# BLAIR'S JAMES MCALISTER WINS MVP ACCLAIM "AAAA" FOOTBALL BY VOTE OF HELMS BOARD

To the surprise of no one, sames Mcalister was a runaway pick as Player of the Year in "AAAA" division football for 1969 as Southern California sports journalists met at Helms Hall to make their annual all-star football team selections. Since 1937, members of the southland press have gathered to select the top high school grid stars and in turn honor them for their collective gridiron exploits. The 1969 season was a banner year, as records were toppled right and left.

McAlister and running mate Kermit Johnson rolled up over 4,000 yards between them in rushing offense for the season...a remarkable and unmatched feat in the southland. McAlister's total of 2,168 yards is third best in local history, with his carerr mark (4,367 yards) second only to Mickey Cureton's 4,920 yards.

The 6-foot-one, 200-pound fullback scored 31 touchdowns over the season and a total of 228 points, third best in CIF history. Glenn Davis set the record of 236 in 1942 and then Centennial's Mickey Cureton set the current mark of 240 in 1966.

The Foothill League champions charged through their divisional playoff chores, whipping Bishop Amat in the finale 28-27...and more impressively than the score indicated. In the three earlier playoff encounters the Vikings murdered Hueneme 62-0...ran away from Santa Monica 44-19 and sneaked past Lakewood 24-19, before doing in the Angelus League co-champion Lancers. It is interesting to note that coach Pete Yoder, who directed the title-winning Vikings, also quarter-backed Downey High to the CIF title back in 1957. Coach Pete was an

All-CIF first-team pick that year.

No less impressive over the past season were Patrick Haden and John McKay...a tandem which fractured passing and receiving marks for runner-up "AAAA" playoff entrant Bishop Amat. Only juniors, both McKay and Haden thrilled followers all season long. Over the full season Patrick threw 317 times, completing 211 for 3,015 yards...the latter figure a new CIF mark. Johnny McKay, son of the Trojan coach, was no less a figure in Amat's great season. He caught 106 passes during the year to set a record and recorded over 1,500 yards in the process.

As expected both Blair and Bishop Amat led all schools in put-

ting players on the all-star teams. Blair placed five men...four on the first team....while Amat had four, with three first-teamers.

Just two players -- McAlister and Anaheim QB George Fraser -are back from last year's all-star teams.

SOUTH PASADENA'S DEFENSIVE ACE RICK BOOTH TOPS "AAA" FOOTBALL FOR 1969 GRID SEASON

Rick Booth, number one men on South Pasadena's number one CIF
"AAA" Division football chempions for 1969, was named Player
of the Year by members of All-Southern California Board of Athletics as annual selections were made at Helms Hall, Los Angeles. Booth,
described by his coach Ray Solari, the former Univ. of California grid
star, as "the finest linebacker I have ever had since coaching here,"
was the Rio Hondo League's "Lineman of the Year"...unanimously.

In speaking of his star performer, Solari says, "Booth has a great competitive instinct. His speed, quickness and toughness have produced some unbelievable defensive plays. As a wingback on offense he has been an outstanding blocker, pass receiver and ball carrier."

Rick led his South Pasadena Tigers over some rough competitors on their way to the CIF "AAA" Division grid crown. South Pasadena won over La Puente (27-7), Fullerton (21-7), Lawndale (21-18) and Bonita in the finals...10-0. In defeating the Bonita Bearcats 10-0 in the division finale, South Pas shut out a club that had been averaging over 38 points per game in three playoff meetings. The Bearcats, in their runner-up role, smashed Northview (34-14), Glendora (36-14) and Foothill (46-20).

As might be expected South Pasadena led the way in placing performers on the 1969 "AAA" All-Star teams. Fullback Mike Klof, who scored over 20 touchdowns during the season, was a first-team backfield pick, along with tackle Paul Cole and MVP Booth. Halfback Bob

Schultz was a third-team selection.

Runner-up Bonita High placed three of its performers on the honor teams...ace backfield men Charlie Schuhmann and Allen Carter, a pair of fine halfbacks. Other schools to place three players were Crestview League champion Foothill and Camino Real co-champ Lasuen. Teams to place two selections are Rolling Hills, Garden Grove, Temple City, and Neff.

For having been selected as the "AAA" Division's MVP for 1969, Rick Booth will be recipient of the Helms medallion award which regularly goes to the division's Player of the Year. Coach Ray Solari, who has now won four CIF titles out of five attempts, will receive a special "Silver Tumbler" award, annually presented to the title-winning coach in each division.

The year 1969 marks the 33rd year that All-Southern California Board of Football has made its annual gridiron selections. All players named for honors will be recipients of framed scroll awards to be presented at the annual awards program to be held in January at a time and place yet to be determined.

ootball in the smaller enrollment schools of the CIF, Southern Section, for 1969 produced some great performers. Four of the best of these were named "Players of the Year" in their respective divisions as members of All-Southern California Board of Athletics met at Helms Hall, Los Angeles recently to make their annual gridiron all-star team selections.

Top performer in the Southern Section's three smaller divisions of play were: "AA" Senior fullback-linebacker Robert Evans, who is only repeater on "AA" team, although selected among "AAA-AA" combined team in 1968. Over three varsity years Evans carried the football 718 times for 3,340 yards and 57 TDs. His 1969 totals were 1,453 yards on 237 carries (6.1 avg.) and 30 TDs. Evans also caught 26 passes for 326 yards. Bob has been Golden League "Back of the Year" the past two seasons..playing for "AAA" Div. Champ Barstow in 1969.

Named MVP in the "A" Division was Santa Ynez' John Johansen, a repeater from last year's "A-Small Schools" combined team. Johansen, a fullback-linebacker like "AA" MVP Bob Evans, carried 277 times in '69 for 1,613 yards and 21 TDs. John also scored eight 2-point conversions. Johansen also led his team in tackles from his LB post. In playoff games against St. Bonaventure and Hemet, the big and powerful Pirates' back gained 239 & 195 yards respectively. John also averaged 38.9 yards for 38 kicks during the year, while leading the Pirates to a finals win over Hemet, 20-0.

Co-Players of the Year were named in "Small Schools" Division play for 1969. Players named were Tim Bishop from the title-winning Boron eleven and tailback Pat Marble from Yucca Valley's runner-up Trojans. Bishop, who led Boron to a finals win over Yucca Valley in "Small Schools" play, was an outstanding running back gaining 1,335 yards...997 yards in league action and 335 yards in playoff meetings. Tailback Pat Marble of Yucca Valley who, in the mind of his coach Dick Trone is "the best athlete I have ever coached", gained 1,832 yards up to the finals with Boron (lost 14-0). Pat performed at safety for the Trojans on defense.

The above listed "Players of the Year", along with title-winning coaches Art Davis (Barstow), Will Stensland (Santa Ynez) and Bob Hughes (Boron) will be recipients of special awards at the 33rd annual All-Southern California Board of Football awards program to be held at a time and place to be determind at a later date. Framed scrolls will be awarded to all members of the all-star teams selected for 1969.
