ARRICK MARTIN, DESCRIBED BY HIS COACH AS "THE BEST POINT GUARD IN THE NATION", HAS BEEN NAMED 5-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS. THE ANNUAL SELECTIONS MARK THE 51ST YEAR THAT PREFWRITERS FROM SOUTHLAND NEWSPAPERS HAVE MET TO HONOR PLAYERS FOR THEIR HARDWOOD ACHIEVEMENTS. MARTIN RETURNS FROM LAST YEAR'S 5-A DIVISION TEAM, WHEN HE AVERAGE 31.0 ppg FOR THE SAINTS.

As was true in last year's playoffs, St. Anthony was eliminated in the early rounds after winning the Camino Real League title. Martin wound up th season as the Southern Section's top scorer, averaging 33.4 ppg. On his way to UCLA, Darrick scored 1,989 points during a three-year career of 77 games. In 33 of these engagements he was over 30 points.

Number two finisher Mater Dei turned the tables on number one Angelu League finisher Bishop Amat in the 5-A Division finals, in a 74-65 finale. Coach Gary McKnight's Monarchs, advancing to the Division I regional playoffs, lost to the Central Section's Hoover (Fresno), 64-63, in the first round. Bishop Amat suffered a similar fate, losing to Manual Arts -- eventual State Champion -- 94-91.

Mater Dei defeated Notre Dame (76-66), Edison (55-39) and St. Bernar (87-70) before its title match with Bishop Amat. The Angelus League's top team whipped Bosco Tech (76-56), Jordan of Long Beach (101-76) and Lakewood (62-54) before the title-decider.

All First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angel es all-star team selections are made by All-Southern California Board of Athletics, composed of southland sports journalists. All-star team players, MVPs and title-winnings coaches are honored at the close of each season with special recognitions from the bank and Athletic Foundation.
