**LONG BEACH POLY STARS MICHAEL WILEY & JOHN-
NY NASH NAMED TOP PLAYERS IN CIF "4-A" DI-
VISION BASKETBALL FOR 1976**

FOR RELEASE: TUESDAY, MARCH 30 ...am's**KINDLY HONOR RELEASE DATE!!!

POLYTECHNIC HIGH SCHOOL OF LONG BEACH BASKETBALL STARS MICHAEL WILEY AND JOHNNY NASH, FOLLOWING IN A LONG, LONG LINE OF BEACH CITY BASKETBALL STARS, HAVE BEEN NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN 4-A BASKETBALL FOR THE 1976 SEASON. TEAMS, ANNUALLY SELECTED BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATIONS ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, WERE RELEASED TODAY THROUGH THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. THE CO-PLAYER DESIGNATION HAS BEEN METED OUT ON ONLY FOUR PREVIOUS OCCASIONS BY THE BOARD SINCE 1938 AND ODDLY ENOUGH IT WAS TWO POLY PLAYERS LAST HONORED IN TANDEM...JUST 10 YEARS AGO. THEIR NAMES...CHUCK MOORE & TRENT GAINES.

BUT BACK TO THIS YEAR'S POLY STARS, WILEY AND NASH, WHO LED THE JACK-RABBITS TO THE SCHOOL'S 10TH CIF TITLE (A RECORD) AND A BRILLIANT 30-1 SEASON.

OBSERVERS AGREED THAT IT WAS COACH RON PALMER'S BIG MEN...6-8, SENIOR CENTER MICHAEL WILEY & 6-6, SENIOR FORWARD JOHNNY NASH...WHO GOT THE JACKRABBITS TO THE 4-A THRONEROOM. MOORE LEAGUE COACHES WERE SPLIT AS TO THEIR OPPONENT MVP, BUT EACH AGREED IT WAS ONE OR THE OTHER AND THAT POLY PROBABLY WOULDN'T HAVE WON THE CROWN WITHOUT BOTH.

NASH LED THE CLUB IN REBOUNDS, AVERAGING 13.7...WILEY AVERAGED 11.3. NASH AVERAGED 15.2 POINTS PER GAME...WILEY 17.1 AND HAD A 25-POINT AVERAGE OVER THE FINAL NINE-GAME STRETCH. NASH WAS 56% FROM THE FLOOR...WILEY WAS 64%. WILEY WAS MVP OF THE 4-A & 3-A PORTION OF THE PLAYOFFS AND WAS ALSO MVP OF THE GLENDALE TOURNAMENT. NASH WAS NAMED MVP AT SAN DIMAS & CO-MVP AT BEVERLY HILLS.

POLY'S LONE LOSS IN '76 WAS TO COMPTON, 55-53, IN AN OVERTIME LEAGUE GAME. COACH PALMER'S POLYTECHNICS WINNERS OF 30 GAMES, WHICH TIED CUPERTINO OF SUNNYVALE FOR GAMES-WON HONORS IN THE STATE, DEFEATED FONTANA (71-53), CENTENNIAL (74-65), SANTA BARBARA (44-36), VERBUM DEI (50-46) AND BUENA OF VENTURA (69-50) IN THE TITLE GAME. THE JACKRABBITS DEFEATED PLAYOFF FOES BY AN AVERAGE OF 10½ POINTS PER GAME.

39TH ANNUAL BASKETBALL AWARDS AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN PARK ON SAT., APRIL 10

AMF VOIT BASKETBALLS AWARDED TO ALL PLAYERS

All Players named for honors on the 4-A Division All-Southern California Basketball Team for 1976 will receive recognition at the 39th annual basketball awards program to be held at Magic Mountain Park on Saturday morning, April 10 at 10:30 am.

Players coaches and friends will be the special guests of Magic Mountain at awards ceremonies to be held in the Showcase Theater. The 1976 program will mark the 4th year that Southern California's finest prep basketball players have been honored at Magic Mountain.

Traditional awards will be presented to each of the honored players (framed scroll awards), with MVP's Wiley and Nash receiving the traditional bronze medallion awards.

AMF VOIT Basketballs will go to each of the honored players...a tradition that goes back some 20-odd years.

Thirty-three players, representing 27 high schools, are on this year's 4-A all-stars. Five players are repeaters off the 1975 squad, co-players of the year Nash and Wiley being two of these.

Marina's senior guard Rich Branning was a first team member last year, while Don Carfino of St. John Bosco and Daryll Adams of Morningside were named to the 4-A second team in '75.

Six lower classmen made the 1975 honor teams, while eight are on the '76 all-stars. One seven-footer, Glendale junior center Brett Barnett, was named to the third team. Smallest player...Centennial guard Lorenzo Watts, 5-7 and 155-pounds...proves there is still a place for the little man in basketball.

GIG SIMS, REDONDO'S 6-10 CENTER, RUNAWAY MVP SELECTION IN "AAA" BASKETBALL FOR '76

GIG SIMS, WHOM REDONDO HIGH SCHOOL COACH HARRY DINNELL CALLS... "THE MOST GAME-DOMINATING PLAYER IN SOUTH BAY HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY", HAS BEEN NAMED 3A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1976 BY MEMBERS OF CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL ON HONOR TEAMS RELEASED TODAY THROUGH THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. SIMS, A FIRST-TEAM 3A SELECTION LAST YEAR, AVERAGED 27 POINTS PER GAME OVER A 29-GAME SEASON AND ACCOUNTED FOR 16 REBOUNDS PER GAME.

SEA HAWKS COACH DINNELL CALLS HIS 6-10 CENTER "THE BEST PLAYER IN THE COUNTRY...ALTHOUGH I ADMIT NOT HAVING SEEN THEM ALL. SIMS WAS OUR TEAM...OUR BEST BALL HANDLER, DRIBBLER, SCORER, REBOUNDER...YOU NAME IT. WE WERE PRESSED IN EVERY GAME, BUT SIMS PROVIDED US WITH THE STEADINESS THAT LED TO OUR GOOD SEASON."

AND A GOOD SEASON IT WAS FOR THE SEA HAWKS, WHO WON THE OCEAN LEAGUE TITLE AND PROGRESSED INTO THE PLAYOFFS WHERE SIMS & COMPANY ELIMINATED OXNARD, 49-37. NOT SO FORTUNATE IN THE SECOND ROUND, REDONDO FELL BEFORE CABRILLO, 45-43, ALTHOUGH SIMS WAS THE GAME'S HIGH SCORER...AS USUAL...WITH 18 POINTS.

LYNWOOD, THE "AAA" CHAMPION FOR 1976 AND ONE OF TWO SCHOOLS (SEMI-FINALIST RAMONA BEING THE OTHER) TO LAND THREE PLAYERS ON THE DIVISIONAL HONOR TEAMS, HAD COMFORTABLE SAILING THROUGH THE EARLY PLAYOFF ROUNDS WITH A 95-72 FIRST-ROUND WIN OVER BOLSA GRANDE, A 72-58 ROMP OVER SAN GABRIEL AND A 77-66 "BREEZE" OVER SOUTH HILLS. Players, coaches and friends will be the special guests of Magic Mt. at awards ceremonies being conducted at the Valencia fun facility for the 4th consecutive year.

AMF VOIT BASKETBALLS AWARDED TO HONORED PLAYERS

Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's traditional framed-scroll awards will go to each honored player, as will special commemorative basketballs, which AMF VOIT INC has so kindly presented over the past 20-odd years. Player of the Year Gig Sims will be recipient of the traditional bronze medallion award.

Thirty-two players, representing 26 southland high schools have been named to the 1976 all-stars in the "AAA" Division. Champion Lynwood and semi-finalist Ramona placed three players on this year's all-stars, while Camarillo and Victor Valley each landed two performers each.

No less than nine players selected on the 1976 honor teams are repeaters. two of these -- first team guard James McCloud from North Riverside and third team forward Tony Hodges of Cathedral -- have been honored on the team over the past three seasons. McCloud, a first team guard in '75, was on the 2nd team in '74, while Hodges repeats for the third year on the third team.

There won't be quite the number of repeaters on next year's all-stars, since there are but two lower classmen on the teams. Lynwood's sensational forward Tom Freeman is a junior, while his teammate Tyren Hauls, is but a sophomore.
