

# BISHOP AMAT RUNNING BACK RANDY TANNER NAMED CIF DIV. I PLAYER OF YEAR FOR 1983 GRID SEASON.....

ANDY TANNER, COACH JIM PATRICIO'S SENIOR RUNNING BACK AT BISHOP AMAT HIGH SCHOOL AND WHOM THE COACH CALLS..."THE BEST ATHLETE IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA"... HAS BEEN VOTED CIF DIV. I PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S BOARD OF HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS. THE ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS ARE MADE ANNUALLY BY SOME 25 SOUTHLAND SPORTS JOURNALISTS, WITH DIV. I PLAYERS REPRESENTING TEAMS PERFORMING IN THE BIG-FIVE CONFERENCE.

MVP Tanner had led Bishop Amat to a an Angelus League victory, 21-13, over the eventual Big-Five champion Servite Eleven, but despite a 94-yard evening in the title game for Tanner, the Friars won their second straight Conference title. Tanner concluded the season, under the coaching guidance of Jim Patricio, with 1,344 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns. Bishop Amat's season ended 11-2. Along with his ball-carrying duties, Tanner passed for 163 yards and two touchdowns; caught 28 aerials for 289 yards and five TDs; punted 44 times for a 32.3-yard average; returned 11 punts for 88 yards; and brought back four kickoff balls 107 yards.

In winning his second straight Big-Five title, coach Ron Smeltzer coached the Friars to wins over Long Beach Poly (27-10), St. Francis (34-7), Fountain Valley (19-6) and the Lancers of Bishop Amat in the conference finale (28-10). Bishop Amat, winners of the Angelus League title, beat Notre Dame of Sherman Oaks (28-0), Lakewood (14-7) and Marina (25-7) before losing in the title game.

All players named for CIF Div. I all-star team honors will be honored at the 47th annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held early next year. NAMED MVP IN DIV. II FOOTBALL FOR '83 SEASON**

**R**ICK BURTON, CANYON HIGH SCHOOL QUARTERBACK WHO LED THE COWBOYS TO THEIR FIRST CIF TITLE IN THE SCHOOL'S 14-YEAR HISTORY, HAS BEEN NAMED DIV. II FOOTBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. IN ANNUAL SELECTIONS MADE BY THE FOUNDATION'S 25-MAN PANEL, CIF DIVISION II HONOR TEAMS ARE MADE UP OF PLAYERS REPRESENTING THE COASTAL, NORTHWESTERN AND SOUTHERN CONFERENCES. SAUGUS WON THE NORTHWESTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP.

The 6-0, 180-pound Burton accounted for 37 touchdowns during the '83 grid campaign, 25 of them through the airways. He completed 156 of 267 aerials for 2,486 yards over a 13-1 title-winning season...culminating in the Cowboys 40-24 win over previously unbeaten Bishop Montgomery (Torrance), which finished its season 12-1-1. In the title game, Burton completed 12 of 18 passes for 213 yards and two touchdowns. He also gained 40 yards rushing on 10 carries and one touchdown.

**47TH ANNUAL GRID AWARDS PROGRAM TO HONOR FIRST TEAM PLAYERS IN MID-FEBRUARY**

Members of the Division II All-Southern California first team, both offense and defense, will be honored at special ceremonies in mid-February. Awards program invitations will be sent to coaches of all first team players and their athletes, with beautiful framed scroll awards going to all honored performers. High school administrators, collegiate coaches and other grid luminaries will receive invitations.

Honored along with MVP Rick Burton and other first team players, will be Conference championship coaches -- Carl Sweet (Hart H.S., Coastal), Harry Welch (Canyon, Saugus H.S. Northwestern) and Bob Lester (El Modena H.S., Southern). Burton will receive the Foundation's traditional bronze medallion award, with honored coaches receiving framed scrolls.

In winning its first ever CIF championship, Canyon High School of Saugus defeated Blair (41-20), Mary Star of the Sea (14-7), Monrovia (27-25) and Bishop Montgomery in the title affair (40-24). Canyon is represented on the division teams by three players.

The Coastal Conference title went to Hart High School of Newhall, which defeated North Torrance in the championship decider 29-16. On the way to the throneroom the Indians eliminated Oxnard (35-15), Newbury Park (19-14), West Torrance (33-7) and North Torrance. Hart has four players on the team.

Coach Bob Lester's El Modena (Orange) Vanguards won the Southern Conference title with wins over Rowland (42-21), Warren (28-7), Los Altos (26-0) and Foothill in the finale (10-7). The Vanguards have three team members representing the Southern Conference champs.

STANDING PERFORMER IN DIV. III CIF FOOTBALL**

**R**YAN KNIGHT, RUBIDOUX HIGH SCHOOL TAILBACK WHO LED THE FALCONS TO THE SUNBELT LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND INTO THE SEMI-FINALS OF THE EASTERN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN CIF DIVISION III FOOTBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA SPORTS JOURNALISTS, SOME 25 IN NUMBER, MAKE UP THE SELECTION BOARD AND HAVE BEEN IN CONTINUOUS OPERATION SINCE 1937. DIVISION III, FOR THE ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION PROCESS IS MADE UP OF PLAYERS COMPETING IN CENTRAL, EASTERN AND SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCES.

It was an easy MVP selection for Foundation board members, since the Rubidoux rushing sensation broke state records in both single-game rushing and season rushing. Knight totaled 2,620 yards for the Falcons 8-3-1 season, on 337 carries and scored 31 touchdowns with seven two-point conversions. He scored 200 points for the season. Knight's rushing total breaks the state record set by Mickey Cureton (2,504 yards) set in 1966. Ryan also set a new single-game mark of 501 yards in Rubidoux's victory over Corona.

FIRST TEAM PLAYERS HONORED AT 47TH ANNUAL GRID AWARDS PROGRAM

For the 47th consecutive year, First Interstate Bank Athletic Foundation will honor Southern California's finest football players and their coaches. Also invited to attend the prep gridiron celebration will be high school administrators, collegiate coaches and other notables, who will take part in the awards presentations. Conference championship coaches -- Mike Churchill (Riverside Poly, 14-0) in the Eastern; Tim Devaney (Sunny Hills, 10-4) in the Central; and David Huey (Ganesh, 9-4-1) in the Southeastern -- will also be saluted with suitable recognition at the awards luncheon.

Conference champions led other schools in placing players on the honor teams. Riverside Poly, which fashioned a perfect 14-0 season in Eastern Conference, placed four players, as did Ganesh, winner in the Southeastern crown. Sunny Hills, kingpin of the Southeastern Conference, landed two players.

Ganesh, which was a third-place finisher in the Hacienda League, beat Indio (7-6), Apple Valley (28-21), Rosemead (28-21) and Diamond Bar (23-14) to win its title. Poly of Riverside literally destroyed its opposition, whipping Covina (60-0), La Serna (48-8), Glendora (49-14), and Bell Gardens (33-0) for the championship.
