(SANTA MONICA) REPEAT FROM LAST YEAR'S TEAM

ALL - SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL RELEASED ITS 52ND ANNUAL SOUTHERN SECTION ALL-STAR FOOTBALL TEAM TODAY, FOLLOWING THE BOARD'S ANNUAL GRIDIRON SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY. THIS YEAR'S TEAM REFLECTS THE FINEST PLAYERS REPRESENTING THE NINE DIVISIONS OF THE SOUTHERN SECTION AND AS IN PAST YEARS DIVISION I (FORMERLY BIG-5 CONFERENCE) LEADS ALL OTHER DIVISIONS WITH 10 PLAYERS NAMED.

Only the cream of southland prep football talent has been selected on the board's "super" team, made up of eleven players on both offense and defense. A kicker and a punter have also been named. Paul Stonehouse, Loyola's talented punter/kicker, is among three repeaters from last year's team.

No player of the year selection was made on the "super" team. With so much talent (seven players of the year in the various divisions are on the team) representing the nine divisions of the Southern Section, it has been felt that the selection of an MVP might prove unfair.

Six Division Champion teams are represented on the 1988 "super" team. Fountain Valley (Div. I), Antelope Valley (Div. II), Canyon Springs (Div. V), Corona del Mar (Div. VI), Trabuco Hills (Div. VIII) and Carpinteria (Div. IX co-champs) won their divisions.

Players named to this year's All-Southern Section Football Team will be recipients of beautiful framed scroll awards from First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles.

This marks the 52nd year that the Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics has named all-star teams. These selections, dating back to 1937, are on file in the Paul Ziffren Sports Resource Center Library. The public is welcome to make use of the library without charge....but by appointment.

TOP SOUTHERN SECTION RUSHER, DEREK BROWN (SERVITE)
& TOP PASSER, DAVID HENIGAN (FOUNTAIN VALLEY) VOTED
CO - PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION I FOR 1988

A PAIR OF REPEATERS FROM LAST YEAR'S BIG - 5 CONFERENCE TEAM -- DEREK BROWN (SERVITE) AND DAVID HENIGAN (FOUNTAIN VALLEY) -- HAVE BEEN VOTED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR FOR 1988 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF FOOTBALL SELECTIONS COMMITTEE.

Not only did Brown and Henigan repeat from last year's Big-5 Conference Team, they led the Southern Section in the important skill positions of running back and quarterback, respectively.

Brown led Angelus League Champion Servite to the semi-finals of the Division I playoffs before eventual champion Fountain Valley edged them 10-7. Brown, as section rushing champion in '88, completed the regular season with 1,711 yards and 23 touchdowns. The 175-pound Brown averaged 8.5 yards per carry.

During the 10-games regular season, Henigan completed 156 of 265 aeriels for 2,302 yards and 17 touchdowns. The Big-5 Conference title escaped Henigan last year, as Fontana beat the Barons for the crown, 21-0. It was a different story this year, however, as the 6-1, 185-pound QB led Fountain Valley to a 31-24 win over Bishop Amat.

Fountain Valley coach Mike Milner praised his southpaw QB following the title game. "David had a great game as usual. It was a great way for him to end a high school." In the title-decider Henigan completed 15 of 19 passes for 191 yards and two TDs against the Lancers and he also rushed for another six points.

In a losing cause, Bishop Amat quarterback Brian Harmon (also named to the Div. I Team) threw for 347 yards and three touchdowns. Brian wound up regular-season play with 1,645 yards, 14 TDs and a .670 completion percentage.

In the playoffs Fountain Valley defeated St. Francis (39-0), Rubidoux (10-0) and Servite (10-7). Bishop Amat won over Hillikan (35-0), Fontana (28-27 in overtime) and Loyola (9-0)

TOMMIE SMITH, ANTELOPE VALLEY'S VERSATILE TAIL-
BACK, VOTED TOP PLAYER IN DIVISION II FOOTBALL.....

TOMMIE "NONE BETTER" SMITH -- THAT'S A QUOTE FROM A.V. COACH BRENT NEWCOMB -- WAS A RUNAWAY WINNER OF PLAYER OF THE YEAR HONORS FOR 1988, AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' FREP ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION BOARD MET TO MAKE ITS ANNUAL GRID PICKS.

Smith, who gained 218 yards in the Antelopes 28-22 win over Canyon in the Division II title game, led his 12-2 teammates in rushing, receiving, scoring and tackles. He also did his team's punting (44 / 1,682) and returned kickoff (13 / 563) and average of 43.3 yards while scoring three touchdowns.

A National Football Foundation awards winner, Tommie set a school record 30 touchdowns in '88. He was named to last year's Coastal Conference team at the "all-purpose" position.

The Antelopes were appearing in their third Southern Section title game and the win over Canyon brought coach Newcomb and his team their first title.

Antelope Valley had lost to coach Harry Welch's Canyon Cowboys, 10-9, during the regular season. So, as the Golden League's number two team, the Antelopes defeated Dos Pueblos (37-10), Leuzinger (21-13) and Palmdale (23-13) in playoff action before getting a second chance against their league-mates.

Canyon had little trouble with its playoff foes, disposing of Camarillo (44-6), Hawthorne (29-14) and Buena (45-14) before its gridiron roof fell in.

JACK MANU, PARAMOUNT HIGH SCHOOL JUNIOR QB,
UNANIMOUSLY VOTED PLAYER OF YEAR IN DIV. III

JUNIOR QUARTERBACK JACK MANU, WHO PASSED AND RAN COACH KEN SUTCH'S PARAMOUNT PIRATES TO THE DIVISION III SOUTHERN SECTION FOOTBALL TITLE, WAS UNANIMOUSLY NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS IN A RECENT MEETING IN CULVER CITY.

The 6-0, 185-pound Manu led the Pirates to a 12-1 record in 1988, perhaps saving his best game for the final. He completed 9 of 10 passes for 159 yards and a touchdown, while carrying the ball (mostly on the option) 20 times for 84 yards and two touchdowns.

"He runs, he throws...it just doesn't matter. He did a great job (in the final game) and so did his teammates," said Paramount coach Ken Sutch. The Pirates defeated Empire League Champion Los Alamitos, 30-20, for the Division III crown.

During the regular season, Manu passed for 1,275 yards and nine touchdowns. He rushed for an additional 440 yards and was responsible for 21 touchdowns.

Paramount defeated Hart (26-14), Santa Ana (31-24 in over-time) and Mission Viejo (35-32) before meeting the Griffins. Los Alamitos, Empire League kingpins, got over Foothill (6-3), Schurr (52-22) and El Modena (19-3) before reaching the finals.

All-Southern California Board of Athletics, made up of southland sports journalists representing newspapers throughout the greater Southern California area, have selected all-star teams as a group since 1937. All teams selected by this board are on file in the Paul Ziffren Sports Resource Center Library and available to the public without charge.

JASON MARTIN, LOS ALTOS HIGH SCHOOL, AND MIKE
HINZ, RAMONA HIGH, NAMED TOP PLAYERS IN DIV. IV

JASON MARTIN, TOP PERFORMER FOR VETERAN COACH DWAYNE DESPAIN'S LOS ALTOS CONQUERORS, AND TIGHT END / LINEBACKER MIKE HINZ FROM IVY LEAGUE CHAMPION RAMONA, HAVE BEEN NAMED CO - PLAYERS OF THE YEAR BY FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS.

Martin, a tight end / safety for coach DeSpain's Division IV Champion Conquerors (the school's seventh title), was voted the Sierra League's MVP. He caught 37 aeriials for 593 yards (a 16-yard avg.) and seven touchdowns. On defense he was in on 112 tackles, 49 unassisted.

Mike Hinz, Ramona High's tight end / linebacker is 6-4 and 255 pounds and led his team to the Division IV semifinals. The Rams compiled an 11-2 record.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION IX FOOTBALL....

SHAD LARA, PREMIER DEFENSIVE BACK FOR COACH LOU PANIZZON'S CARPINTERIA WARRIORS, HAS BEEN NAMED CIF SOUTHERN SECTION DIV. IX PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' HIGH SCHOOL SPORTS AWARDS BOARD.

SELECTION OF LARA AND THE DIVISION IX ALL-STAR TEAM WERE MADE RECENTLY IN ANNUAL SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY.

Lara, a 5-10, 170-pound senior, led Southern Section defensive backs in pass interceptions with 13 during the regular season. He accounted for 165 yards on interception yardage, averaging 12.6 yards per theft.

The Division IX championship game ended in a tie, 14-14, between Inland Conference finalists of one year ago, Carpinteria and Tehachapi. Last year Carpinteria shut out Tehachapi 27-0.

Carpinteria, Tri-Valley League Champions in '88, defeated Southern California Christian (55-8), Trona (35-7) and Desert (35-8) before meeting Desert Inyo League "At Large" entry Tehachapi. The Tehachapi Warriors (both schools share the same nickname) won out over Boron (52-26), Valley Christian (12-8) and Kern Valley (17-10) before the final set-to.

Both Carpinteria and Tehachapi finished the season with identical records, 11-2-1.
