#### A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NON-ACTION ITEMS

1. Bylaw 103 – Weighted Voting – Information Only

3A1

President – Elect Dr. Paula Hart-Rodas reviewed the information only item from the CIF State Office regarding Weighted Voting. By rule, the CIF Southern Section must have double the number of Federated Council votes as the next largest section. The CIF Sac-Joaquin Section votes increased to 18 for the 2022-2023 school year which required the CIF Southern Section total to increase to 36 votes for the 2022-2023 school year. This was an increase of 2 votes from the 2021-2022 school year.

2. Proposed Addition of Girls Flag Football
(Non-Action if passed by CIF Southern Section)

Non-Action

**STATE 643** 

This proposal has been forwarded from the CIF Southern Section. It will add the sport of Girls Flag Football to the list of CIF-approved sports. The proposal is an Action Item for the Southern Section Council at the September 29, 2022 meeting. If the proposal does not pass, it will be removed from the CIF Federated Council agenda.

3. Proposed Amendment to Article 22 - Membership/Conditions of Membership

Non-Action

**STATE 644** 

The proposal would require CIF member schools to complete the Participation Census each year and identifies sanctions when schools fail to do so. Member schools are required by the first Friday in April of each school year to submit to the CIF State their CIF Participation Census.

Discussion – Matt Maeda asked, "Would the CIF Southern Section follow the same sanction process as the CIF State if a member school did not submit its census report?" Commissioner Wigod responded with "Yes, we would apply the sanctions outlined in the proposal."

#### B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS

 Proposed Revision Bylaw 1222 – Boys Lacrosse Officials Fees Non-Action

SS 641

Mr. Rob Dearborn, President of the Officials Fees/Relations Committee, presented the proposal which will increase the allotted time for Boys Lacrosse officials from 2.25 hours to 2.75 hours for each Varsity contest. On average, the cost for a host school would increase approximately \$180.00 for the season.

Proposed Revision Bylaw 1222 –
 Beach Volleyball Official Fees

Non-Action

SS 642

Mr. Rob Dearborn, President of the Officials Fees/Relations Committee, presented the proposal. This proposal outlines a basic pay structure for a Beach Volleyball Monitor (official). Beach Volleyball monitors are not required; however, they are encouraged during the regular season as they will be mandatory for the CIF Southern Section Beach Volleyball Team Championships. The proposal establishes a minimum time schedule of two (2) hours at a rate of \$35.00 per hour.

## A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS

1. Ratification of Executive Committee Action of Bylaw 210 - Action Physical Assault of Game Officials

**STATE 645** 

President Jim Perry presented this proposal to the Council. There was a motion by the Desert Empire League and a second by the Rio Hondo League to support State 645. This proposal revises CIF Bylaw 210 and creates CIF Bylaw 210.C. CIF Bylaw 210.C provides sanctions for spectators who physically assault the person of a game or event official, which would include a lifetime ban from any CIF athletic contest for anyone who does so. There being no discussion, the motion carried.

Motion Carried: 88-0-1

### **B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS**

1. Proposed Addition of Girls Flag Football

Action

SS 638

President Jim Perry presented this proposal to the Council. There was a motion by the Golden League and a second by the Liberty League to approve the proposal as written. Discussion followed by Melanie Horn, Athletic Director, Westridge High School. Ms. Horn spoke in support of the proposal and thanked Council members for supporting the advancement of girls' sports in the Southern Section. Don Cayer from the Miramonte League asked: "Why did the sport move from the Spring season of sport to the Fall season of sport? Commissioner Wigod explained that this is a state-wide proposal and in working with the other CIF Sections they showed support for the sport to take place in the Fall season of sport. If the CIF Southern Section were to simply present this proposal as a Spring sport it would have probably been defeated as the CIF State Federated Council level.

The Miramonte League made an amendment from the floor to change SS 638. The amendment requested to change the sport of Girls Flag Football from the Fall season of sport to a Spring season of sport. The Mid-Cities League seconded the motion to approve.

#### Discussion:

Several leagues spoke against this motion and requested the original proposal move forward. These leagues included the Pacific, Coast Valley, Rio Hondo, and the Sunset Conference. Matt Maeda from the San Andreas League spoke in favor of the amendment and requested the sport be placed in the Spring Season of sport. Randy Bell from the Rio Hondo League stated, "I am here today to vote on the original proposal which placed the sport in the Fall season of sport."

### 1. Proposed Addition of Girls Flag Football (Cont.)

Action

SS 638

President Jim Perry called for the vote. A Roll Call vote was taken. The amendment from the floor to change Girls Flag Football from a Fall season of sport to a Spring season of sport failed.

Motion Failed: 24-55-10

President Jim Perry called for a vote on Southern Section action item 638. This proposal will add the sport of Girls Flag Football to the list of CIF-approved sports. If passed, the Girls Flag Football will be placed into the Fall season of sport, beginning in 2023. The CIF Southern Section Executive Committee voted on this item during the August 11, 2022 Executive Committee meeting recommending support for the proposal by a vote of 17-0-0. There was a motion by the Surf League and a second by the Mulholland League to approve the proposal as written. The motion carried.

Motion Carried: 61-26-2

### 5. REPORTS

A. Financial Report Mitch Carty

Chief Financial Officer Mitch Carty reviewed our current financial information including: Profit and Loss statement, revenue for the 2021-2022 school year, a breakdown of playoff ticket sales over the past 7 years, and our assets and liabilities over the current fiscal year (July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022). Mr. Carty also reviewed the status of our California Department of Education Grant monies and how those align with our mission and our programs. The grant has a "Sunset" date of June 30, 2024. To date, we have used funds from the grant to waive Sport Fees for member schools for the 2022-2023 school year, waive registration fees for attendees at the CIF Southern Section Athletic Administrators Summit, made \$10,000 donations to the active Athletic Director associations in the Southern Section, and waive Boys Golf and Girls Golf entry fees for all CIF Southern Section Boys/Girls Golf Championships in 2022-2023. The complete Financial Report appears at the end of these minutes.

### B. Treasurer's Report

Chris Calderwood

Treasurer Chris Calderwood reviewed the Treasurer's Report, which appears at the end of these minutes, highlighting a couple of items including: the Harrington Group will be in the Southern Section Office to complete the annual audit in December and the Section Office and Arbiter Pay are working to set up an account to pay all officials for playoff contests directly. Mr. Calderwood also requested that schools set up an electronic transaction account with the Southern Section Office so playoff revenues can be sent directly to member schools. As of today, 98% of the member schools have created a Sport Fees invoice. This year as a reminder Southern Section Sport Fees have been waived. The Southern Section Office is currently looking to hire a full-time Receptionist and that position is currently open. Finally, a reminder to the member schools, while it has been great to have the Southern Section waive Sport Fees for this year, member schools need to keep money in reserve so schools can pay Sport Fees in future years.

### C. President's Report

Jim Perry

President Jim Perry reminded the member schools that representatives from the Los Angeles Rams and Los Angeles Chargers are present here to help support our schools in the efforts to bring Girls Flag Football to their campuses. President Perry followed by discussing his experience at the NFHS Section 7/8 Meeting held last week. Commissioner Rob Wigod and staff put on a phenomenal presentation on competitive equity, and it was interesting to watch the reactions of the other states during that presentation. It appeared the other states are starting to wrap their heads around the concept of creating playoff divisions based on the success level of individual programs. A great update from Diane Marshall-Freeman regarding legal issues going on around the states. Nevada's problem is parents with "Powerful people in their back pocket." Much can be said for talking to the other states in an environment such as this conference. The states of Washington and Oregon presented a piece on diversity, equity, and inclusion.

## D. Commissioner's Report

Rob Wigod

1. CIF Southern Section 2022-2023 Goals

Commissioner of Athletics Rob Wigod acknowledged how great it is to have everyone back at the CIF Southern Section Council meeting. It was exciting to present our competitive equity model to the NFHS Section 7/8 states last week, and they are continuing to evolve and see what we are doing in that area. Commissioner Wigod expressed appreciation to our staff for a successful presentation and to Mitch Carty for presenting our balanced budget. Commissioner Wigod thanked our office staff for holding the League Coordinator Training this morning. Commissioner Wigod reviewed the 2022-2023 CIF Southern Section Goals and stated in the next several days there are events occurring that we hope you will be involved with. The CIF Southern Section Athletic Administrators Summit is on Monday, October 3, and the CIF Southern Section Hall of Fame/Distinguished Service Awards Luncheon on Wednesday, October 12. Girls Volleyball kicks off the Fall Championships season with the release of brackets on Saturday, October 15.



- Measured AT a specific point in time.
- Generally the end date of a fiscal period (June 30).
