


134th Historical "Tidbit" by Dr. John S. Dahlem



Girls field hockey has been played for many years in the schools of Southern California mostly on an intralmural basis sponsored by the G.A.A. (Girls Athletic Association). There was an occasional interscholastic game, but the CIF-SS sport of Girls Field hockey was not sanctioned as an official Championship event until 1974, several years after the CIF-SS moved to a Title IX model. There has never been an official boys' season in CIF-SS field hockey although the sport is a very popular Olympic event for both men and women's'teams.

Early field hockey attire for girls:





The first Girls Field Hockey Championship team was Colton High School in 1974 coached by Allene Shore with a 2-0 score over Sonora High School. Assistant Coach Phyllis Blatz later became the first Administrative Assistant for CIF-SS Girls Athletics.

The last CIF-SS Championship in Girls Hockey was played in 1984 with Santiago High School under coach Kit Snider , the victors over Garden Grove 2-1.


