THE ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA C.I.F. HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL TEAM FOR 1958

Southern California's finest prep gridiron performers over the past season, some 36 in number, were named for All-Southern California Board of Football team honors this week, when members of the Helms Board of prep athletics met at Helms Hall in Los Angeles to make their annual selections. It marked the 22nd season that members of the Board have gathered together to pick the top performers from among players competing in the Southern California area.

It did not take the selection committee long to come up with a Player of the Year for '58 CIF action and Long Beach Poly's Dee Andrews was the choice. Dee led his Poly Jackrabbit team to the Harry J. Moore League title and then through four AAA CIF Championship playoff games and the Central Section title for 1958.

A second-team pick on the '57 CIF team, Andrews is among the smallest players to have played in CIF competition this year. He stands 5'10" and weighs 155 pounds, but gave no quarter on the gridiron. Andrews gained 1241 yards in league play for a 10.8 average, while his season total was 1319 on 129 carries for a 10.2 average. He accounted for 19 touchdowns and 10 PATs for 124 points. A ten second sprinter, Andrews placed 4th in the California State Meet high hurdles this year. Besides being a top gridiron performer, Andrews earned two letters on the Poly basketball team. Needless to say, Dee was Long Beach Football Player of the Year for 1958.

Dee Andrews will receive his Player of the Year Helms medal award at the Twenty-Second annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held at Helms Hall on Saturday morning, January 10th at 10:30 a.m. At this time all those players named for CIF and Los Angeles City football team honors will be presented their framed scroll awards. Andrews will also have his name engraved upon the Paul H. Helms Trophy which is permanently lodged in Helms Hall.

The championship Long Beach Poly team placed three of its star players on the all-star teams. Guard Todd Jagerson and Andrews were first-team selections, while Willie Brown, Andrews' running mate, was named on the second team. Colton, Citrus Belt League champions, also placed two men on the first team as did San Diego, champions in the S.D. City League. Colton representatives were Kenny Hubbs, ace backfield performer, and stubby guard Harold Beach. San Diego placed quarterback Ezell Singleton and center Roy Pharis.

Both Poly's Andrews and San Diego's Singleton were second-team members last year and the only repeaters on this year's squad. Other three backs on the first team were Hubbs of Colton, from a line of great athletes; Paramount's Jerry Otterson, all-around quarterback; and Kermit Alexander of Mt. Carmel's Catholic League champions, who averaged 7.4 yards per carry and scored 115 points in league action -- 5th highest in the CIF play.

All players named for C.I.F. Central Section honors will be the guests of Paul H. Helms, Jr. on the morning of January 10th when scroll awards will be presented. CIF championship coaches David Levy (Long Beach Poly), Leonard Cohn (Claremont) and Glenn Forsythe (Ramona) will receive special silver tumbler awards for having directed their teams to section championships. Special guests, including coaches and past gridiron greats, have been invited to help pay tribute to these fine athletes named for '58 gridiron honors.

For the eighth year, Helms All-Southern California Board of Football has selected all-star football teams from the smaller C.I.F. high schools of Southern California....schools which compete with others of equal but smaller enrollment. All-Southern California Board of Football selections have been made since 1937, but only since 1951 has the Board undertaken to pick players from among the smaller C.I.F. high schools.

Player of the Year honors in the North-South section of the C.I.F. went to San Marino High School's outstanding quarterback Bill Redell. A first-team CIF selection last year as a junior, Bill led his Rio Hondo League champions to the finals of the AA schools playoff, where they lost to Claremont, 20-0. Throughout the year Bill was tops on both offense and defense for Coach Vic Schwenk's Titans. Bill scored 71 points for the year, threw for eight touchdowns and kicked two field goals. He was voted the "most valuable player" in the Rio Hondo League, the first time this honor has been voted by the league's coaches. Coach Schwenk says of Bill; "Redell has everything desired in an athlete -- ability, desire, great team player and above all is very humble. I never expect to have another like him."

For having been named Southern California C.I.F. Small Schools Player of the Year for 1958, Bill Redell will receive a special Helms medal award at the 22nd annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held at Helms Hall on Saturday morning, January 10th at 10:30 a.m. At this time all those players named for All-CIF and All-Los Angeles City football team honors will be presented with their framed scroll awards. Coaches, athletes and past stars of the gridiron will join in paying tribute to these great high school grid stars of 1958.

Other star backs to be named to the first team along with Redell were Ramona's Gary Mayer, top scorer in the CIF for 1958; Len Kelly, St. Monica's ace halfback; John Sheeler, Hart's all-around tailback; and Beaumont's George Farrell.

Gary Mayer, right halfback on Glenn Forsythe's championship Ramona eleven, scored 191 points for the season, some 44 points ahead of his closest competitor, Jim Shepherd of Needles, which Ramona defeated in the finals of the "A" school playoffs 26-21. John Sheeler, who led Hart to the semi-finals of the AA school playoffs losing there to San Marino, accounted for 1300 yards in eight games and scored 96 points. He is the only junior on the first team. George Farrell, Player of the Year in the Riverside County League from Beaumont, completed 107 of 180 passes for 1591 yards and 16 touchdowns to rank as one of the southland's top prep throwers. Len Kelly scored 105 points for St. Monica's, leading his team to second place in the Olympic League standings for 1958.

Claremont, champions of the AA Section of the CIF for 1958, placed two players on the all-star teams. Mike Gonzalez, 200-pound guard and co-captain of the Wolfpack, was named to the first team, while Don Kieselhorst, speedy halfback was picked on the second team. Ray Dial, all-around quarterback from Brawley who ran and passed for 1250 yards, accounted for 15 touchdowns during the season. He was named to the third team. Nico Escamilla, iron man left-half on Santa Clara High's varsity this fall, scored 132 points to rank fourth among CIF scorers. He received a second-team spot. Mary Star's Don Shotliff, fullback and linebacker, was a pick on the third team. Don had a 7.8 rushing average and was tops on defense as well. Mar Vista's Jerry Overton was a third-team selection off his fine all-around play. Jerry scored 62 points for the year.

Two players repeated on this season's team from last year. Bill Redell was a first team member in '57, while Needles tackle Duane Lenz, a first-team pick this year, was on the '57 third team. Two juniors are the only lower classmen named. Hart's John Sheller and South Pasadena's Roger Clark. The rest are seniors.
