COMMENTS: Bob Kloppenburg, Marshall, who shattered City League scoring records, with an average of 25.6 points per game in 10 contests, and Gerlen Hein, Canega Tark, who averaged nearly 20 points per game in eight e-mtastspore chosen forwards in the all-City team for 1945. Alan Savyer, Jan Pedro, huge 6'4", 190 plunds, Junier, who averaged 20 points per game, and excelled with his all-cround play, was given the center assignment on the all-City equal by the members of all-S where California Bearl of Basketball. Savyer scored 140 points in soven games.

Jack Stone, University's fine center, who stands 6'4" in height and weighs 200 was given a guard pest, due to his brilliant defensive work. Jack, however, was an excellent shot and fleor-man. He tellied 167 peints in 12 skirmishes. Reger Joest, Huntington Tark, nebbed the other guard borth on the ..ll-Gity line up. Jeest was an important factor in the success of the Huntington Fark tean, which was undeefoded in Eastern League play, and which limited opposing squads to 264 points in ten contests. It was Jeest's sploulid defensive work which kept the opponents from second against the Spartans.

Bob Kloppenburg, because of his great scoring record and general all-around play, was probably the standout player on the .ll-City squad, although the other four numbers of the .ll-Star team pressed him closely for foremost honors.

It is interesting to note that the total points second by the five players whe word chosen for the ..ll-City team emeunted to 790. On the basis of their secring performances the five ..ll-City team players, if grouped together as a team in a contest, would be able to tally an average of 84 points per game.

Clustka registered 26 points against Harshall High School, with Bob Kloppenburg as an opponent. Elmer Combs, Huntington Beach, who chalked up 262 points in 21 contests was a tower of strength for his team, which won 20 of the 21 games which were played.

Richard Barnes, Hoover, San Diego, was unaninous choice for the center borth. The big 6'5", 185 lb. pivot-man averaged 15 points per game, was chiefly responsible for his team's second consecutive Boverly Hills tournament championship. Against Santa Honica, in the Boverly Hills tournament, Dick collected a total of 36 points. He registered 25 points in a semi-final contest, and scored 16 in the finals, against the strong Chittier team.

Compton's Jugene Unhl, excelled on defense, was a good rebound man, and was the high-scorer of his team. Although a guard, Uchl was runner-up in point scoring in League play. Bill Varren, Nontebello's 6' guard, was a evilliant defensive player. He chiefly controlled the ball for his team, and led the Oilers through a very successful season. Varren was fast and aggreent
