ARON EMMANUEL, 6-3 & 212-POUND RUNNING BACK FOR QUARTZ HILL HIGH SCHOOL, HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN SECTION, C.I.F. DIV. II PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1984 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, WHEN ANNUAL ALL-STAR GRID TEAMS WERE SELECTED RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY. RETURNING FROM LAST YEAR'S FIRST TEAM, EMMANUEL HAD LITTLE OPPOSITION FOR MVP HONORS SINCE HE LED THE SOUTHERN SECTION IN RUSHING THIS SEASON WITH 1,905 YARDS THROUGH THE REGULAR SEASON. PLAYERS NAMED TO THE DIVISION II ALL-STAR TEAM REPRESENT SCHOOLS FROM THE COASTAL, NORTHWESTERN AND SOUTHERN CONFERENCES.

Quartz Hill was a fourth-place finisher in the Golden League -- won by Canyon of Saugus, which went on to win the Northwestern Conference Championship 33-6 over Santa Maria -- and virtually all of the fireworks provided by the Rebels was provided by Emmanuel. In 10 games Aaron carried 281 times for 1,905 yards and 17 touchdowns. He averaged 6.8 yards per carry. Over his prep career, Emmanuel rushed for 4,807 yards and scored 53 touchdowns.

Members of the Division II All-Southern California first team, both offense and defense, will be honored at special awards-luncheon ceremonies on Saturday, Feb. 2nd in Los Angeles. Awards program invitations will be sent to coaches of all first team players, who will be recipients of beautiful framed scrolls. High school administrators, gridiron coaches and other football luminaries, along with members of the Foundation selection committee will also be honored invitees.

Also honored along with the all-star team players, will be title-winning coaches from the Coastal, Northwestern and Southern Conferences. They will receive framed scrolls, while Player of the Year Aaron Emmanuel will be recipient of the Foundation's traditional bronze medallion.

The Canyon High Cowboys won their second straight Northwestern Conference title in 1984 and recorded a perfect 14-0 season. Prior to reaching the finals, Canyon defeated St. Joseph (8-7), St. Bernard (19-9) and Atascadero (27-6).

Like Canyon, El Modena High School repeated as Southern Conference champion with a shutout win over Empire League Champion Esperanza, 26-0. Coach Bob Lester's Vanguards won the title with wins over Capistrano Valley (38-14), Los Altos (33-22) and El Toro (27-3), before shutting down the Aztecs from Esperanza.

Camarillo was the Coastal Conference Champion with wins over Glendale Hoover (49-6), Oxnard (42-19), Pasadena (31-28) and Ventura, Channel League Champs, (16-14) in the title game. Camarillo won the Marmonte League crown.

Baldwin Park defeated Brawley (41-0), Apple Valley (18-14) and San Bernardino (48-12) before being shut down by Diamond Bar (43-13).

In winning the Southeastern Conference title, coach Terry Roach's Brahmas concluded a perfect 14-0 season with their victory over Baldwin Park. The champion Brahmas landed three players on the first team -- players representing the Southeastern, Eastern and Central Conferences -- and two on the second squad. Diamond Bar, champions of the Hacienda League, bested Sierra Vista (49-0), Duarte (28-14), Arroyo (41-7) and Baldwin Park in the title decider.

Fullerton defeated Garden Grove (22-0), Saddleback (30-13) and Valencia (14-12) before upsetting La Mirada. Fullerton concluded its season 13-1.

All players named for all-star Div. IV team honors will be feted at the 48th annual All-Southern California Board of Football Awards Program to be held on Saturday, Feb. 2 in Los Angeles. Player of the Year Mark Ortega, championship coaches from the Inland and Desert Mountain Conferences and collegiate coaches will be honored guests.
