DENNIS SPROUL, LOS ALTOS QB, ACCLAIMED TOP PERFORMER IN "AAAA" FOOTBALL FOR '73 SEASON

DENNIS SPROUL, 6-3, 195-POUND QUARTERBACK WHO DIRECTED THE LOS ALTOS HIGH SCHOOL CONQUERORS TO THE CIF "AAAA" DIVISION FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1973, HAS BEEN SELECTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN HIS DIVISION BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. BY SO DOING, LOS ALTOS BECAME THE FIRST HIGH SCHOOL IN CIF HISTORY TO WIN BACK-TO-BACK TITLES IN "AAA" AND "AAAA" DIVISION PLAY.

LOS ALTOS HEAD FOOTBALL COACH DWAYNE DeSPAIN, WHOSE TEAM WENT 12-1 DURING THE COMPLETE SEASON, SPEAKS IN GLOWING TERMS OF HIS ACE QUARTERBACK AND HIS TITLE-WINNERS OVER THE PAST TWO SEASONS. "SPROUL DID A FINE JOB FOR US THIS SEASON AND HE WILL MAKE SOME COLLEGE COACH SLEEP A LOT EASIER OVER THE NEXT FOUR YEARS. OUR TEAM HAS PLAYED TOGETHER FOR FOUR YEARS AND THEY JUST WORK WELL TOGETHER. I AM EXTREMELY PROUD OF THEM."

In the championship game against Crespi, Sproul completed 17 of 26 aeri-als for 161 yards and one touchdown. The Conquerors won the ball game 21-7 after de-Feating Santa Ana Valley (22-15), Servite (35-17) and Anaheim (34-20). It is in-teresting to note that Los Altos finished second to undefeated South Hills in the Sierra League and got into the playoffs as an "at large" team. They proved to be the very best.

ALL-STAR TEAM PLAYERS HONORED AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN ON SAT., JAN. 19TH

Through the generosity of officials at Magic Mountain Park, those players named for All-Southern California Football Team honors will be guests of honor at the park on Sat., Jan. 19th at which time the 37th Annual All-Southern Cal-ifornia Board of Football will hold its awards ceremonies.

Honored players, coaches, parents and school officials will all be hosted at Magic Mountain for an exciting day of fun following the awards ceremonies which will begin at 10:30 am. Framed scroll awards will be presented to all honored players, while players of the year and championship team coaches will receive bronze medallion awards and silver tumblers respectively.

There are 27 "AAAA" Division high schools represented on this year's selec-tions.....for the first time honoring both offensive and defensive teams. Prior to 1973, teams were selected without signifying offense or defense.

Champion Los Altos placed six performers on the offensive and defensive unitsfive on offense and one on defense. Runner-up Crespi had four players honored, with two on offense and two on defense. Fifty division players are honored on the teams, with St. Paul (4), Santa Ana Valley (3), Newport Harbor (3), Servite (3), Santa Monica (3), North Torrance (2), West Torrance (2), Buena (2) and Anaheim (2) placing more than one player.

CRESCENTA VALLEY'S MARK MILLER NAMED MVP IN "AAA" CIF FOOTBALL FOR 1973 FOOTBALL SEASON

MARK MILLER, CRESCENTA VALLEY'S TALENTED ALL-AROUND PERFORMER WHO LED HIS FALCON TEAMMATES ON BOTH OFFENSE AND DEFENSE, HAS BEEN NAMED "AAA" DIVISION FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL. MILLER, WHO DID EVERYTHING FOR COACH GORDON WARNOCK'S FOOTHILL LEAGUE TRI-CHAMPION TEAM, WOUND UP THE SEASON WITH 1,263 YARDS RUSHING. THE TALENTED 5-11, 170-POUND TAILBACK ALSO PASSED, RECEIVED, RETURNED PUNTS AND KICKOFFS FOR CLOSE TO 1,000 YARDS, WHICH PLACED HIS OVER-ALL YARDAGE RESPONSIBILITY AT OVER 2,000 YARDS FOR THE SEASON.

THE FALCONS BESTED MONROVIA HIGH SCHOOL IN THE "AAA" DIVISION PLAYOFF, 14-7 AS MILLER, A STANDOUT ON BOTH OFFENSE AND DEFENSE, SET UP THE TITLE-WINNING TD WITH A 43-YARD PUNT RETURN TO MONROVIA'S ONE YARD LINE. AS A DEFENSIVE HALFBACK, MILLER WAS OUTSTANDING IN SUPPORT OF HIS DEFENSIVE LINEMEN ON THE RUSH AND WAS AN EXTREMELY "QUICK HITTER" FORCING FUMBLES AND RECOVERING SEVERAL.

THE FALCONS, WHO CLOSED OUT THE SEASON 12-1 AND WHO ENDED THE CIF'S LONGEST WIN STREAK AT 19 (BY MONROVIA), BESTED POMONA (25-0), THOUSAND OAKS (35-8), ST. JOHN BOSCO (34-19) AND MONROVIA...TO END A GREAT STRING OF VICTORIES BY THE WILDCATS.

MAGIC MOUNTAIN THROWS OPEN ITS GATES FOR 37TH ANNUAL AWARDS CEREMONIES

Players honored on the 1973 All-Southern California All-Star Teams will be the honored guests of Magic Mountain Park, as Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics holds its 37th annual Awards Ceremonies at the popular southland amusement park.

Ceremonies will begin at 10:30 am, with players, coaches, parents and school officials taking part in the awards program. Framed scroll awards will be presented to all honored players, with medallions and silver tumbler awards going to players of the year and title-winning coaches.

Forty-nine players, representing 31 Southern California high schools are all-star team members for 1973. "AAA" Division Champion Crescenta Valley and runner-up Monrovia each placed four players on the offensive and defensive teams to lead all other schools in representation.

For the first time in 1973, All-Southern California Board of Football selected both offensive and defensive units.....two on offense and two on defense. Many players who were two-way performers during the year were selected either on offense or defense — not both — so as to make room for deserving one-way players.

Teams with more than player named to the honor squads are St. John Bosco (3), Villa Park (3)....with Burroughs, Culver City, Thousand Oaks, Warren, Chino, St. Genevieve and La Mirada two each. As noted above, Crescenta Valley and Monrovia led the parade with four selections each.

RICK BROWN LED TEMPLE CITY TO AN UNPRECEDENTED FOURTH STRAIGHT CIF "AA" TITLE, 21-13 OVER NORTH RIVERSIDE, ACCOUNTING FOR 163 YARDS IN THE TITLE ENCOUNTER. A BRUISING FULLBACK, BROWN HAS BEEN A MEMBER OF THE SOUTHLAND'S MOST PAMED GRID DYNASTY AND IS CALLED TEMPLE CITY'S "MOST COMPLETE FOOTBALL PLAYER EVER" BY COACH BOB HITCHCOCK. THE RAMS, WINNERS OF 46 STRAIGHT GAMES BEFORE BEING UPSET EARLY THIS SEASON BY ST. FRANCIS, CLOSED OUT THE SEASON UNDEFEATED. CHARGING THROUGH THE PLAY-OFFS, THE RAMS DEFEATED BALDWIN PARK (34-0), SONORA (14-0), RIO MESA (21-6) AND NORTH RIVERSIDE IN THE FINALE. TEMPLE CITY FINISHED THE SEASON 12-1, WHILE NORTH WAS 11-2.

LARRY STEPHENS, GAINING 102 YARDS IN THE TITLE GAME WITH PASO ROBLES — WON BY THE TIGERS 12-0 — RECEIVED STRONG MAJORITY SUPPORT FOR MVP IN THE SINGLE A DIVISION OF THE CIF. STEPHENS, A 5-9, 165-POUND TAILBACK, FINISHED THE YEAR WITH 1,156 YARDS. THE TIGERS WOUND UP THE YEAR 11-2, WHIPPING BEAUMONT (30-7), EL TORO (33-12), PERRIS (39-34) AND PASO ROBLES (12-0).
