## WILLIE GITTENS, FOUNTAIN VALLEY TAILBACK, NAMED SOUTHERN CAL PREP PLAYER OF YEAR -'77

WILLIE GITTENS, 5-11, 175-POUND TAILBACK WHO LED FOUNTAIN VALLEY TO AN UNDEFEATED SUNSET LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP IN THE BIG FIVE CONFERENCE AND INTO THE SECOND ROUND OF THE PLAYOFFS WHERE THE BARONS WERE DEFEATED 21-20 BY LOYOLA IN DOUBLE OVERTIME, HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA'S CIF DIVISION I PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. A NEW SELECTION FORMAT WAS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD FOR ITS 41ST ANNUAL MEETING, WITH SOUTHLAND PREP PLAYERS BEING NAMED IN THREE DIVISIONS. DIVISION ONE ENCOMPASSES THE FOUR CONFERENCES WITH LARGER SCHOOLS...BIG FIVE, EASTERN, SOUTHERN AND COASTAL.

VOTING FOR DIVISION ONE PLAYER OF THE YEAR NARROWED TO TWO OUTSTANDING SENIOR PERFORMERS...TEMPLE CITY'S FINE RUNNING BACK DON ROBERTS AND GITTENS. FOLLOWING CONSIDERABLE DEBATE, GITTENS WAS NAMED THE DIVISION'S MVP.

GITTENS SCORED 28 TOUCHDOWNS IN 1977, LEADING THE BARONS TO A 10-1 SEASON RECORD. TWO OF HIS TDs CAME AGAINST LOYOLA IN THE AFOREMENTIONED DOUBLE OVERTIME, SECOND ROUND PLAYOFF GAME IN WHICH HE RUSHED FOR 140 YARDS. FOR 11 GAMES, GITTENS CARRIED 190 TIMES FOR 1,408 YARDS AND A 7.4-YARD AVERAGE. HE SCORED THREE TOUCHDOWNS OR MORE IN SIX GAMES IN 1977. WILLIE HAD 16 TOUCHDOWNS AS A JUNIOR AND EIGHT AS A SOPHOMORE, A SEASON IN WHICH HE APPEARED IN ONLY FOUR BALL GAMES. HIS COACH BRUCE PICKFORD SAYS OF WILLIE..."HE IS THE GREATEST BACK IN FOUNTAIN VALLEY HISTORY...AND WAS BACK AS A SOPHOMORE."

### 41ST ANNUAL AWARDS CEREMONIES AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN PARK, JANUARY 21ST

All Players named for Division I CIF All-Star Team honors, will be the honored guests at All-Southern California Board of Athletics 41st annual Football awards to be held at Magic Mountain Park in Valencia on Saturday morning, January 21st at 10:30 am. All players, their coaches, guests, school administrators and college coaches will be on hand for the festivities.

All honored players will receive beautiful framed scroll awards, while players of the year will be awarded the traditional bronze medallion.

#### AMF - VOIT FOOTBALLS & BANKERS LIFE TRAVEL BAGS AWARDED

The AMF - VOIT miniature footballs will again be awarded to all players, as they have since the early '50s. Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation coaches awards will be made and BANKERS LIFE will again present striking travel bags to the title-winning coaches.

Ninety-four players have been named to this year's Division I honor team, with 47 players on the three offensive units and 47 named to three defensive teams. Fifty-four high schools are represented on this year's larger schools Division I team.

Last year's 4-A Division Champions, Los Altos High School, captured the Big Five Conference crown this fall and placed six players -- four on offense and two on defense -- on the honor squad. Coach Dwayne DeSpain's Conquerors did just that in major-school-play, as the second place Sierra League entry marched through four Big Five playoff opponents -- Crespi (33-7), Redlands (20-6), Loyola (21-0) and St. Paul in the finals (22-15). Los Altos wound up the year 12-1.

Bob Hitchcock's Eastern Conference Champion Temple City Rams landed three performers on the team. Coach Hitchcock's Rams have won six CIF titles over the past eight seasons...including the 3-A crown in 1976. Bob's boys bettered Mark Keppel (40-14), La Serna (27-14), El Rancho (35-6) and Lynwood (21-7) for the title. The Rio Hondo League's No. 2 team, Temple City finished 10-3 on the year.

Villa Park, Southern Conference title-winner over Los Alamitos, 21-6, was 10-3 for the year (with two forfeits because of an ineligible player) and under coach Ted Mullen has been in the playoff finals the past three years. The Spartans defeated Arlington (31-6), Savanna (28-14) and Riverside Poly (14-9) in the first three playoff rounds.

Coach Richard DeHaven's Millikan Rams won the Coastal Conference title and wound up the year 9-3-1. As the Moore League's No. 2 team, they bettered Muir (15-6), West Tonnance (25-14), Long Beach Poly (27-7) & Arcadia (24-14) for the title.

DIVISION II PREP MVP FOR '77 GRID SEASON...

PHIL DAVIS, SENIOR QUARTERBACK FOR COACH CHARLES McANINCH'S CENTRAL CONFERENCE CHAMPION NORWALK LANCERS, HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA CIF PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL. FOLLOWING A NEW ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION FORMAT -- IN WHICH PLAYERS ARE SELECTED IN THREE DIVISIONS -- DAVIS WAS THE EVENTUAL MVP PICK IN DIVISION II, COMPRISING TEAMS IN THREE CIF, SOUTHERN SECTION CONFERENCES....CENTRAL, SOUTHEASTERN AND NORTHWESTERN.

QUARTERBACK DAVIS, WHO COMPLETED A PASS TO TWIN BROTHER MIKE FOR THE WINNING POINTS OVER NEFF (17-13) IN THE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP GAME, WAS AN ALL-PURPOSE PLAYER ABLE TO HANDLE ANY ASSIGNMENT. HE COMPLETED 108 OF 213 PASSES FOR 1,947 YDS. AND 21 TOUCHDOWNS. HE ADDED 727 YARDS RUSHING (8 TDs) AND KICKED FOUR OF SEVEN FIELD GOALS (ONE VERY CRUCIAL ONE IN THE TITLE GAME) AND 34 OF 38 PATs. PHIL WAS ALSO A STANDOUT ON DEFENSE.

IN FOUR CENTRAL CONFERENCE PLAYOFF GAMES, DAVIS COMPLETED 28 OF 47 AERIALS FOR 601 YARDS AND NINE TOUCHDOWNS, INCLUDING THE LATE-IN-THE-GAME (2:18 LEFT) SIX-POINTER THAT CLINCHED THE TITLE WIN. PREVIOUSLY THE LANCERS HAD DEFEATED AVIATION (33-14), MISSION VIEJO (28-14) AND MARY STAR (25-8) TO REACH THE FINAL ROUND.

Damien, San Antonio League Champions, won the Southeastern Conference title on the strong arm of senior quarterback Dan Marconi who, in the title-winning game vs. Ganesha (12-0) passed for 152 yards capping an 11-1 season. Damien defeated Cajon (21-15), Northview (28-14) and Walnut (13-9) prior to the title shutout.

Antelope Valley, 1976 2-A Division Champion, finished its Northwestern Conference Championship season 13-0...the only undefeated, untied team in the Southern Section. Lee D'Errico scored twice in the Antelopes' 35-24 title-winning effort over Lompoc, as the Lancaster-based eleven whipped Culver City (36-3), Serra (28-0), and Rio Mesa (47-13) on its way to the throne room.
