MARK GREEN, RIVERSIDE POLY'S GREAT ALL-AROUND PERFORMER WHO LED HIS TEAM TO THE CITRUS BELT LEAGUE TITLE AND BIG FIVE CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP, HAS BEEN NAMED DIV. I (BIG-5 CONFERENCE) PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. THE 6-0, 180-POUND STAR RUNNING BACK AND SAFETY WAS NAMED TO THE DIV. I ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA TEAM ON DEFENSE, DESPITE HAVING GAINED OVER 1,000 YARDS RUSHING AND RECORDING A 12.7-YARD AVERAGE. HE, ALONG WITH TEAMMATES STEVE SIGLOCH AND GREG JORDAN, RETURN TO THE ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA FIRST TEAM... ALTHOUGH THEY WERE NAMED IN DIV. III WHEN THEY WERE MEMBERS OF THE EASTERN CONFERENCE.

Finishing 13-1 this year, Riverside Poly fashioned a perfect 14-0 season in 1983 when they won the Eastern Conference title. Poly defeated Bell Gardens in the championship game last year 33-0 and amassed 190 points against 22 for their opponents in four playoff games. This year the Citrus Belt champs won over Millikan (29-22), Bishop Amat (42-22) and Long Beach Poly (35-28) before defeating the Citrus Belt League's second place team, Fontana, for the Big-5 title, 27-7. It was coach Mike Churchill's second consecutive title.

In getting to the finals, Fontana defeated Wilson of Long Beach (14-7), Fountain Valley (20-7) and Marina (26-3) before the roof fell in on coach Dick Bruich and his Steelers.

Mark Green, coach Mike Churchill and all members of the Div. I All-Star Team will be honored guests at the 48th annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held on Saturday, Feb. 2 in Los Angeles. Beautiful framed scrolls will be presented along with the Foundation's traditional bronze medallion for MVP Green. **AARON EMMANUEL, QUARTZ HILL STAR RUNNING
BACK, TOPS CIF DIV. II FOOTBALL TEAM '84**

AARON EMMANUEL, 6-3 & 212-POUND RUNNING BACK FOR QUARTZ HILL HIGH SCHOOL, HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN SECTION, C.I.F. DIV. II PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1984 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, WHEN ANNUAL ALL-STAR GRID TEAMS WERE SELECTED RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY. RETURNING FROM LAST YEAR'S FIRST TEAM, EMMANUEL HAD LITTLE OPPOSITION FOR MVP HONORS SINCE HE LED THE SOUTHERN SECTION IN RUSHING THIS SEASON WITH 1,905 YARDS THROUGH THE REGULAR SEASON. PLAYERS NAMED TO THE DIVISION II ALL-STAR TEAM REPRESENT SCHOOLS FROM THE COASTAL, NORTHWESTERN AND SOUTHERN CONFERENCES.

Quartz Hill was a fourth-place finisher in the Golden League -- won by Canyon of Saugus, which went on to win the Northwestern Conference Championship 33-6 over Santa Maria -- and virtually all of the fireworks provided by the Rebels was provided by Emmanuel. In 10 games Aaron carried 281 times for 1,905 yards and 17 touchdowns. He averaged 6.8 yards per carry. Over his prep career, Emmanuel rushed for 4,807 yards and scored 53 touchdowns.

48TH ANNUAL GRID AWARDS PROGRAM FOR FIRST TEAM PLAYERS ON FEB. 2ND

Members of the Division II All-Southern California first team, both offense and defense, will be honored at special awards-luncheon ceremonies on Saturday, Feb. 2nd in Los Angeles. Awards program invitations will be sent to coaches of all first team players, who will be recipients of beautiful framed scrolls. High school administrators, gridiron coaches and other football luminaries, along with members of the Foundation selection committee will also be honored invitees.

Also honored along with the all-star team players, will be title-winning coaches from the Coastal, Northwestern and Southern Conferences. They will receive framed scrolls, while Player of the Year Aaron Emmanuel will be recipient of the Foundation's traditional bronze medallion.

The Canyon High Cowboys won their second straight Northwestern Conference title in 1984 and recorded a perfect 14-0 season. They were 13-1 last year and have a 24-game win streak going for coach Harry Welch. No coach likes to go overboard on their players and team, but coach Welch had to give in after the title game with Santa Maria (won by the Cowboys 33-6) stating, "this is a great high school football team." Prior to reaching the finals, Canyon defeated St. Joseph (8-7), St. Bernard (19-9) and Atascadero (27-6).

Like Canyon, El Modena High School repeated as Southern Conference champion with a shutout win over Empire League Champion Esperanza, 26-0. Coach Bob Lester's Van-guards won the title with wins over Capistrano Valley (38-14), Los Altos (33-22) and El Toro (27-3), before shutting down the Aztecs from Esperanza.

Camarillo was the Coastal Conference Champion with wins over Glendale Hoover (49-6), Oxnard (42-19), Pasadena (31-28) and Ventura, Channel League Champs, (16-14) in the title game. Camarillo won the Marmonte League crown.

BALDWIN PARK'S MICHAEL JOHNSON VOTED TOP PERFORMER IN CIF DIV. III FOOTBALL FOR '84

MICHAEL JOHNSON, BALDWIN PARK QUARTERBACK WHO LED THE BRAVES TO A MONTVIEW LEAGUE TITLE AND 12 STRAIGHT VICTORIES UNTIL THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE TITLE-GAME LOSS TO DIAMOND BAR, HAS BEEN NAMED C.I.F. DIV. III PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1984 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. THE 25-MEMBER BOARD MET IN CULVER CITY RECENTLY TO MAKE ITS ANNUAL PREP GRIDIRON SELECTIONS.

Johnson, who led all Southern Section passers over the regular season 2,072 yards on 115 completions and 18 touchdowns, had close to 3,000 yards over the Braves' 12-1 season. He completed 56% of his aeriels and was strong on defense intercepting six passes. Baldwin Park defeated Brawley (41-0), Apple Valley (18-14) and San Bernardino (48-12) before being shut down by Diamond Bar (43-13).

In winning the Southeastern Conference title, coach Terry Roach's Brahmas concluded a perfect 14-0 season with their victory over Baldwin Park. The champion Brahmas landed three players on the first team -- players representing the Southeastern, Eastern and Central Conferences -- and two on the second squad. Diamond Bar, champions of the Hacienda League, bested Sierra Vista (49-0), Duarte (28-14), Arroyo (41-7) and Baldwin Park in the title decider.

PLAYERS & COACHES HONORED AT 48TH ANNUAL FOOTBALL AWARDS PROGRAM, FEB. 2

For the 48th year, First Interstate Bank Athletic Foundation will honor Southern California's finest football players and their coaches. Invitations to the annual awards ceremonies, to be held Feb. 2 in Los Angeles, will be sent to all first team players and their coaches, with beautiful framed scrolls going to the honorees.

Claremont High's Wolfpack won their first CIF grid crown since 1958, when they defeated Temple City 45-0 for the Eastern Conference title. Led by 6-foot, 8-inch QB Dan McGwire, the Wolfpack won the Baseline League title and subsequently defeated Covina (42-14), South Hills (24-14) Norco (10-0) before concluding its perfect 14-0 season against Temple City.

Coach Martin Luczaj's Fullerton Indians won the Central Conference championship, as quarterback Vic Williams completed 25 of 35 passes for 261 yards and two touchdowns in the title game win over La Mirada, 17-7. The Indians upset three opponents during the overall season, including La Mirada, teams which were undefeated....La Mirada having been ranked the top small schools division team in the state. Fullerton defeated Garden Grove (22-0), Saddleback (30-13) and Valencia (14-12) before upsetting La Mirada. Fullerton concluded its season 13-1.

IV FOR THE 1984 SEASON.
