Over the Monarchs 33-game season, Leslie averaged 25 points, 14 re-
bounds and seven blocked shots.

Lisa Leslie finished the regular season as the section's 4th high
scorer.

KATELLA HIGH SCHOOL'S JONI EASTERLY NAMED PLAYER
OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION II GIRLS BASKETBALL '89

JONI EASTERLY, KATELLA HIGH SCHOOL'S 5-11 SENIOR GUARD, LED HER TEAM TO THE SOUTHERN SECTION 4-A CHAMPIONSHIP; TO THE DIVISION II SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA TITLE; AND TO THE FINALS OF THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS IN OAKLAND. IT WAS, THEREFORE, ONLY NATURAL THAT THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF ATHLETICS NAMED HER THE DIVISION'S PLAYER OF THE YEAR.

Easterly wound up 12th on the Southern Section's season scoring list, sporting a 22.8 point average. Leading her team through the Southern Section playoffs, Joni saved her best playoff game for the final against Muir, as she registered 34 points in the Knights' 54-48 overtime win.

Katella defeated San Marcos of San Diego (56-39) and Muir (50-43) before defeating Vista of San Diego (56-50) for the Southern California Championship.

At Oakland in the title game against Grant of Sacramento, the Easterly magic faded. Grant was appearing at Oakland in its 5th consecutive championship and played like it. The Pacers dominated play and won handily 59-43. Katella concluded its season 29-4, while Grant finished 32-3.

Valencia won the 4-AA title 56-45 over Canyon of Anaheim. After beating Mt. Whitney of the Central Section 65-50, the Tigers lost to Vista of San Diego 59-38.

AIMEE McDANIEL, BREA - OLINDA HIGH SCHOOL, NAMED TOP
PERFORMER IN SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISION III BASKETBALL

CALIFORNIA STATE DIVISION III CHAMPION BREA-OLINDA HAD "ONE REASON" IT WON THE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1989....AND THAT ONE REASON IN THE WORDS OF COACH MARK TRAKH IS AIMEE McDANIEL. THE 5-6 JUNIOR GUARD MADE 38 THREE-POINT SHOTS DURING THE SEASON AND AVERAGED 25 POINTS IN THE PLAY-OFFS AS THE LADYCATS FOUND LITTLE BUT TOKEN RESISTANCE IN MOST OF THEIR GAMES.

The four players to make this year's honor team in Division III from Brea-Olinda -- Aimee McDaniel, Tammy Blackburn, Jody Anton and Jinelle Williams -- have eligibility left. In fact, Jody Anton is only a freshman, while Jinelle Williams is a sophomore.

Brea-Olinda's Ladycats waltzed through Southern Section 3-A competition, defeating three of their opponents by 29 points or more. The only team to give the champions a game was St. Joseph of Lakewood, losing in the semi-finals, 65-58. The Ladycats defeated Atascadero for the Southern Section title by 29 points...69-40.

It got little better for Ladycat opponents in three Southern Cal play-off games. Brea-Olinda dispatched Our Lady of Peace (San Diego by 45 points (81-36); Reedley of the Central Section by 30 (78-48); and Lemoore by 32 in the finals (71-39).

Finishing its season 31-2, Brea-Olinda went unbeaten against California opponents. Only losses suffered came in a tournament in New York City last December.

COUNTY MVP, UNANIMOUS CHOICE AS DIVISION IV PLAYER OF YEAR

TAMI ADKINS, CALLED BY HER COACH TOM McCONVILLE "THE BEST POINT GUARD IN CALIFORNIA...TOPS IN ALL CATEGORIES EXCEPT REBOUNDING," HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION IV GIRLS BASKETBALL FOR 1989. ANNUAL SELECTIONS WERE MADE RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' AWARDS BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

A three-time All-Southern Section selection, the talented Adkins has committed her future basketball exploits to the University of San Francisco. Tami has been a four-year starter at San Clara and set school records in assists (574) and ball recoveries (570). She averaged 15.6 points during the past season and 6.5 rebounds. She also averaged 6.6 assists and 7.6 recoveries.

Frontier League Champions, Santa Clara won the 2-A Division title, 43-34 over league runner-up Santa Ynez. Advancing to the Southern Cal playoffs in Division IV the Saints beat Coronado (64-24) and Santa Ynez once again (56-27) before losing to Wasco of the Central Section, 40-38.

St. Joseph of Santa Maria won the 2-AA Division title 55-45 over Morro Bay. St. Joseph was eliminated in the first round of the Southern Cal playoffs by Chowchilla of the Central Section 51-48.

Santa Clara concluded its season 26-1, while St. Joseph wound up 21-6.

All players selected for all-star team honors by the Foundation's awards board will receive beautiful framed scroll awards. Players of the Year will be awarded medallions, while coaches of championship teams will be recipients of plaques.

Small Schools Division Champion Baptist Christian of Hemet defeated the Pilgrim Patriots of Los Angeles 50-47 in the title decider. Becky Drew of Baptist Christian, a repeater from last year's Small Schools team, led all scorers with 30 points.

In the second round of the Southern Cal playoffs, Mission Prep defeated Baptist Christian 54-45 on its way to the Southern California Championships.
