(VERBUM DEI) SHARE 4-A MVP BASKETBALL  
HONOR FOR 1979 SEASON . . . .

CLIFF FRUITT, WHO LED COACH ELI HAWTHORNE'S VERBUM DEI EAGLES TO THIS YEAR'S CIF SOUTHERN SECTION 4-A CHAMPIONSHIP, AND PASADENA HIGH'S HIGH SCORING GUARD

MICHAEL HOLTON, HAVE BEEN NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION 4-A BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL. THE ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAMS, DATING BACK TO 1938 BY THE FOUNDATION BOARD, WERE RELEASED TODAY BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION.

FRUITT, WHO LED THE EAGLES BACK INTO NO. 1 POSITION FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE 1974 WHEN THEY CELEBRATED THEIR 6TH STRAIGHT HARCOURT TITLE, IS A REPEATER OFF LAST SEASON'S SECOND TEAM WHEN VERBUM DEI LOST IN THE FINAL PLAYOFF GAME TO PASADENA 70-68. DESCRIBED BY HIS COACH AS "A GOOD ALL-AROUND PLAYER", FRUITT LED THE EAGLES TO THE CAMINO REAL TITLE (10-0) AND AN OVERALL 4-A RECORD OF 28-1. IN THE TITLE WIN OVER L.B. POLY THIS YEAR (62-47), FRUITT SHARED HIGH POINT HONORS (16 POINTS) WITH TEAMMATE KIM LEWIS. BOASTING A 3.5 GRADE POINT AVERAGE, FRUITT AVERAGED 18 POINTS FOR THE SEASON.

MICHAEL HOLTON, UNANIMOUS MVP IN THE PACIFIC LEAGUE THIS YEAR, AVERAGED 26.4 POINTS PER GAME WHILE LEADING THE BULLDOGS TO THE LEAGUE TITLE. MVP IN TWO TOURNAMENTS DURING THE YEAR, HOLTON SCORED OVER 40 POINTS IN TWO GAMES THIS SEASON AND HAD 29 IN PASADENA'S FIRST PLAYOFF WIN OVER SANTA BARBARA (70-57). OVER TWO YEARS HOLTON HAS SCORED 1,048 POINTS (A 19.4 POINT AVG.). THE BULLDOGS ARE 48-6 OVER THE PERIOD, GOING 22-4 THIS SEASON AND 26-2 IN LAST YEAR'S TITLE CAMPAIGN.

42ND ANNUAL BASKETBALL AWARDS AT MAGIC MOUNTAIN ON SAT., MARCH 31....

Both Cliff Pruitt and Michael Holton will receive traditional bronze medallion awards for their '79 hardcourt heroics at the 42nd annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program at Magic Mountain Park on Saturday morning, March 31, at 10:30 am. This will mark the 6th year that the good people of Magic Mountain Park will host the basketball players and coaches of Southern California and share in the awards ceremonies.

Players, coaches, parents, high school administrators, collegiate coaches and members of the selection board will take part in the festivities, as Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation will present each honored player with a beautiful framed certificate.

AMF VOIT BASKETBALLS TO ALL HONORED PLAYERS

The AMF VOIT Company has again thoughtfully offered to present each all-star with one of its coveted basketballs. AMF VOIT has made these awards to southland basketball players over the past 25-30 years, for which the coaches and players are most grateful.

Thirty-two players representing some 21 high schools have been selected on the 1979 4-A all-stars. Title-winning Verbum Dei led the parade with four players named, while L.B. Poly, Pasadena, Morningside, Inglewood, Oxnard, San Marcos, Marina and Compton placed two players each.

Five players, headed by MVP Cliff Pruitt, are back from last year's all-stars. Ray Whiting, Long Beach Poly's 6-8, 210-pound front-liner, is back on the first team. Bryon Scott, Morningside, was elevated to this year's first team from the '78 second squad along with Pruitt. Mark Sewald, Bishop Montgomery, and Loyola's Cecil Morris were third-team picks one year ago.

On its way to the 4-A crown the Verbum Dei Eagles beat Culver City (60-49), Ocean View (89-53), Crescenta Valley (87-57), Morningside (84-78) and LB Poly (62-47). Five lower classmen are named including San Marcos' sophomore Jon Korfas.

## MIKE CHAVEZ, DOWNEY HIGH GUARD, WINS 3-A PLAYER OF YEAR ACCLAIM FOR 1979 SEASON....

**M**IKE CHAVEZ, DOWNEY'S DETERMINED, DIMINUTIVE AND DYNAMIC FORCE WHO CARRIED THE VIKINGS TO THE 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL CROWN IN SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA PREP BASKETBALL FOR 1979, HAS BEEN SELECTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL. CHAVEZ, A FINE STUDENT AND SUPER-QUICK ON THE BASKETBALL FLOOR, WAS NAMED THE DIVISION'S BEST ON THE 42ND ANNUAL SOUTHLAND ALL-STAR TEAMS RELEASED TODAY THROUGH THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION.

DOWNEY DOWNED NORTH RIVERSIDE IN THE FINALS OF THE PLAYOFFS, 67-65 IN OVERTIME AS COACH DEAN ACKLAND'S FLOOR GENERAL HIT A 24-FOOT JUMPER WITH FOUR SECONDS REMAINING ON THE OVERTIME CLOCK TO ASSURE THE TITLE. MIKE, ALTHOUGH NOT SCORING WELL IN THE FINAL GAME, DIRECTED THE VIKINGS BRILLIANTLY THROUGH A 14-0 SEASON, AVERAGING 25.2 POINTS OVER A 26-2 SEASON.

THE QUICKNESS OF CHAVEZ IS WHAT IMPRESSED MOST PREP OBSERVERS, AS THE 5-9, 160-POUND SENIOR AVERAGED CLOSE TO SIX STEALS PER GAME. HE ALSO AVERAGED SEVEN ASSISTS PER GAME, WAS 51 % FROM THE FIELD AND 82 % FROM THE FOUL LINE. ONE AMAZING STATISTIC IN MIKE'S LAST TWO SEASONS AT DOWNEY...HE WAS THE MVP OF NINE OF 10 TOURNAMENTS IN WHICH THE VIKINGS PLAYED.

THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY KINGPINS DISPATCHED ALL OF ITS PLAYOFF OPPONENTS WITH EASE PRIOR TO MEETING NORTH IN THE FINALS. MIRA COSTA (81-60), LA H/BRA (81-69), EARSTOW (75-60) AND LOS AMIGOS (83-68) FELL BEFORE THE VIKES EDGED NORTH IN THE 3-A TITLE DECIDER.

Mike Chavez, 1979 Division Basketball Player of the Year, will be recipient of the Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's traditional bronze medalion award at the 42nd annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program to be held at Magic Mountain Park on Saturday morning, March 31st at 10:30 am. All honored players, their coaches, parents and friends will attend the SHOWCASE THEATER presentations...at which time all players will be presented with framed scroll awards.

Collegiate coaches, school administrators and Foundation selection committee board members will take part in the festivities. The AMF VOIT Company will have basketball awards for each of the honored players, as the good people from that organization have so kindly done over the past 25-30 years.

Thirty-one players, representing 26 southland high schools find themselves on the 1979 all-star 3-A team. Division playoff finalist North Riverside led the parade in placing three players, while champion Downey, Beverly Hills and Glendale placed two players.

Five performers return from the 1978 team, headed by MVP Mike Chavez, who is the lone first-team returnee. Teammates Don Barnes and George Smith of North are back from last year's 2nd and 3rd teams respectively. Downey's John Ritchie was a second-team choice in '78, while Corona del Mar's Dave Koehler makes the first team, up from last year's third squad.

Four juniors -- Clayton Oliver, Los Amigos, and Steve Van Horn, Estancia, one the first team...Gahr's Mark Wilson on the second...& El Toro's Ron Holmes on the third -- were named to this year's 3-A team. ## CABRILLO HIGH'S YORK GROSS WINS MVP HONOR IN 2-A DIV. BASKETBALL FOR 1979 SEASON....

**Y**ORK GROSS, WHO PUT ON A SUPERB "ONE-MAN" PERFORMANCE IN CABRILLO HIGH SCHOOL'S 69-64, 2-A CHAMPIONSHIP GAME IN WHICH HE SCORED A GAME-HIGH 35 POINTS, HAS BEEN NAMED THE DIVISION'S PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL FOR THE 1979 SEASON. GROSS WAS A SECOND-TEAM 2-A CHOICE LAST SEASON WHEN HE AVERAGED 21 POINTS, UPPING HIS POINT PRODUCTION TO A SPIFFY 25.8 POINT AVERAGE THIS SEASON.

A 6-5, 190-POUND SENIOR FORWARD AVERAGED 16 REBOUNDS AND FOUR ASSISTS PER GAME AND SHOT 52 % FROM THE FIELD. HIS FINAL-GAME HEROICS IN THE 2-A CHAMPIONSHIP GAME WILL LONG BE REMEMBERED. PLAYING IN FOUL TROUBLE MOST OF THE SECOND HALF, GROSS HIT CRITICAL BASKETS AMONG THEM A DUNK FOLLOWING HIS STEAL FROM A MORENO VALLEY OPPONENT. HE COLLECTED 11 REBOUNDS IN THE TITLE GAME AND WAS OUTSTANDING ON DEFENSE.

COACH GLENN ABRAHAMSEN'S CABRILLO CONQUISTADORES TIED FOR THE NORTHERN LOOP TITLE WITH RIGHETTI AT 9-1 AND THEN DISPOSED OF TEMPLE CITY (63-41), BURROUGHS, RIDGECREST (70-64), NORTHVIEW (75-67) AND MISSION VIEJO (68-66) BEFORE WINNING IT ALL FROM MORENO VALLEY. CO-NORTHERN LEAGUE TITLIST RIGHETTI WAS KNOCKED OUT IN THE 1ST ROUND OF THE PLAYOFFS (44-40) BY CANYON OF SAUGUS.

Thirty-two players, representing 25 high schools make up the 2-A Division all-stars for the 1979 season. Moreno Valley, 2-A runner-up to Cabrillo, placed three players on the three-team squad, while champion Cabrillo, Covina, Hart, El Monte and Mission Viejo placed two players each.

Just a one player returns from last year's 2-A first team...Mike Tolliver from Antelope Valley. Tolliver averaged 19.3 points per game last year as a junior, slipping a tad to 19.0 even in 1979. The first team is composed of only seniors, with two juniors making the second and one the third teams.

JACKSON, DESCRIBED AS "THE BEST POINT GUARD TO PLAY IN THE SOUTHLAND PREP RANKS IN YEARS," WAS NAMED TO LAST YEAR'S FIRST TEAM AS A GUARD WHEN HE AVERAGED 15 POINTS PER GAME.
