STEVE BEUERLEIN, 6-3, 195-POUND SERVITE HIGH SCHOOL QUARTERBACK WHO PASSED THE ANGELUS LEAGUE CHAMPIONS TO THE BIG 5 CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP 31-7 OVER LONG BEACH POLY, HAS BEEN NAMED DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL. BEUERLEIN AND FOUR TEAMMATES WERE NAMED TO THE DIVISION I ALL-STAR TEAM IN SELECTIONS MADE BY THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S 25-MAN SELECTION COMMITTEE.

THE FRIARS FROM SERVITE DOMINATED THE 33-MAN CONFERENCE TEAM, WITH LONG BEACH POLY ALSO LANDING A GOOD NUMBER OF REPRESENTATIVES. BUT SERVITE'S OUTSTANDING PASSER RIDDLED JACKRABBITS SECONDARY FOR 218 PASSING YARDS, AS BEUERLEIN COMPLETED 14 OF 24 AERIALS, ONE GOOD FOR A TOUCHDOWN. STEVE FINISHED THE FRIARS' CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON WITH 2,244 YARDS AND 21 TOUCHDOWNS.

BIG 5 CONFERENCE ALL-STARS HONORED AT 46TH ANNUAL AWARDS JAN. 29TH

MIKE SMITH, LOS ALTOS TITLE-WINNING QB, NAMED CIF DIV. II MVP FOR '82 GRID SEASON

MIKE SMITH, 6-9 AND 200-POUND SENIOR QUARTERBACK WHO LED LOS ALTOS HIGH SCHOOL TO THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1982, HAS BEEN UNANIMOUSLY SELECTED C.I.F. DIVISION II PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. SMITH HEADS A DIVISION II ALL-STAR TEAM COMPOSED OF PLAYERS REPRESENTING THE SOUTHERN, COASTAL AND NORTHWESTERN CONFERENCES.

THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD'S CHOICE FOR MVP HONORS WAS MADE SIMPLE BY TWO GLARING FACTS. FIRST, SMITH'S STAGGERING STATISTICS OVER THE '82 SEASON AND SECOND HIS TITLE-WINNING PERFORMANCE AGAINST ESPERANZA. IN THE TITLE TIEFF, MIKE COMPLETED 21 OF 30 AERIALS FOR 329 YARDS AND FOUR TOUCHDOWNS IN THE CONQUERORS CONQUEST OF THE AZTECS, 31-14. LOS ALTOS COMPLETED A PERFECT 14-0 SEASON, WHILE ESPERANZA FINISHED 12-2.

SMITH IS CREDITED WITH BREAKING THE SINGLE-SEASON YARDAGE MARK WITH 3,437 YARDS AND 40 TOUCHDOWNS OVER 14 GAMES. MENLO SCHOOL QB JOHN PAYE (NORTHERN CALIFORNIA MVP), HOWEVER, ALSO LAYS CLAIM TO SEVERAL NEW STATE AERIAL RECORDS INCLUDING MOST PASSING YARDS (3,465). THIS MARK MAY BE QUESTIONABLE SINCE A TOTAL MARK OF 3,391 YARDS WAS ALSO REPORTED PRIOR TO THE CLAIMED RECORD TOTAL.

AWARDS PROGRAM CEREMONIES SET FOR FIRST TEAM DIV. II PLAYERS ON JANUARY 29TH

Members of the Division II first team, both offense and defense, will be honored at the 46th annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held in the First Interstate Bank Building on Saturday morning, Jan. 29 at 10:30 a.m.

Players, their coaches, high school administrators and collegiate coaches and players will receive invitations to the annual ceremonies, with championship prep coaches also be honored. Players of the Year in the various divisions, including Mike Smith, will be recipients of the Athletic Foundation's traditional bronze medallion award. Presentation ceremonies will be followed by a luncheon in the bank headquarters.

In Coastal Conference action, West Torrance won its first Southern Section football title, 35-21, over Santa Monica's Vikings capping a perfect 14-0 season. West beat Santa Monica for the Bay League crown, administering the Vikings only two losses during 1982. West defeated San Marcos (48-10), Muir (24-0) and Oxnard (17-8) before the title decider.

Verbum Dei took the Northwestern Conference crown 7-0 over Monrovia and made it a perfect 13-0 season in the doing. It was the Eagles second straight CIF title, as they took the Desert Mountain Conference crown last year. It was the 25th consecutive victory for Verbum Dei, 13 of which have been shutouts, six this year. Verbum Dei defeated Beverly Hills (27-7), Righetti (35-14) and St. Bernard (28-0) prior to beating Monrovia.

GAREY HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR TAILBACK DARRYL HARRIS, WHO GUIDED COACH OLIVER LUCAS' VIKINGS TO A SHARE OF THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TITLE, AND ROSEMEAD LINEBACKER EARL BETANCOURT, WHOSE TEAM SHARED SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE LAURELS WITH GAREY (THE TITLE-DECIDER WOUND UP 19-19), HAVE BEEN NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR FOR 1982 AS FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL NAMED ITS DIVISION III ALL-STARS PLAYERS FROM THE CENTRAL, EASTERN AND SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCES. SIXTY-TWO PLAYERS REPRESENTING 37 HIGH SCHOOLS HAVE BEEN NAMED TO THE ANNUAL ALL-STAR SQUADS, TWO TEAMS BEING NAMED ON OFFENSE AND DEFENSE.

Harris became the No. 3 all-time rusher in the CIF Southern Section during 1982 as he rushed for 2,425 yards over a 9-3-2 season. He had 138 yards in the title game on 20 carries, having lugged the leather 234 times over 14 games. He now finds himself behind Centennial's Mickey Cureton and Craig Johnson of Whittier Christian on the single-season list. Earl Bentancourt, a second team pick on last year's Div. III team, sparkled on defense over three seasons for coach John Dunaway. Earl had nine interceptions (two returned for touchdowns) during the season which saw the Panthers go 11-2-1.

El Toro was 12-2 for the season, while Fullerton finished 13-1.
