

71st historical "tidbit." Dr. John S. Dahlem

Recognition of athletes in Southern California started as early as 1907, when sport writers would name their "All-Star" teams usually representative of the area covered by the local newspaper. Those "All-Southern California" teams would differ depending on what source you were referencing and sometime were contentious. In 1920, when Long Beach Poly was removed from the CIF Southern Section for refusing to participate in the play-offs, the "Long Beach Press Telegram" included Long Beach Poly football players on their All-Southern California Team while the "Santa Monica Outlook" did not.


In 1936, the <u>Helms Athletic Foundation</u> started to sponsor the All-Southern California High School Football Team chosen by the All-Southern California Board of Athletics which included sport writers from throughout Southern California and W.R. Bill Schroeder. They paid for all the certificates, a banquet for the awardees, the Helms Athletic Foundation Gold Medal to the first team and a special award for the player of the year. Initially, there was a Southern California Prep School Football Banquet sponsored by the Kiwanis Clubs of Southern California. Basketball and track followed in 1938 with All-CIF Helms teams. The 1936 All Southern California football team even included the addresses of the players in some cases. You could tell what team the players were awarded (1,2,3) by the numbers next to their name. The "Los Angeles Times" also named an AllSouthern California Football team at the time. The "Santa Monica Evening Outlook" referred to Schroeder's team as the "bakery team!"

Due to financial considerations, <u>United Savings</u> took over the sponsorship in 1971 still under the Helms Athletic Foundation. In 1973, <u>Citizens Savings</u> took over and in 1982 <u>First Interstate Bank</u> became the sponsor. Sponsorship changed again in 1990, when the <u>AAF</u> (Amateur Athletic Foundation) funded the awards. The AAF was the organization created with funds generated by the 1984 Los Angeles Olympics. The AAF changed their name to <u>LA84</u> in 2008, and they are the current presenters of the All CIF Southern Section Teams.

Today, the All CIF Southern Section teams are chosen by sport associations and local advisory groups from each team sport for specific divisions of play. Those groups relay the chosen teams to the CIF-SS office and the office releases the teams to the press. The CIF-SS office staff prints the certificates and sends them to the schools with financial support for printing, postage and compilation from the <u>LA84 Foundation</u>.

It is interesting to note that one of the nominees for the first All-CIF football team in 1936 was tackle <u>*Tom Bradley*</u> (later the mayor Los Angeles) from Los Angeles Polytechnic High School. The special bulletin announcing the team even gave his address (1413 E, 15th St., Los Angeles, Cal.), the system he played ("Warner named" after Pop Warner), and the following: <u>Senior</u> 6'2" 192 lbs. Hand changing. Very fast.





ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL SELECTIONS FOR 1938

* * * * On Wednesday afternoon, December 7th, members of ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL met at the offices of Helms Athletic Foundation for the purpose of selecting All-Southern California Junior College and All-Southern California High School football teams for the 1938 season. (This is the second year that ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL has been in operation, the Board having been formed by Helms Athletic Foundation in 1937.) At the meeting of December 7th, the performances of more than 500 outstanding Southern California junior college and high school football players were carefully checked and considered. (Information concerning players had been previously gathered by Helms Athletic Foundation, for presentation to members of the Board.)

Twenty-four junior college players, and fifty-seven high school players were finally chosen as those who had been the most outstanding throughout the season of 1938. (Selections being based on the Board's knowledge of the performances of players, and recommendations by coaches, student newspaper sports editors and sports writers of daily newspapers throughout Southern California. In all but five instances, all players chosen had been seen in action by one or more members of ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL, and in those five instances recommendations were so many and so impressive that members of the Board gave more than ordinary consideration to the players who were so highly recommended.)

ALL SOUTHEEN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL'S 1938 selections are believed to be truly representative of the best prep school football material in Southern California. The Board has made every attempt to secure complete information concerning all of the outstanding junior college and high school football players of Southern California, and members of the Board have journeyed to many sections of Southern California in order to witness games and thereby watch prospective All-Southern California players in action. Near the close of the 1938 season, Helms Athletic Foundation, the Board's cooperative organization, distributed more than 450 questionnaires to junior college and high school coaches and student newspaper sports editors, as well as to sports writers of daily Southern California newspapers, in quest of recommendations for players. Nothing was left undone to give every outstanding prep school football player in Southern California worthy and deserving consideration.

Members of ALL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF FOOTBALL and Helms Athletic Foundation greatly appreciate the fine cooperation which has been given by Southern California prep school coaches, sports editors of student newspapers and sports writers of daily newspapers. Ray Woods, San Fernando quarterback, runs, passes, kicks and field generals with the best in Los Angeles City High School history. He tallied 91 points during the past season. . . . John Petrovich, just a Junior, was the foremost back of the Coast League this year. He is a real triple threater, and often dented touchdown territory. . . . Harry Karns, Pomona's lanky, red-headed Fullback, might be titled SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA'S HIGH SCHOOL PLAYER OF THE YEAR. He is a splendid triple threater, scores touchdowns and BLOCKS! Bill Foote, Santa Ana Coach, said: "Despite his brilliant ball packing against my team, Karns impressed me most with his BLOCKING!" Quite a nice compliment to be paid a triple threater, by an opponent coach. Harry Karns is truly a TEAM PLAYER. He was an important cog in Pomona's Citrus Belt League championship aggregation.
