

## MELVIN BAER, ROBERT ROBBINS, DAN DUCICH, CHOSEN PLAYERS OF YEAR

Three of the finest basketball players to perform in Southern California prep school circles in recent years are to be the recipients of Helms Athletic Foundation medal awards on Saturday morning, March 4th, at Silverwoods Athletic Hall of Fame. The players chosen for the awards -- Melvin Baer, of Pasadena Junior College; Robert Robbins, Long Beach Polytechnic High School; and Dan Ducich, of Los Angeles High School -- have been selected for Player of the Year honors for the 1944 prep school basketball season, in Junior College, C.I.F., and Los Angeles City High School divisions, by members of All Southern California Board of Basketball.

Helms Athletic Foundation serves as the cooperative organization for the Board.

**MELVIN BAER, Pasadena Junior College.** Baer was the sparkplug of the championship Junior College quintet from Pasadena. He was a brilliant all-around performer, excelling on defense as well as offense. Baer is one of the most outstanding junior college players developed in Southern California in many years, and might well be named on an All-Southern California all-time team.

Baer participated in 24 games this year, scoring a total of 487 points. He stands 6 feet, 3 inches in height, weighs 180 pounds, and is a second-year man in Junior College. He was chosen on the All-Southern California Junior College team last year.

**ROBERT ROBBINS, Long Beach High School.** Robbins was chosen for Player of the Year honors not only because he was a splendid all-around competitor, but because he possessed the qualities of leadership. He was the captain of the successful Long Beach High School team, which went to the finals of the Beverly Hills High School tournament, which was held at the close of the 1944 season. Robbins was chosen on the All-Tournament Team, because of his outstanding play.

Robert Robbins competed in 13 regular-season contests. In addition to his sterling work as a guard, Bob was a splendid shot. He tallied a total of 130 points during the season, exclusive of the Beverly Hills tourney. Robbins stands 6 feet, 3 inches in height, and weighs 165. He is a Senior.

**DAN DUCICH, Los Angeles High School.** Many Los Angeles City High School coaches say that Dan Ducich is one of the greatest players ever to perform in the prep school ranks of this district. There is no doubt about it. Ducich was a sensation during the past year. In 12 Western League encounters, Los Angeles High School's 'fancy-Dan' accounted for a total of 257 points -- and average of better than 21 points per game! Ducich was not only an expert shot, but he was a standout on defense. He stood 6 feet, 3 inches in height, and weighed 198. He is a Senior.

Dan's coach, Horace Bresee, contends that he is the greatest prep school basketball player he has ever seen -- and Bresee has seen a lot of them over a lengthy period.

MELVIN BAER, ROBERT ROBBINS AND DAN DUCICH will have their names added to the Paul H. Helms Player of the Year Trophy, and will have their names posted in the Silverwoods Athletic Hall of Fame, on the Hall of Fame plaques. The following players, in years past, have been chosen for honors:

Comments: Attridge averaged 16 points in Sunset League games, and was chosen All-Huntington Beach Tournament forward. He was the star of the team which won the So. Counties Tournament, and which won 15 games and lost 1 during year. Acosta was the brilliant all-around forward who sparked the Redondo team which won 12 of 14 games played during the season. He averaged better than 15 points per game, excelling in all departments of play.

Lewis was a splendid shot, good tip-in man, fast, and set up plays for his Burbank team. He was the intelligent type of player, constantly out-smarting opposing players.

Robbins was an outstanding defensive player, and fine shot. He was the captain of his Long Beach team, and was an inspirational leader. The Long Beach quintet, of which he was the brightest star, was one of the strongest in Southern California.

Peterman was an exceptional defensive player, good shot, unselfish 'feeder' to other Glendale players, strong on rebounds, and alert. He was the key man in the Glendale team which was undefeated in 12 games.

The All-C.I.F. quintet was not a heavy one, none of the men weighing more than 165. The forwards were under six feet in height, but the guard and center topped the six-foot mark. Bob Robbins, of Long Beach, was the tallest man on the squad, standing 6 foot, 3 inches. All were Seniors.

Snider, Compton ace, was one of the best shots among the guards, in Southern California. An expert ball handler and floor man.

Gumina, was the most important cog in the San Diego team which is rated one of the best in the history of the school. Gumina was instrumental in San Diego's holding opponents to 16 points average per game.

Comment: This was truly the "dream team." The five players chosen for All-Southern California Junior College honors by the Helms Athletic Foundation All-Southern California Board of Basketball, scored a total of 1,693 points. Lou Kotnik, Fullerton flash, was high man on the squad, with 491 points. Baer followed with 487, while Eckerman tallied 450.

Three of the players chosen on the all-star squad were first-year men in junior college. They are Eckerman, Hicks and Wyrick. Pasadena's Melvin Baer is the tallest man on the mythical team, standing 6 feet, 3 inches in height. Baer and Hicks are the heaviest on the squad, both weighing 180 pounds. Ted Eckerman tips the beam at 178.

Eckerman, Kotnik and Baer are sharp-shooters of the first order. All three averaged around 20 points per game. Kotnik hit the jack-pot in a game against Pasadena J.C., registering 35 points. He flapped in 29 points in another game, against the San Bernardino Air Base team. Baer and Eckerman frequently tallied more than 20 points in a game.

Joe Hicks, Compton's stellar guard, was an outstanding competitor on defense, and was also a high-scorer. He averaged nearly ten points per game.

Santa Ana's Bob Wyrick began the season at a guard position, but because of his ability to hit the basket was shifted to a forward post. Wyrick excelled on defense, and was a good floor man.

Mel Baer, sensational Pasadena court-man, gained All-Southern California Junior College honors for the second time, having been chosen for a forward position on the All-Southern California team in 1943.
