## 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Mike West, President of the Council at 9:08 am
B. Pledge of Allegiance
C. Roll Call

The Sunset League name needs to be removed from the Roll Call list. The Surf and Wave Leagues have formed to make up the Sunset Conference.
D. Introduction of Guests - Ron Nocetti - CIF State Executive Director; James Escarcega - SoCal News Group; Steve Fryer - SoCal New Group
E. Adopt Agenda

There was a motion by the Surf League and a second by the Orange League to adopt the agenda as written. There was no discussion. Motion Passed: 86-0-4
F. Approval of Minutes

1. Minutes of the April 13, 2021 Council Meeting - There was a motion by the Pacific View League and a second by the North Hills League to adopt the minutes from April 9, 2021 as written. There was no discussion. Motion Passed: $87-0-3$

## 2. PUBLIC HEARING SESSION

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Council. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. Ms. Cami Stein, Instructional Chair of the California Swim and Dive organization (COSDA) addressed the Council to alter or amend current section bylaw 1203.1. Mr. Greg Vandermade from GOFAN electronic ticketing addressed the Council to thank the members for their support. GOFAN has a campus-wide solution to provide service for all ticketed events on your campus. Mr. Chase Hartman, Los Angeles Chargers and Mr. Johnathan Franklin, Los Angeles Rams, presented a pilot program to the Council searching for schools who would like to establish a female flag football program. Mr. Hartman and Mr. Franklin outlined the basic plan which would have schools compete now through January, 2022 leading up to the Super Bowl in February, 2022.

## 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS - There are no CIF State Federated Council action items at this time.
B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Releaguing Plans - There was a motion by the Suburban League and a second by the Crestview League to approve the Area Releaguing Plans as submitted to the Council. There was no discussion. Motion Passed: 84-3-3
A. Releaguing Appeals - Orange County Area
2. St. Margaret's - St. Margaret's Principal, Dr. Jeneen Graham and Athletic

Director Chris Nordstrom addressed the Council and presented information with their rationale on why St. Margaret's High School does not belong in the Coast View Athletic Association (CVAA). The appeal was based on competitive equity, small school size and a lack of athletic programs overall that do not fit with the other schools in the CVAA. Mr. Nordstrom followed by stating that a proper fit would be to place St. Margaret's in the Orange Coast League. Dr. Graham pointed out to the Council that two years ago Laguna Hills High School was granted relief by the Council from the CVAA based on competitive equity and size of school programs. St. Margaret's is smaller in size and evidence shows less competitive than Laguna Hills High School. Joel Hartman, Co-Athletic Director for Servite High School representing Orange County Releaguing Chair Michael Brennan, reviewed the Releaguing process that was used by the Orange County Area.
Ms. Alicia Seevers, Orange Coast League Representative, addressed the Council and expressed the concerns of the Orange Coast League. The major concern if St. Margaret's High School was placed
in the Orange Coast League would be the increase in travel and the increased amount of potential missed class time. Ms. Seevers then followed by stating that St. Margaret's High School is a much stronger and more competitive school across all sports and not a good fit for the schools in the Orange Coast League. Chris Carter, Coast View Athletic Association representative, spoke in support of the appeal for St. Margaret's. Mr. Carter addressed the Council and addressed the same concerns of school size, school enrollment and a competitive imbalance that Mr. Nordstrom brought forward. Mr. Carter pointed out that St. Margaret's is at or would be at the bottom of the conference in 12 of the 18 sports they offer. In comparison, looking back at Laguna Hills High School when they were given relief, they were at the bottom of the CVAA in 10 of the 18 sports they offered. Discussion and Questions from the Council:
What league was St. Margaret's in before? Mr. Nordstrom stated that they were part of the Small Schools Area and not in an Orange County Area league prior.

What was the Executive Committees vote for the appeal? The appeal failed $6-9-1$ at the Executive Committee meeting on August 12, 2021.
What was the reason behind St. Margaret's High School request to leave the Small Schools Area and enter the Orange County Area? The travel was excessive to several of the league schools and students were missing extended amounts of instructional time.
There was a motion by the Sunkist League and a second by the Rio Hondo League to support the request by St. Margaret's High School to be placed in the Orange Coast League.Motion Passed: 52-22-9

## 4. NON-ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL NONACTION ITEMS

1. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 70.D President-Elect Jim Perry addressed the Council and presented this proposal regarding terms of office for the CIF Executive Committee. This proposal would balance the number of Executive Committee positions up for election each year.
2. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 70.E President-Elect Jim Perry addressed the Council and presented this proposal regarding the CIF Nominating Committee. This proposal would allow the CIF Nominating Committee to nominate a minimum of five nominees instead of the current seven nominees for each open position on the CIF Executive Committee.

## B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION

 ITEMS1. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 1203.1 Proposal \#1 - Laura Reardon, representing the Coastal League, presented this proposal to the Council regarding the use of all accredited officials' associations rather than the one approved umbrella officials' association for each sport. This proposal, if passed, would allow for individual official's groups from each sport to serve and provide officials to member schools.
2. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 1203.1 Proposal \#2 - Laura Reardon, representing the Coastal League, presented this proposal to the Council regarding the desire to recognize all officials that are trained and certified should Proposal \#1 (SS627) not pass.

## 5. REPORTS

A. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Chief Financial Officer Mitch Carty presented a financial summary for the 2020-2021 school year. After all budget projections, decreases in spending, payroll protection plan approval and forgiveness and reduction in office staff for a portion of the year we returned a profit of $\$ 83,654.91$. Mr.
Carty announced that the office staff has returned to full strength, with no loss in service to member schools and no ad-
ditional dues assessment to schools. A full report can be found at the end of these minutes. For the 2021-2022 school year as of today $80 \%$ of the member schools have paid membership dues resulting in a total of $\$ 1,256,902.00$.
B. Communication Report - Thom Simmons - Assistant Commissioner Thom Simmons presented an update to the Council regarding officials' recruitment efforts, which included the showing of a National Association of Sports Officials (NASO) video that will air on Bally Sports SoCal and the NFHS Network as part of their broadcasts. In addition to the NASO video Mr. Simmons reported that he has been working with USC and UCLA to provide a pipeline of current college students who are intramural officials to become certified and begin working as high school officials. Finally, Mr. Simmons reported that the Official's Fees Committee will be meeting in the coming months and will be presenting a proposal for a first reading at the February 1, 2022 Council meeting.
C. Marketing Report - Jacqulyn Gibson - Marketing Director Jacqulyn Gibson gave a brief update on the progress of the Athletic Administrators Summit taking place on Monday, October 4, 2021 at the Riverside Convention Center. Mrs. Gibson followed by briefly reviewing the agenda for the day, including several of the breakout sessions, and encouraged everyone to attend as they could still do walk-up registration on the day of the event.
D. Treasurer's Report - Chris Calderwood - Treasurer Chris Calderwood announced that the 2020-2021 audit will begin next week. He continued to remind member schools to get membership dues paid by the October 1st deadline. Currently, 454 member schools have submitted their dues. The Southern Section office is seeking forgiveness for the Payroll Protection Loan \#2 and we will update the status when available. Mr. Calderwood finished by thanking the Southern Section office for the sacrifices the staff made during the height of the COVID pandemic. Several staff members were furloughed for several months and the remaining office staff worked from home in an effort save costs.
E. President's Report - Mike West - President Mike West reviewed his attendance at the recently completed NFHS 7/8 Conference in Idaho. The key sessions he was able to attend focused on equity and inclusion, possible NFHS rule changes and the continuing promotion by the NFHS to promote the use of the Pixellot cameras. The NFHS is still offering two free cameras and free installation to any school that signs up.
F. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Commissioner Rob Wigod welcomed and thanked the Council for being in attendance. He is proud of our section,
the leadership, member schools and all the student-athletes that have endured over the past 15 months navigating the COVID pandemic. Commissioner Wigod continued by thanking the group that represented the Southern Section at the recently completed NFHS 7/8 Conference. He then followed by reminding everyone about the Hall of Fame/Distinguished Awards Luncheon that is coming up on October 13. Next, Commissioner Wigod reminded the Council that the girls volleyball playoffs were approaching quickly. Student-athletes are required to wear a mask while in the gym and participating in the contests. Commissioner Wigod then reminded the Council that Beach Volleyball is now an approved sport and he is hopeful that schools will begin the process of identifying student-athletes, set up contests and hold a League Finals event during this inaugural year. League Finals event will be the qualifying mechanism for a CIF Southern Section Championship. Commissioner Wigod then announced that with the completion of today's appeal by St. Margaret's High School the Releaguing process for 2022-2026 cycle is now finished. He also reminded the Council that the new football playoff format will be used this season and the MVP AD program is back. Finally, Commissioner Wigod reminded the Council that last year the Sunday cheer exemption was passed along with the maximum number of baseball and softball contests established at 28 .

## MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING

## August 12, 2021

## 1. OPENING BUSINESS

A. Call to order by Mike West, President of the Council. The meeting was called to order at 1:00 pm. Mike West welcomed everyone back and proceeded with introductions.
B. Pledge of Allegiance
C. Roll Call

The following members of the Executive Committee were not present: Mary Jane Hibbard, Geniel Moon, Paula Rodas, Reggie Thompkins, Jeff Williams. Mike Middlebrook, Southern Section staff member, was also absent.
D. Introduction of Guests:

There were no guests. Those guests present for the Releaguing Appeals will be identified at the appropriate time.
E. Adopt Agenda - Mike West requested a motion to move Items 5A1 and 5A2 before Item 3A in order to approve the appointment of 2 members to the Executive Committee. There was a motion and a second to adopt the revised agenda. The motion carried unanimously.
F. Approval of Minutes - Minutes of the May 13, 2021, Executive Committee Meeting. There was a motion and second to approve the minutes of the May, 2021 Executive Committee Meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

## 2. PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Recognition of anyone wishing to address the Executive Committee. Speakers must limit their remarks to three minutes. There was no one present for Public Comment.

## 3. ACTION ITEMS

A. STATE FEDERATED COUNCIL ACTION ITEMS - There are no CIF State Federated Council action items at this time.
B. SOUTHERN SECTION ACTION ITEMS

1. Releaguing Appeal Hearings
A. Coast Area
2. Wiseburn DaVinci High School Present: Chief Administrative Officer Vicente Bravo and Athletic Director D.R. Moreland, Wiseburn Da Vinci High School Releaguing Chair Representative: Steve Shevlin, El Segundo High School. The Releaguing Plan was approved by the Coast Area who followed their processes.
The Bay League averages D2 representation in most sports; this is where Wiseburn DaVinci (D5 average representation) was placed. The Wiseburn DaVinci athletic program is about five years old including the COVID year and doesn't field many sports the other schools in the Bay League field. The plan that carried in the area passed 13-6 among its voting members. Steve

Shevlin stated, "The league receiving Wiseburn DaVinci will get an extra playoff spot and the voting members felt the Bay League was the most deserving of that extra spot." SBAA contains the Bay, Ocean and Pioneer Leagues. Wiseburn DaVinci wishes to go to the Ocean League based on competitive equity where they believe they are a better fit. The sentiment of the Executive Committee was that Wiseburn DaVinci was placed in the Bay League solely to give them an extra playoff spot and not placed in the interest of competitive equity. There was a motion and a second to support the appeal of Wiseburn DaVinci. The motion carried unanimously 16-0-0.
B. Orange County Area - 1.St. Margaret's High School - Present: Principal Jeneen Graham and Athletic Director Chris Nordstrom, St. Margaret's High School Releaguing Chair Representative: Joel Hartmann, Servite High School. The Releaguing Plan was approved by the Orange County Area who followed their processes. St. Margaret's moved out of the Small Schools Area and originally solicited the Pacific Coast League, Orange Coast League and Coast View Conference for information to explore which league would be the best fit. Currently the Orange Coast League is where they would like to land. They were placed in the Coast View Conference (CVAA). Chris Nordstrom reported the average enrollment of the CVAA is 2,800 students. There is a better balance for them in terms of competitive equity in the Orange Coast League as they will have teams in the top, middle and bottom across the board. There was a motion and a second to support St. Margaret's move to the Orange Coast League. Motion fails 6-9-1

## C. Parochial Area -

1. Paraclete High School - Present: Athletic Director Margaret Neill and Associate Athletic Director Amy Pierson, Paraclete High School, Releaguing Chair Representative: Steve Miller, Bishop Montgomery High School. The Releaguing Plan was approved by the area who followed their processes. Paraclete wishes to be placed in the Camino Del Rey Association (CDR) for all sports except football (where they are currently placed in the LAAA). Enrollment-wise Paraclete is in line with the average of the CDR schools and about half the average of the LAAA schools. Paraclete is a geographic outlier regardless of league placement and accepts the travel which is inevitable in either league. Competitive equity-wise, Paraclete excels in softball but falls in the middle of the CDR in all other sports. In the LAAA, Paraclete
is not competitive in any sports. There was a motion and a second to move Paraclete into the Camino Del Rey Association in all sports except football (where they will remain in the LAAA). The motion carried 15-0-1.

1.Citrus Belt Area Representative. There was a motion and second to approve the appointment of Kai Lyles, Assistant Principal/Athletic Director, Desert Hot Springs High School as the Citrus Belt Area Representative for the 2021-2022 school year. The motion carried unanimously 16-0-0.
2. Mt. SAC Area Representative - There was a motion and second to approve the appointment of Dr. Monica Principe, Director of Secondary Education, Pomona Unified School District as the Mt. Sac Area Representative for the 2021-2022 school year. The motion carried unanimously 16-0-0.
B. 2021-2022 CIF Southern Section Goals - Commissioner Rob Wigod presented the 2021-2022 Southern Section Goals that are included in the minutes of this meeting. There was a motion and a second to approve the Southern Section Goals for the 2021-2022 school year. The motion carried unanimously.
C. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Chief Financial Officer Mitch Carty gave an update on the current financial position of the Southern Section. The section was able to get our first PPP loan forgiven and is in the process of seeking application for forgiveness of the second PPP loan. Should that loan be forgiven, the amount will be applied to the fiscal year in which it is forgiven. Mitch shared the pre-audit P\&L report that indicates a pre-audit surplus for the 2020-2021 school year at approximately $\$ 119,000$. The pre-audit P\& and is included in the minutes of this meeting. The official audit will take place in October.
D. Marketing Report - Jackie Gibson Marketing Director Jackie Gibson reported that within a span of 4 weeks we had 19 sports, 2,077 playoff games and crowned 106 Divisional Champions. All sports were featured on our social media platforms with tremendous growth in followers on all of them. 2. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 70.E - Presi-dent-Elect Jim Perry presented this proposal regarding the CIF Nominating Committee. This proposal would allow the CIF Nominating Committee to nominate a minimum of five nominees instead of seven nominees for each open position on the CIF Executive Committee.
B. SOUTHERN SECTION NON-ACTION ITEMS
3. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 1203.1 - Proposal \#1 - Mike West presented this proposal regarding the use of all accredited officials' associations rather than the one approved overall official's association of each sport.
4. Proposed Revision to Bylaw 1203.1 - Proposal \#2 - Mike West presented this proposal regarding the desire to recognize all officials that are trained and certified if Proposal \#1 does not pass. A lengthy discussion followed regarding the pros and cons of these two proposals, which included: possible ramifications that could stretch beyond swimming and how the approval of this proposal could create a greater pool of official's associations but also allow officials to pick and choose the schools they work for rather than being assigned to any school within a geographic area. It was suggested that the concerns brought forth by these proposals could be adjusted at the official association's board level rather than a sweeping policy change. Finally, there is already a shortage of officials and these proposals could impact the number of officials available to work.

## 5. OLD BUSINESS

A. Area Releaguing Plans - Mike West reviewed the area releaguing plans, explaining that two of
the three Executive Committee appeals have been resolved. St. Margaret's High School will still be appealing their placement to the CIF Southern Section Council. There was a motion and a second to move these nine plans to the CIF Southern Section Council for final approval.
Rob Wigod congratulated and thanked the Executive Committee for the most efficient releaguing cycle process since he has been with the organization.

## 6. NEW BUSINESS

A. Financial Report - Mitch Carty - Chief Financial Officer Mitch Carty distributed a profit/loss statement to the Executive Committee and highlighted several points on the document. The document appears at the end of these minutes. The revenue sports numbers will be higher this year due to all revenues coming into the Southern Section Office first, through the GoFan online ticketing system, and then revenue shares being distributed to member schools.
B. Marketing Report - Jackie Gibson - Marketing Director Jacqulyn Gibson distributed a folder to all Executive Committee members regarding the upcoming Athletic Administrators Summit. All Executive Committee members are welcome to attend, and credentials will be available onsite, so there is no need to for Executive Committee members to pre-register. As of today, 430 attendees are registered with 112 registered for the Leadership Track. 40 vendors will be in attendance with Ford displaying their new Maverick all-electric pickup truck on site.
C. Communications Report - Thom Simmons Assistant Commissioner Thom Simmons presented a report which appears at the end of these minutes. He also showed a 90 second video regarding recruiting officials.

## 7. REPORTS

A. President's Report - Mike West - Mike West reviewed the sessions he attended at the recently completed NFHS Section 7/8 meeting in Idaho with Dr. Paula Rodas, Jim Perry, Rob Wigod, Rich Shearer and Mike Middlebrook. Once Mike West completed his review, Dr. Paula Rodas gave her review of the sessions she attended and then Jim Perry did the same.
B. Treasurer's Report - Chris Calderwood - Chris Calderwood gave an overview of the current financial situation of the section. The annual audit for the 2020-21 school year will begin in a couple of weeks. Membership dues have been paid by 454 member schools. The office is continuing its relationship with GoFan and will use them for all playoff games again this school year. The office has implemented COVID protocols and Mitch Carty is working on the forgiveness of the second PPP Ioan. Congratulations to Mitch Carty for getting us where we are, with this year starting out fairly normal.
C. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Rob Wigod welcomed and thanked everyone for being in attendance. All of us are providing leadership for our organization and we will continue to follow through in support of our member schools and our student-athletes. All of our Fall workshops are now complete, and through these efforts, reached personnel from over 300 member schools in our section. Thank you to the Southern Section staff for travelling to these workshops and engaging our membership. Thank you to all who attended the NFHS Section 7/8 Conference in Idaho over the
last few days. Rob stated his pride in the representation of our section and our state by those who were there. He invited the Executive Committee members to the CIF Southern Section Council meeting on September 30, and to the Athletic Administrators Summit on October 4. Thank you to Jacqulyn Gibson for her leadership in in organizing the Athletic Administrators Summit. to partnering with high schools to award scholarships and other potential gifts to local schools directly. Executive Committee participation in the Athletic Administrators Summit is free of charge, so all members are invited to attend.
E. Communications Report - Thom Simmons - Ballys Sports West is planning to do more Olympic Sport livestreams in their 50 allowable events as this was an Olympic year. By cutting down on some football coverage weekly, they will be able to include others. The CIF-SS is working with the NFHS Network to increase the number of Pixellot units in schools. NFHS Network is offering 2 units per school, free installation and immediate revenue share from subscriptions rather than the 5 -year waiting period in previous years. CIF-SS Office will be sending more information out on this in the near future. Jackie Gibson and Thom Simmons are working on the redesign of the Southern Section website and are currently talking to potential design groups. Meeting with National Association of Sports Officials (NASO) and NFHS on potential new officials recruiting PSA's that would be plugged into contractual spots we have with Ballys Sports, NFHS Network and any secondary broadcast groups. Working on new school-based campaign to partner with member schools in identifying potential new officials from their graduating student-athlete ranks. Doing interviews with the Commissioner over the next two weeks with various media outlets discussing the upcoming 2021-22 school year.

## 6. REPORTS

A. NFHS Summer Meeting Reports Monica Colunga - Jim Perry - Dr. Monica Colunga - Attended the NFHS Summer Meeting in Orlando, Florida. Dr. Colunga went to a Women's Leadership Summit which was an interview session with 3 female State Executive Directors and women of color. Monica thought the information resonated and while women have come a long way professionally, there is still a long way to go. She attended a session on Transgender Sport Participation where the presenters explored the impact of transgender participation in championship events. Finally, there was a mention of the need to educate parents on the benefit of education-based athletics, in that they are an extension of the school day.
Jim Perry - Echoed Monica's sentiments about attending the transgender participation break out. Stated there is the need for more research and understanding of how participation is affecting high school results. Currently there is not a lot of data out there with most references being made to one court case involving Track and Field. Jim mentioned his support of our competi-
tive equity model as the rest of the country is still using antiquated methods of placement. Jim stated the need for help from school leadership in educating parents on the benefits of high school-based athletics. He reminded the group of the misinformation parents pick up from other athletic entities where much of the motivation to retain students is monetarily based (collecting club dues) with the promise of college scholarships (of which there are not that many).
B. President's Report - Mike West - President Mike West was complimentary of the organization's accomplishments over the past school year. He was proud of what was able to be done and reflected on how fortunate we are under normal circumstances in our schools and this year drove that home. We are not through the woods of COVID challenges yet and we must be leaders and examples to not digress.
C. Treasurer's Report - Chris Calderwood - Treasurer Chris Calderwood reported that the 2020-2021 audit will be starting in October. GoFan partnership is growing with over 201,000 tickets sold in the last school year and we will be going solely to GoFan for all events in the upcoming year. Schools are using it for sports and other ticketed events (dances) on campus. Membership sport fees are due on October 1 and over 100 schools are paid to date.
D. Commissioner's Report - Rob Wigod - Commissioner Rob Wigod was thankful for this special day at SoFi Stadium and appreciative of being able to be with the Executive Committee in person. We are starting the year on track with the regular sports calendar being observed. We are experienced in masking, testing and other protective protocols on campuses to allow sports to happen, if circumstances change. CIF-SS Home trainings have already taken place and Fall Eligibility Workshops are ongoing. New Principal and AD trainings are also coming in September. Commissioner Wigod thanked everyone for their support of our office and thanked the CIFSS staff for their excellent work. He expressed how proud he is of our member schools and teams who remained focused on staying the course and was pleased with all that was accomplished at the end of the 2021-2022 school year.
CSADA Representative - Dave Reid CSADA Conference will be in San Diego on April 21-24, 2022. Activities Director Representative - Todd Arrowsmith CADA Conference will be held in Reno, March 2-5, 2022. At-Large Representative - Alexis Barile - Currently experiencing the challenge of putting teams into quarantine (ASB, Volleyball, Football, Link Crew, etc). Be aware of how devastating that is to students and their families. Have a process at school and be ready. Assistant Commissioner - Rainer Wulf - Thanks
to those who covered awards at the end of the year at our Championship events. President-Elect - Jim Perry - Would like to attend the 8-Man Football Championship Game on November 27, 2021 to award the championship and runner-up plaques.
