**STANDOUT CENTERS JOHN ROGERS (LA QUINTA)
& CLAYTON OLIVIER (LOS AMIGOS) NAMED CO-
MVPs IN 3-A BASKETBALL FOR '80 SEASON**

TWO REMARKABLY TALENTED CENTERS ... JOHN ROGERS, 6-8, 190-POUND JUNIOR CENTER WHO LED LA QUINTA'S AZTECS TO THE 3-A TITLE AND CLAYTON OLIVIER, 6-10, 240-POUND SENIOR "FORCE" FOR THE LOS AMIGOS LOBOS ... WERE NAMED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL FOR 1980 BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. THE TWO BIG MEN ... AMONG THE TOP POINT PRODUCERS IN PREP RANKS THIS SEASON ... AVERAGED CLOSE TO 30 POINTS PER OUTING.

With Rogers leading the attack, the Aztecs, the Garden Grove League's No. 2 team behind Los Amigos, swept to the 3-A crown with wins over El Dorado (67-53), Estancia (56-54), Brea Olinda (68-67) and Damien (89-51) before knocking over Corona del Mar (63-52) for the championship.

Clayton Olivier, who led Los Amigos to the Garden Grove League title, is on the all-division 1st team again in '80. As a junior, Olivier averaged 27.2 points and his contributions to the success of the Lobos this year were tremendous. Although they finished as league champions, the Lobos went out in the first round of playoffs losing to El Modena, 51-50.

IS THE 2-A'S PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1980, AS VOTED BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. CASON WAS VOTED THE SAN ANDREAS LEAGUE'S CO-MVP AND FOLLOWING HIS 15-POINT TITLE WINNING PERFORMANCE (49-48) HIS COACH, JOHN DAHL COMMENTED, "IT WAS A MIRACLE; WHAT CAN I SAY? A PAIR OF OUTSTANDING PREP CENTERS ... 6-10 SENIOR LEONARD AGEE THE LONE 1ST TEAM 1-A REPEATER FROM THE '79 ALL-STAR AND CHADWICK HIGH'S 6-5 SENIOR WHO TOOK THE DOLPHINS TO THE SMALL-SCHOOLS DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP, HAVE BEEN NAMED PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN THEIR RESPECTIVE DIVISIONS BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD.

Agee, among the top scorers in southland prep circles with a 27-point avg., scored 23-per-game in '79 as a first-team junior. Hawthorne was eliminated from the playoffs in the quarter-final round by L.A. Lutheran, 68-57. Chadwick's Armstrong is also the only repeater from last year's Small-Schools all-stars. He led the Dolphins to a 28-1 season and had 16 points and 10 rebounds in the title win over Rio Hondo Prep, 71-50.

Coach Lou Cvijanovich's Santa Clara Saints won their 6th CIF title by taking the 1-A Division title 59-55 over Notre Dame of Riverside. Lou's lads defeated El Segundo (70-50), Desert (51-43) and St. Joseph (49-47) before taking the finale.

STUART GRAY (KENNEDY) & DARRYL BUTLER (TAFT)
NAMED L.A. CITY 4-A & 3-A BASKETBALL PLAYERS
OF YEAR FOR 1980 SEASON

TWO PREMIER PERFORMERS IN LOS ANGELES CITY BASKETBALL FOR THE 1980 SEASON -- 6-11 CENTER STUART GRAY OF KENNEDY HIGH SCHOOL AND TAFT HIGH'S FLOOR LEADER DARRYL BUTLER -- HAVE BEEN NAMED DIVISIONAL PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN ANNUAL L.A. CITY SECTION ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS RELEASED TODAY BY CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. SINCE THE LOS ANGELES CITY SECTION SPLIT INTO TWO DIVISIONS FOR PLAYOFF PURPOSES IN 1976, TWO MVPs HAVE BEEN SELECTED. TWO, TEN-MAN TEAMS MADE UP FROM BOTH 4-A AND 3-A DIVISIONS WERE SELECTED.

FOUR-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR STUART GRAY, AT 6-11 AND 225 POUNDS AMONG THE MORE INTIMIDATING FORCES IN CITY BASKETBALL HISTORY, GUIDED THE KENNEDY GOLDEN COUGARS TO A 20-5 SEASON, THE MID-VALLEY LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND RUNNER-UP HONORS IN THE 4-A TOURNAMENT. THE JUNIOR CENTER SCORED 609 POINTS IN 25 GAMES (24.4 AVG) AVERAGED 13.6 REBOUNDS AND HAD A 61% ACCURACY RATING FROM THE FLOOR. HE WAS VOIED DEFENSIVE MVP IN THE CITY TOURNEY AS WELL AS CO-MVP (ALONG WITH CRENSHAW'S GARY MALONCON). HE WAS TOURNAMENT HIGH SCORER (93 PTS) AND HAD 21 POINTS AND 16 REBOUNDS IN HIS TEAM'S LOSS TO CRENSHAW IN THE FINALS.

THREE-A DIVISION MVP, DARRYL BUTLER, LED TAFT'S TOREADORS TO THE 3-A TITLE 74-60 OVER JORDAN. BUTLER WAS COACH JOHN FURLONG'S FLOOR LEADER, SCORING 17.3 POINTS PER GAME OVERALL AND 17.8 POINTS IN THE PLAYOFFS. IN ONLY TWO OF TAFT'S 24 GAMES (THE TOREADORS WERE 22-2 OVERALL) DID BUTLER FAIL TO SCORE IN DOUBLE FIGURES.

ALL-STARS HONORED AT CULVER CITY MEMORIAL AUDITORIUM SAT., APRIL 5TH

All-Los Angeles City Basketball all-star team members and their coaches will be honored guests at the 43rd annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program to be held at Culver City's Veterans Memorial Auditorium on Saturday morning, April 5th at 10:30 am. All players named for honors and their coaches, along with collegiate coaches, high school administrators and Foundation board members will be invited to attend.

Honored players will receive beautiful framed scroll awards, with title-winning coaches and players of the year also receiving special recognition. A luncheon will be served to all guests following the awards presentations.

Crenshaw's Cougars won their third 4-A title in a row (6th overall and each under coach Willie West) with a 66-62 finale vs. Kennedy. West's Wonders finished 19-1 for the season, losing only to Verbum Dei in their season-opener. The Cougars are represented by three players on the two All-City teams. Crenshaw beat Locke (81-57), Jefferson (110-90), Banning (92-68) and Kennedy to take the title.

Taft took the measure of Grant (68-49), Eagle Rock (92-53), Chatsworth (55-51 in overtime) and Jordan in the finals (74-60). The Toreadors finished the season 22-2 and were undefeated in West-Valley League play (10-0). Last season Taft reached the 3-A finals losing to Fairfax 52-51.

Two players -- Dwayne Polee, Manual Arts and Johnny Wilkes, Dorsey -- are the only two returning All-City players...from first and second teams respectively. Three juniors -- Stuart Gray, Dwayne Polee and Gary Maloncon -- are the only lower classmen on the two teams...and might just be the best players named.
