Comment: Twelve Seniors gained places on the 1943 All-Southern California Team. Norman Veeh, of Tustin, a brilliant all-around back, was the only player to capture honors for the second consecutive year. Veeh was chosen for the blocking back assignment on the 1942 All-Southern California outfit.

Williams and Hennessey make up a pair of glue-fingered ends, who caught passes galore and knew what to do with the pigskin after they had gathered it in. Both boys sparkled on defense, too. Pomeroy was a definite standout in the line for a strong Whittier eleven, while Hoover Glendale's Bill Tritt was known far and wide for his brilliant play at a tackle post. Keith Deeds, of Wilson, wasn't large, but he packed plenty of TNT at a guard berth. Leuzinger's Bob Lefort is hailed as one of the greatest linesmen in Bay League circles, and that's a compliment -- for many outstanding linesmen have been developed in that League in recent years. Bonita's Dick Mayhew was one of the foremost players of the 1943 prep school football season. He was entitled to the center post. He did everything expected of an outstanding pivot-man.

The All-Southern California sparkles brightly with fast-stepping backs. Veeh, Nebo, Dean and Chadwick are all speed burners who know their way to the goal line. Veeh scored 55 points during the season, Nebo tallied 79, Dean chalked up 71 and Chadwick collected 72. Veeh also passed to 42 additional points. Like Veeh, Nebo excelled at passing. Veeh and Chadwick turned in good jobs in the punting department. Big Al Sawaya, of San Diego, a blocker of the first order, easily annexed the blocking back assignment.

Bob Lefort, guard, is the only 200-pounder on the squad. He tips the beam at 220.

BASEBALL AGREEMENT RATIFIED

The working agreement between the Association of Major and Minor Professional Baseball Leagues and the National Federation of High School Athletic Associations printed in our December Bulletin was approved by the Professional Baseball Leagues with slight modifications.

The text of the agreement will be printed in full as soon as it is available.

We quote a paragraph from a letter just received from Mr. H. V. Porter, Executive Secretary of our National Federation.

"This is a brief line to let you know that the proposed agreement has now been fully adopted by the major and minor leagues. As a matter of fact, the final form of the agreement is probably better than the originally proposed agreement since the exception which was mentioned in that agreement has been eliminated. As a substitute for permission by principal and parent, the agreement will specify that no contract can be made with any high school boy, unless it is in the case of a boy who has dropped out of school for reasons not connected with baseball and who has been out of school for at least one year."

SANTA ANA SUPPORTS TEAM

The Santa Ana High School had a good football team. The school and the townspeople supported the team loyally. The advance sale of tickets in Santa Ana for the final game in the Coliseum on December 15, was \$2,042.40. We have not heard of anyone from Santa Ana who does not think he got his money's worth at the game in the Coliseum.

touchdown. Jones was the leading scorer of the championship Santa Monica outfit. McColl, in addition to collecting touchdown passes, kicked-off for his Hoover squad, defended well, and even passed and punted on occasions.

Two rugged tackles, who excelled throughout the season -- Bob Van Doren, 6 foot, 2 inch, 197 pounder from San Diego, and Lloyd Stringer, 6 foot, 1 inch, 205 pounder from Santa Paula -- were honored by the Board. Both received many recommendations from coaches and officials throughout Southern California who saw them play.

The guard posts on the All-Southern California team, unusual as it is, is well stocked with Powells. Tom Powell of Pomona, and Owen Powell of South Pasadena, earned the honors. Both were 5 foot, 10 inch, 190-pound huskies. South Pasadena's Powell was cited for strength both on offense as well as defense, for his blocking, and point-after-touchdown kicking.

As he did in 1946, Tommy Garcia of Mark Keppel of Alhambra, clamped his arms around the center berth. Garcia, a big 6 foot, 2 inch, 190-pounder, kicked off for his squad, was a bulwark on defense, and backed the line superbly.
