A. NFHS Summer Meeting Reports

Past President Monica Colunga gave a very detailed report from the NFHS Summer Meeting, highlighting many of the workshops she attended. First was Focus on Title IX as it is 50th Anniversary. She attended the Water Polo breakfast which Assistant Commissioner Kristine Palle, ran and did a fantastic job. There was a workshop on Title IX, the Next 50 Years. Although girls' sports participation has grown to 43% today from the 3% it was in 1972, have the coaching staffs and administrations grown at that same rate? The first General Session was regarding communication. One thing that was brought up was word choice and to be sure your words are true, necessary, and kind. We need to be cognizant that our young people are growing up in a changing world. The second General Session was the NFHS Report.

8. REPORTS (Cont.)

A. NFHS Summer Meeting Reports (Cont.)

Immediate Past President Mike West reported on his experiences at the conference. Transgender inclusion in sports needs to continue to be discussed, including the difference between transgender and sexual orientation. Overall, there are 16 states with legislation against participation. California appears to be the most liberal on the subject and studies are finding that transgender athletes are healthier when participating in sports. Regarding Non-Binary athletes, in Washington the athletes must choose to participate in the male or female sport for each season of sport but can change for the next season of sport.

Desert Area Representative Jeff Williams reported on his experiences. Texas was an outstanding host. When the representatives from California walk into a room, they are acknowledged, recognized as leaders in the industry. Jeff attended the same workshops as his colleagues. Stated that we owe a debt of gratitude to those that have gone before to blaze the trail for today's female athletes. We also need to acknowledge the men that advocate for these women. Football in many other states still has the old-fashioned look at the sport where the entire town closes down for the high school games. The NFL teams are reaching out to high school programs to help support these programs in any way they can. Other states could not understand the idea of an officials shortage.

President Jim Perry concluded the reports with a summary of his attendance at the Board Member workshop. He also attended a session on transfers and expressed that other states are surprised at the way California handles transfers. As for summertime rules, some states lock down completely all summer with no activity at all. It is interesting how the other states handle high school athletics. There is a lot of interest and discussion regarding how California does playoff groupings. Rob Wigod and staff will be hosting a workshop on this subject at the NFHS Section 7/8 Meeting.

B. President's Report

Jim Perry

President Jim Perry talked about the importance of getting athletic trainers full time on all high school campuses. He is committed to getting our section schools back to state of civility and sportsmanship. Our administrators must take a stand regarding fan behavior and decorum. Students and fans need to relearn to respect yourself, your school, your community, your parents as you are representatives of each of these areas.

C. Treasurer's Report

Chris Calderwood

Treasurer Chris Calderwood reported the audit will be in September/October. Mitch Carty does a great job during audit time preparing all the reports requested by the auditors. It is a daunting task. Through GoFan during the 2019-20 school year, only 33,000 tickets were sold. In the 2021-22 school year, over 522,000 tickets were sold online for our events with \$209,000 going back to schools in revenue share. GoFan has changed how we do business and the office is working to bring electronic payments to all forms of revenue collection. Sports Fees have been waived this year thanks to the grant from the California Department of Education, but schools still need to sign into cifsshome.org and create an invoice in order to register their sports teams. The Athletic Administrators Summit is coming up in October and will be free of charge this year. Finally, Chris announced he is retiring on January 1, 2022, but will remain in his position through the rest of the school year.

Commissioner Rob Wigod welcomed the Executive Committee and thanked them for their attendance at today's meeting. This has been such a great way to start the new year being here at the Rose Bowl. Be sure to review the Message from the Commissioner, if you haven't yet, with a preview of the 2022-2023 school year. Fall Eligibility Workshops are in full swing and we have two New Principal/Athletic Director Workshops coming up in September and we encourage you to recommend to your new administrators the importance of attending these events. The Athletic Administrators Summit is in October, free of charge, and as area representatives, please reach out to your constituents and encourage them to attend, along with updating them on what has taken place here. Fall Sports start tomorrow and Saturday. This is the time to build on the tremendous work and momentum that was established in 2021-2022.

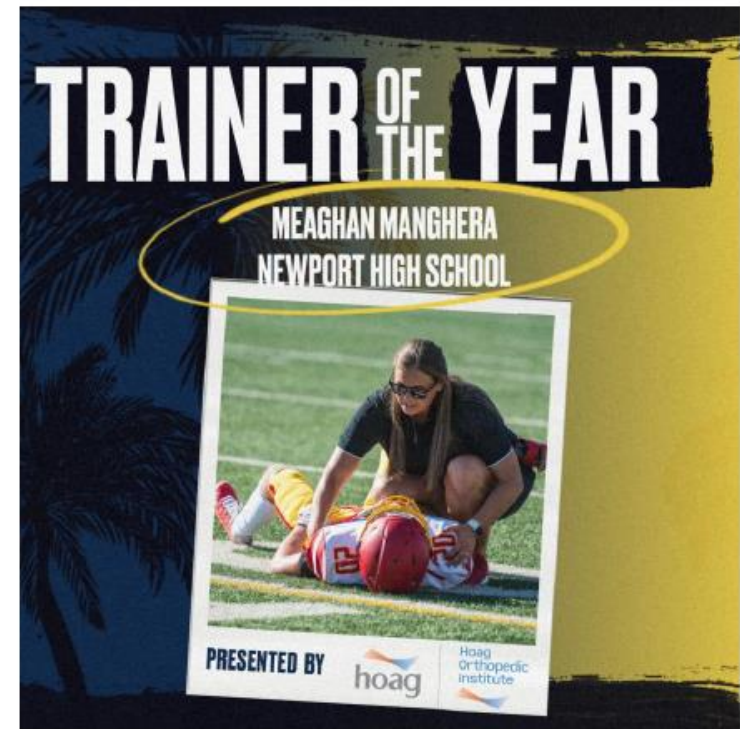


SCHOOL COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT – ATHLETIC TRAINER OF THE YEAR

I. CIF-SS ANNUAL AUDIT (2021-22):

- A. Audit firm Harrington Group will be on site for fieldwork in September/October.
- B. Mitch shared “pre-audit” profit & loss earlier.

II. 2021-22 FINANCIAL NOTABLE

- A. GoFan partnership
 - 1. 2019-20 online tickets sold = 33,098 (\$13,239 revenue share).
 - 2. 2020-21 online tickets sold = 201,839 (\$56,155 revenue share).
 - 3. 2021-22 online tickets sold = **522,140 (\$208,857 revenue share).**

III. MEMBERSHIP SPORTS FEES 2022-23

- A. Dues are forgiven again for fiscal 2022-23, but schools still required to create list of sports and sport fee invoice at \$0 balance.
- B. Courtesy Cards issued once sports invoices are created.
- C. Sport Fee revenue will be booked via Journal Entry from the State of California Grant distribution (approx. \$750K).

IV. FORECAST/GOALS FOR 2022-23

- A. Athletic Administrators Summit registration now open.
 - 1. NO cost to attendees.
 - 2. Revenue booked via Journal Entry from the State of California Grant distribution (approx. \$70K).
- B. Arbiter Project
 - 1. CIF-SS striving to become a “BILL TO” for all Arbiter Groups across the section in an effort to pay for playoff officials in prelim rounds of Football, Volleyball and Basketball AND for all other CIF-SS Hosted Championship Finals.
 - 2. This will take one more job off the plates of bookkeepers and ADs.
- C. ACH (Automated Clearing House) Project
 - 1. CIF-SS striving to “on-board” as many section schools as possible to accept ACH transfers (from CIF-SS to school) in an effort to reduce physical checks, mailing and stale checks.
 - 2. Following a survey in May, 2022 80+ member schools are interested in switching to ACH.
