Two players — Dwayne Polee, Manual Arts and Johnny Wilkes, Dorsey — are the only two returning All-City players....from first and second teams respectively. Three juniors — Stuart Gray, Dwayne Polee and Gary Maloncon — are the only lower classmen on the two teams....and might just be the best players named.
