**COMPTON TARBABES CENTER, PURVIS MILLER, IS  
CIF "AAAA" BASKETBALL PLAYER OF YEAR..1977**

FOR RELEASE: THURSDAY AFTERNOON, MARCH 31ST ... & Friday am's

**C**OMPTON HIGH SCHOOL, HOME OF SOME OF THE SOUTHLAND'S MOST ILLUSTRIOUS BASKETBALL TALENT OVER THE YEARS -- GEORGE SELLECK, FREDDIE GOSS AND LARRY HOLLYFIELD TO NAME BUT THREE -- GAINED ANOTHER HONOR TODAY, AS THE TARBABES' 6-7, 210-POUND SENIOR CENTER, PURVIS MILLER WAS NAMED 4-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR THE 1977 BASKETBALL SEASON. MILLER HEADS THE 40TH ANNUAL CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTED BY ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, COMPOSED OF SOUTHLAND SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

WITH THREE PLAYERS REPEATING FROM '76 ON THIS YEAR'S FIRST 4-A TEAM, PLUS ONE OF THE FINEST JUNIOR PLAYERS IN THE HISTORY OF SOUTHLAND PREP BASKETBALL AVAILABLE FOR MVP CONSIDERATION, THE FOUNDATION SELECTION BOARD AGREED (ALMOST UNANIMOUSLY) THAT MILLER WAS DESERVING OF 1977 MVP ACCLAIM.

TARBABES COACH EDDIE THOMAS MAKES NO BONES ABOUT THE FACT HE CONSIDERS HIS STAR CENTER... "THE BEST PLAYER IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AND THE MOST VALUABLE ON OUR TEAM." COMPTON PLACED SECOND IN THE ALWAYS TOUGH MOORE LEAGUE AND WAS ONE OF THREE MOORE LEAGUE TEAMS TO REACH THE 4-A SEMI-FINALS IN THE PLAYOFFS.

PLAYING IN WHAT MUST BE AS TOUGH COMPETITION AS YOU'LL FIND IN THE COUNTRY, PURVIS MILLER WAS THE MOORE LEAGUE'S UNANIMOUS MVP. HE SCORED 610 POINTS IN 26 GAMES (22-4 FOR THE SEASON) FOR A 23.5 POINT AVERAGE AND HAD 11.6 REBOUNDS PER GAME. IN SIX GAMES HE WAS OVER 30 POINTS, SHOOTING 54% FROM THE FLOOR AND 71% FROM THE LINE. WITH MILLER LEADING THE WAY, COMPTON AVERAGED 62 POINTS PER GAME WHILE ALLOWING AN AVERAGE OF 51. IN COMPTON'S THREE PLAYOFF VICTORIES -- OVER GLENDALE (49-36) SANTA ANA (68-50) AND FOUNTAIN VALLEY (57-46) -- THEY HELD THEIR OPPONENT UNDER THE AVERAGE POINTS ALLOWED DURING THE REGULAR SEASON.

MILLER & OTHER ALL-STARS HONORED AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN...SATURDAY, APRIL 30

PURVIS MILLER will be recipient of the Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation bronze medallion award for having been named 4-A Division Basketball Player of the Year at the 40th annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program to be held at Magic Mountain on Saturday morning, April 30 at 10:30 am.

All players named for all-star team honors will be presented with framed scroll awards and championship coaches will also be honored. Awards presentations will be made by college coaches, board members and high school administrators.

A M F V O I T BASKETBALLS TO HONORED PLAYERS

Over the past 25 years AMF VOIT has kindly presented commemorative basketballs to all-star team members and this will again be the case at Magic Mountain on the 30th of April. AMF VOIT has joined in honoring Southern California's finest prep basketball talent since the early '50s...remembering each player with a miniature basketball.

Although Moore League teams dominated this year's 4-A Division playoffs, Pasadena High School's red and white Bulldogs won the title -- the school's first ever CIF basketball championship -- defeating Long Beach Poly 56-49 in the finals.

Coach George Terzian's terrors tore up San Geronimo (102-66), Morningside (74-61), Crescenta Valley (77-70) and Millikan (75-64) before pelting Poly in the finals. Poly had defeated Loyola, Palos Verdes, Verbum Dei and Compton to get to the title-decider.

Six players repeated off last year's 4-A teams and seven juniors made this year's honor list including guard Greg Goorjian of Crescenta Valley High School who averaged 32.9 points per game...among the highest averages compiled in southland prep history. Greg's father, Ed, coached the Falcons to the Foothill League co-championship (with Glendale) and to wins over Los Alamitos and Estancia before losing to Pacific League title-holder Pasadena.

JACK TUZ (CORONA DEL MAR) & BILL DUFFY  
(DAMIEN) SHARE MVP HONOR IN 3-A DIVISION  
BASKETBALL FOR 1977 SEASON

**I**T REQUIRED CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION AMONG MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL - SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, BUT AFTER ALL VERBAGE HAD BEEN VENTED AND ALL STATISTICAL ARROWS HAD BEEN FIRED JACK TUZ OF 3-A CHAMPION CORONA DEL MAR AND BILL DUFFY OF DAMIEN EMERGED AS CIF 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR.

TUZ WHO, ALONG WITH CORONA DEL MAR CENTER ALEX BLACK, LED THE SEA KINGS TO THE 3-A CHAMPIONSHIP, IS DESCRIBED BY HIS COACH JACK ERRION AS "AN EXCELLENT ALL-AROUND BALL PLAYER." HE AVERAGED 16.4 POINTS PER GAME OVER A 25-5 SEASON AND ALTHOUGH PART OF A CO-MVP TANDEM ALL YEAR WITH TEAMMATE ALEX BLACK WAS VOTED THE BETTER PLAYER BY ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD MEMBERS AS THEIR 40TH ANNUAL TEAMS WERE RELEASED TODAY.

CO-MVP BILL DUFFY WAS NO LESS A STAR FOR HIS SPARTANS. DUFFY LED DAMIEN TO A RUNNER-UP SPOT IN THE SAN ANTONIO LEAGUE AND TO THE SECOND ROUND OF THE PLAYOFFS, WHERE RAMONA BEAT THEM 64-59. NOT COUNTING PLAYOFF GAMES (TWO), DUFFY SCORED 23.2 POINTS PER GAME AND AVERAGED 9.4 REBOUNDS. HE HAD 88 ASSISTS AND 66 STEALS. OVER THREE YEARS BILL SCORED 1,114 POINTS...A 15.0 POINT AVERAGE.

40TH ANNUAL BASKETBALL AWARDS AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN ON SATURDAY, APRIL 30

All players honored on this year's 3-A Division CIF basketball teams will be honored guests at All-Southern California Board of Basketball's 40th annual awards program to be held at Magic Mountain Park on Saturday morning, April 30 at 10:30 am. Players, coaches, parents and friends will be on hand in the Showcase Theater as the 1977 all-stars are honored with Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation scroll awards...presented by collegiate coaches, Foundation Board members and high school administrators.

AMF VOIT BASKETBALLS AWARDED

Each player honored on the 1977 all-stars will be the recipient of a commemorative basketball from the AMF VOIT Company for having been named for All-Southern California Basketball Team honors. The AMF VOIT people have long been associated with the Athletic Foundation in honoring high school athletes in the Southland...since the early '50s and in recent years also honor prep competitors in Northern California.

Thirty players, representing 24 high schools, have been honored on this year's 3-A Division all-stars with six schools, including 3-A champion Corona del Mar, placing two players each.

Three players -- Tom Freeman of Lynwood, Alex Black of Corona del Mar (on the 4-A Team in '76) and Tyren Naulls (a junior) -- are back from last year's honor teams. Along with Naulls, Ganesha's James Verdon and Jeff Apana of South Torrance have another year.

Corona del Mar, which won the 3-A crown in overtime from Ramona of Riverside 56-50, was the South Coast League Champion. Coach Errion's Sea Kings bettered Aviation (75-62), Los Amigos (51-37), Riverside Poly (77-60) and Downey (75-58) on the way to the throneroom.

This marks the first year that either Corona del Mar or Damien has had one of its basketball players named for MVP honors by Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's All-Southern California Board of Athletics. All Players of the Year and all-star teams dating back to 1938 are on file in the Athletic Foundation Library which is open to the public without charge.

PLAYER IN CIP "AA" DIV. BASKETBALL FOR '77**
