Big-5 Conference Leads Way With Nine Players

ALL - SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS NAMED ITS 50TH ANNUAL HIGH SCHOOL ALL-STAR FOOTBALL TEAM FOR THE SOUTHERN SECTION OF THE C.I.F. IN RECENT SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY AND AS EXPECTED, THE BIG-5 CONFERENCE LED ALL OTHER EIGHT CONFERENCES IN PLAYERS SELECTED. THIS YEAR'S SELECTION MARKED THE SECOND YEAR THAT ONE PREMIER SOUTHLAND TEAM WAS NAMED WITH, AS IN 1985, NO PLAYER OF THE YEAR NAMED. THE ELIMINATION OF AN MVP CHOICE FOR 1986 FOLLOWS THE PRECEDENT SET LAST YEAR, WHEN IT WAS FELT THE SELECTION OF AN MVP, WITH SO MUCH TALENT ON THE TEAM, MIGHT PROVE UNFAIR.

As was the case in 1985, nine players from the Big-Five Conference have been named to the '86 all-stars. Five MVPs or co-MVPs of the nine Southern Section Conferences make the twelve-man, offensive and defensive units. The Southern Conference places four players; the Coastal and Northwestern Conferences three each; the Desert-Mountain two, with the Southeastern, Inland and Central Conferences placing one each.

Nine players named to the All-Southern Section Team represent Conference Championship Teams....as the case in 1985. There are no repeaters on this year's team, all players named in 1985 having been seniors. Two lower classmen, Russell White of Crespi (sophomore) and defensive lineman Aaron Brown of Ganesha (junior) have an opportunity to repeat in '87.

First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles awards will be presented to all honored players, MVPs and title-winning coaches.

TWO OF THE SOUTHLAND'S MOST EXCITING AND VERSATILE GRIDIRON PERFORMERS... DANNY ONTIVEROS OF SADDLEBACK HIGH SCHOOL AND TIM IMPERIALI OF SUNNY HILLS...HAVE BEEN NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN CENTRAL CONFERENCE FOOTBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES PREP SELECTION BOARD. THIS MARKS THE 50TH YEAR THAT THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD HAS MADE ALL-STAR FOOTBALL TEAM SELECTIONS IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA.

Sunny Hills and Saddleback went into this year's Conference Playoffs with identical 9-1 records. Sunny Hills scored 51 points in its first-round win over La Quinta and Saddleback romped for 49 points against Norwalk in its first-round game. Sunny Hills edged Saddleback 16-14 in second-round play and in turn was edged in overtime by Valencia, 17-14. Bolsa Grande, Garden Grove League champion, defeated Valencia for the conference title, 24-7.

Tim Imperiali is called by his coach, Tim Devaney..."the most exciting player in the Central Conference." A running back/wide receiver, Imperiali caught 33 passes for 631...rushed and returned punts for 595 yards...scored 12 touchdowns and was the team's kicker.

Danny Ontiveros was the Sea View League's Defensive Player of the Year and an All-Orange County defensive back selection. Over Saddleback's 10-2 season Ontiveros caught 38 passes for 602 yards and nine TDs. He registered a total of 72 points.

Bolsa Grande, finishing its season 13-1, moved comfortably through the playoffs with wins over Fullerton (39-28), Tustin (24-14) and Anaheim (19-3) before knocking over Orange League Champion Valencia (24-7). The Tigers wound up 11-2-1 for the year.

CRESPI HIGH'S "SUPER SOPH." RUSSELL WHITE IS VOTED TOP PERFORMER IN BIG-5 CONFERENCE FOR '86

CRESPI HIGH SCHOOL'S SENSATIONAL SOPHOMORE, RUSSELL WHITE, WHO BOASTED THE BEST RUSHING AVERAGE (12.5 YDS.) IN THE SOUTHERN SECTION THIS PAST SEASON, WAS VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN THE BIG-FIVE CONFERENCE AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES REP SELECTION BOARD MADE ITS 50TH ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM CHOICES FOR 1986.

Russell White, the cousin of former USC Heisman Trophy Charles White, led his team to the Conference title, 49-14 over previously undefeated St. John Bosco. In one of the premier playoff performances in recent years, White notched spectacular 258 yards and four touchdowns against the team that had handed the elts their only regular-season loss, 32-27, in the ninth week of the season.

States coach Bill Redell, "a great high school running back...should be C.I.F. Player of the Year as a sophomore." And coach Redell should know what it takes. He was named a Southern Section Player of the Year in 1958, when he played quarterback for Vic Schwenk at San Marino High School.

Over Crespi's 13-1 season, Russell White rushed for 2,339 yards, 31 TDs and a 12.5-yard rushing average, tops in the Big-Five. Three of the top five rushers and scorers are on the Conference Team. Colton's George Hemingway (2,022-yds & 152 points) and Bishop Amat's Eric Bieniemy (1,738-yds & 172 points) join White (1,604-yds & 134-points). Yardage and point totals are for the regular season.

All Big-Five Conference players named for 1986 honors will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles Awards. Players of the Year and coaches of Conference championship teams will also receive special recognition.

TWO OF THE SOUTHLAND'S TOP PREP QUARTERBACKS -- VINCE PHILLIPS OF MUIR HIGH'S COASTAL CONFERENCE CHAMPIONS AND KEN SOLLUM, WHO GUIDED COACH HARRY WELCH'S CANYON COWBOYS TO AN 11-2 SEMI-FINAL PLAYOFF SEASON -- HAVE BEEN NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES PREP SELECTION BOARD. THE SELECTION OF SOUTHERN SECTION CONFERENCE TEAMS BY MEMBERS OF THE SOUTHLAND PRESS AND SIMILAR ALL-STAR TEAMS DATES BACK TO 1937.

Vince Phillips, 6-2 and 185-pound senior, passed for over 2,000 yards over the Mustangs perfect 14-0 season. He was the Southern Section's most efficient passer, with a 68 percentage of completion. States Vince's coach, Jim Brownfield: It is hard to imagine any all-star team without Vince Phillips on it."

Harry Welch, Canyon's very successful coach, calls Ken Sollom "the finest high school quarterback I have ever seen." Ken completed the regular season as the Southern Section's No. 2 passer, with 2,232 yards and 23 TDs. Only Hart's Jim Bonds was ahead of him.

Muir defeated Golden League champion Antelope Valley for the Coastal Conference title, 37-0. The Antelopes, after strong showings against Ventura (34-0), Pasadena (27-7) and South Torrance (41-7), came up empty against Muir. In the title game, by coach Brownfield's own admission his team's best effort, Phillips completed 14 of 20 passes for 116 yards and rushed for 101.

All Coastal Conference players, along with MVPs and championship coaches, will receive awards from First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles.

ATASCADERO HIGH'S "BEST EVER" TACKLE, NAMED MVP IN DESERT-MOUNTAIN CONFERENCE FOOTBALL FOR '86

ATASCADERO HIGH SCHOOL, WINNER OF THE LOS PADRES LEAGUE TITLE AND THE DESERT MOUNTAIN CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIP, HAD ITS "BEST EVER" LINEMAN NAMED THE CONFERENCE'S MOST VALUABLE PLAYER FOR 1986, AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES PREP SELECTION COMMITTEE MADE ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY RECENTLY.

Coach Larry Welsh's Atascadero Greyhounds defeated St. Joseph High of Santa Maria 26-18 for the Desert-Mountain Conference Championship. The Greyhounds had defeated the same St. Joseph team 32-16 for the Los Padres League crown. Welsh makes no bones about the fact he considers his senior, two-way tackle Larry Hurst, "the best lineman I've ever had."

At 6-4 and 215-pounds, Hurst was San Luis Obispo County Player of the Year and his league's Lineman of the Year. Coach Welsh states: "We have had four players, all offensive linemen, go Division I on scholarships. One is starting at Cal and one at Stanford and this young man (Hurst) is the best all-around lineman I've had a chance to coach in 20 years."

Atascadero concluded its season 11-2-1, defeating Santa Clara (22-3), Woodbridge (14-7) and Calabasas (38-6) before defeating St. Joseph in the finals. The Knights went into the final game 10-3, having beaten Agoura (42-24), La Sierra (14-0) and Harvard (21-0) to get to the title-decider.

All players named for Desert-Mountain Conference all-star team honors will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation awards. Players of the Year in each of the Southern Section's nine conferences, along with championship coaches, will also be honored with special awards.

Hart was runner-up to Muir in Last year's Coastal Conference final. The Indians left little to chance this year, winning their four playoff games with an average of 38 points.
