C.I.F. DIV. I PLAYER FOR '79...UNANIMOUSLY

THE SOUTHLAND'S MOST ELECTRIFYING PREP RUNNING BACK OVER THE PAST SEASON ... EDISON HIGH SCHOOL'S KERWIN BELL ... HAS BEEN NAMED THE C.I.F. SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISION ONE (BIG FIVE CONFERENCE) MVP BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL IN 43RD ANNUAL SELECTIONS RELEASED TODAY BY THE FOUNDATION. THE SELECTION, TO NO ONE'S SURPRISE, WAS UNANIMOUS!

BELL, A FIRST-TEAM DIVISION ONE SELECTION LAST YEAR AS A JUNIOR, LED THE EDISON (HUNTINGTON BEACH) CHARGERS TO THE SUNSET LEAGUE TITLE AND THROUGH THE BIG FIVE CONFERENCE PLAYOFFS WHERE THEY WERE REALLY NEVER TESTED. EDISON SWAMPED NOTRE DAME (SHERMAN OAKS) 36-15 IN THE FIRST PLAYOFF ROUND AND THEN WHIPPED SERVITE 17-0, FONTANA 34-14 AND REDLANDS IN THE FINALS 55-0.

THE SOUTHLAND'S LEADING PREP RUSHER IN 1979 (2,223 YARDS & 30 TOUCHDOWNS), BELL IGNITED HIGH CHARGER TEAMMATES TO THE MOST ONE-SIDED PREP CHAMPIONSHIP GAME SINCE 1915, WHEN PASADENA HIGH POUNDED WHITTIER 50-0. THE EDISON FLYER SCORED THE FIRST TIME HE TOUCHED THE BALL, ON A 73-YARD SIDELINE SPRINT, AND WOUND UP WITH 153 YARDS (A 9.0 YARD AVERAGE) AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS AGAINST THE BULLDOGS, WHO WERE THE CITRUS BELT LEAGUE'S NUMBER THREE TEAM. EDISON CONCLUDED ITS SEASON 12-2, WHILE REDLANDS FINISHED 11-3.

NOW THE CIF, SOUTHERN SECTION'S 6TH LEADING RUSHER FOR A SINGLE SEASON, BELL CARRIED 266 TIMES FOR 2223 YARDS AND 26 TOUCHDOWNS. HE ALSO CONTRIBUTED FOUR TDs ON PASS PLAYS. AS A PASS RECEIVER, BELL WAS 16 FOR 343 YARDS AND FOUR TDs. HE THREW THE BALL JUST ONCE FROM HIS TAILBACK POSITION, RESULTING IN A 25-YARD TOUCH-DOWN PLAY. HALF OF BELL'S TD JAUNTS WERE FROM 30-PLUS YARDS OUT. BELL AVERAGED 8.4 YARDS PER CARRY DURING THE FULL SEASON.

#### DIVISION ONE ALL-STARS HONORED IN 43RD ANNUAL CEREMONIES, SAT., JAN. 26TH

All players named for Division One CIF All-Star Team honors will be guests of honor at the 43rd annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held at the Veterans Memorial Auditorium in Culver City. The annual southland prep affair is scheduled for Saturday morning, Jan. 26th at 10:30 a.m.

Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation framed scroll awards will be presented to all honored athletes, with Kerwin Bell receiving the traditional bronze medallion award. Also honored along with the '79 all-stars will be Edison coach Bill Workman.

On hand to help pay tribute to this year's deluxe edition of prep grid talent will be collegiate coaches, high school administrators and members of the Athletic Foundation Selection Board. Following the award ceremonies a buffet luncheon will be served to all guests.

Thirty-two gridders from 14 high schools find themselves honored on the 1979 Division I Team. Two...running backs Kerwin Bell and Alemany High's 6-1, 190-pound junior express Donald LaBomme...are repeaters from the 1978 all-stars. LaBomme was a Division III first-teamer last fall.

Edison placed four players on the honor teams, three on offense and one on defense. Runner-up Redlands has three honored players as does St. Paul and Marina. Don LaBomme and St. Francis defensive back Todd Short, both juniors, are the lone lower classmen on the teams.

The Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics dates back to 1937, when the Board's first Player of the Year was Glendale's Frankie Albert. Frank was later to star at Stanford University and with the professional 49ers...and later to become that team's head coach. The board, members of which represent some 25 southland newspapers, serves without compensation and in the interest of high school athletes. All selections made by the board are on file in the Athletic Foundation Library...open to the public without charge.

## TOM TUNNICLIFFE, BURROUGHS QUARTERBACK, IS NAMED C.I.F. DIV. 2 MVP FOR 1979 SEASON...

**T**OM TUNNICLIFFE, BURROUGHS HIGH SCHOOL QUARTERBACK WHO LED THE INDIANS TO THE FOOTHILL LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP IN AN UNBEATEN REGULAR SEASON, HAS BEEN NAMED C.I.F., SOUTHERN SECTION FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION 2, MADE UP OF PLAYERS FROM THE SOUTHERN, COASTAL AND NORTHWESTERN CONFERENCES. TUNNICLIFFE WAS AMONG THOSE SELECTED FOR ALL-STAR TEAM HONORS IN THE 43RD ANNUAL ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL MEETING HELD RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY.

THE 6-2, 185-POUND TUNNICLIFFE PASSED BURROUGHS TO A FINAL 11-1 SEASON, BEATING SOUTH TORRANCE 35-23 IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THE NORTHWESTERN CONFERENCE PLAYOFFS, BUT LOSING IN AN UPSET TO CABRILLO, 17-14. THE STRONG-ARMED SENIOR COMPLETED 138 OF 238 AERIALS FOR 2,345 YARDS AND 22 TOUCHDOWNS. HE BOASTED A 63 % COMPLETION MARK WITH 14 INTERCEPTIONS. BURROUGHS AVERAGED 348.6 YARDS-PER-GAME AND SCORED AN AVERAGE 34 POINTS.

AFTER BEATING BURROUGHS, CABRILLO IN TURN WAS DEFEATED BY LOMPOC 30-20 WHICH IN TURN WAS WHIPPED BY LA CANADA IN THE FINALS 21-7 FOR THE NORTHWESTERN CONFERENCE TITLE....ITS FIRST EVER FOOTBALL CHAMPIONSHIP. LA CANADA, WITH A FINAL 12-0-2 RECORD, WAS ONE OF ONLY TWO UNDEFEATED CIF TEAMS THIS SEASON. LOMPOC COMPLETED ITS SEASON WITH A 9-5 RECORD.

THE MILLIKAN RAMS OF LONG BEACH WON THE COASTAL CONFERENCE TITLE WITH A SPINE-TINGLING, OVERTIME WINVS. COMPTON...22-21. MILLIKAN FINISHED THE YEAR 11-1-1 WHILE THE TARBABES, WHO SAW THEIR 21-GAME WIN STREAK HALTED, FINISHED 13-1.

LOARA, THE EMPIRE LEAGUE'S NUMBER ONE TEAM, DEFEATED CANYON (ANAHEIM) IN THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE FINALE, 28-23. THE WINNING SAXONS COMPLETED A 12-2 YEAR, WHILE CANYON WOUND UP 10-4.

### TUNNICLIFFE & OTHER ALL-STARS RECEIVE FOUNDATION AWARDS ON SAT., JAN. 26TH

The Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's 43rd annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program will be held in Culver City's Veterans Memorial Auditorium on Saturday morning, January 26th at 10:30 am. All players named to this year's Division 2 All-Star Team will be recipients of beautiful framed scrolls from the Foundation, with Player of the Year Tunncliffe being presented with the Foundation's traditional bronze medallion.

Also attending the annual football awards program will be collegiate coaches, high school administrators and members of the Foundation's selections board. Following the awards presentations a buffet luncheon will be served.

Sixty-five players representing 40 high schools are on the Division 2 teams. Four players return from the 1978 teams...two on offense and two on defense. It is interesting to note that of the 65 players selected only two are lower classmen, both juniors and both ends. Derek Graham of Beverly Hills and Todd Dellutri of Burroughs are the honored junior wingmen.

On its way to the Southern Conference title, Loara beat Buena Park (50-0), Garden Grove (42-17) and El Modena (28-24) before dropping Canyon of Anaheim 28-23. In Coastal Conference play, Millikan disposed of Royal (35-0), Dos Pueblos (28-7) and Channel Islands (35-27) before squeezing by Compton 22-21 in over-time.

Rio Hondo League Champion La Canada defeated Burroughs, Ridgecrest (19-0), Inglewood (14-0) and Santa Maria (34-29) before capturing its Northwestern Conference crown 21-7 over Lompoc.

Compton High School, winner of 21 straight CIF contests before losing to Millikan in the finals of the Coastal Conference playoff, landed four positions on the Division 2 honor teams to lead all others. Champion Millikan won two spots on the teams. Loara, Southern Conference Champ, also won two positions, as did runner-up Canyon of Anaheim. La Canada, Northwestern Conference winner placed three players, with runner-up Lompoc winning two positions.

**R**OBERT LEAPHART, OUTSTANDING TWO-WAY PERFORMER FOR COACH BARRY MEIER'S EASTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPION RIVERSIDE POLY BEARS, HAS BEEN VOTED THE C.I.F. SOUTHERN SECTION PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION THREE...MADE UP OF PLAYERS REPRESENTING THE CENTRAL, EASTERN AND SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCES. LEAPHART'S SELECTION WAS MADE AT THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S 43RD ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS MEETING HELD IN CULVER CITY.

FINISHING THE SEASON 13-1 (A 21-7 LOSS TO REDLANDS IN THE SEASON OPENER ITS ONLY BLEMISH) POLY WAS LED TO THE IVY LEAGUE TITLE AND AN EVENTUAL CONFERENCE TITLE BY THE 6-3, 190-POUND SENIOR LEAPHART. HIS GREAT VERSATILITY SAW HIM NAMED MVP OF HIS LEAGUE ON BOTH OFFENSE (QB) AND DEFENSE (DB)...FIRST TIME IN IVY LEAGUE HISTORY THAT THIS HAS HAPPENED.

SELECTED TO THE DIVISION 3 ALL-STARS AS A DEFENSIVE BACK, LEAPHART INTERCEPTED SIX PASSES THIS SEASON, HIS THIRD AS A STARTING SAFETY. ON OFFENSE HE ACCOUNTED FOR 1,648 YARDS IN TOTAL OFFENSE...878 RUSHING AND 770 PASSING. BOB LED A HIGH SCORING OFFENSE IN THE PLAYOFFS AVERAGING 27 POINTS IN FOUR GAMES
