## MARK ACRES, PALOS VERDES 6-10 SENIOR, IS CIF 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF YEAR

**M**ARK ACRES, CALLED BY HIS COACH JOHN MIHALJEVICH "THE MOST TALENTED PLAYER IN THE HISTORY OF PALOS VERDES HIGH SCHOOL", HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN SECTION, CIF DIVISION 4-A PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION PREP SELECTION BOARD. A 4-A THIRD-TEAM PICK LAST YEAR, ACRES AS A SENIOR DEVELOPED INTO AN EXCEPTIONAL ALL-AROUND PLAYER, ONE CAPABLE OF PLAYING ALL POSITIONS EQUALLY WELL...IN THE ESTIMATION OF HIS COACH.

Acres, who took the Sea Kings to the quarter-finals of the 4-A playoffs, was the Bay League's MVP as PV won the league crown (13-1). Averaging 23.7-points per game and 16 rebounds, Mark shot 55 percent from the field while averaging six blocks. The 6-10, 205-pound senior is reportedly on his way to Oral Roberts University.

### ACRES & FIRST TEAM PLAYERS HONORED AT 44TH ANNUAL AWARDS PROGRAM APRIL 25TH

Four-A Division MVP Mark Acres and all first team players will be honored at the Citizens Savings Athletic Foundation's 44th Annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program to be held at Azusa Pacific College on Sat., April 25th at 10:30 am.

Players and their coaches, along with collegiate coaches, high school administrators and board members, will be invited to attend the annual ceremonies. Framed scroll awards will go to all first team players, with division MVPs receiving the traditional bronze medallions.

Long Beach Poly won the 4-A title in one of the game's great comebacks, 65-63 over San Marcos, previously undefeated in 26 games this season. The Jackrabbits came from 10 points back in the final two minutes to win the crown. Poly had defeated Newport (45-40), Crespi (65-55), Murphy (62-49) and Serra (69-63) before shocking the Channel League kingpins. All-star teams follow:

**J**OHNN ROGERS, ~~LA QUINTA HIGH SCHOOL'S~~ SHARPSHOOTING CENTER, CALLED BY USC COACH STAN MORRISON "THE BEST PURE SHOOTING BIG MAN I HAVE EVER SEEN", HAS BEEN NAMED 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION PREP SELECTION BOARD. ROGERS WAS THE CO-MVP OF THE 3-A DIVISION LAST YEAR WHEN THE AZTECS WON THE CIF TITLE, 63-52, OVER CORONA DEL MAR.

Rogers scored 912 points for the season (32.4-point avg.), winding up seven points behind Ocean View's Wayne Carlander as the southland's top scorer. Rogers had nine games over 40 points, shooting 60.6 percent from the field and 78.0 percent from the foul line. He had 334 rebounds. Rogers led La Quinta to three playoff wins over University (64-46), West Covina (79-76 ...40 points and 23 boards), and Dominguez (68-52 ...45 points) before the Aztecs lost to eventual 3-A champion Corona del Mar (48-29).

As division MVP, Rogers will be recipient of the Citizens Savings Bronze Medallion Award, the traditional salute to all players of the year, at the Foundation's 44th annual Basketball Awards Program to be held at Azusa Pacific College on Saturday, April 25 at 10:30 am. All first team divisional players will also be invited to attend along with their coaches. Collegiate coaches, school administrators and board members will be on hand to pay tribute to the honored players.

Division 3-A champion Corona del Mar defeated Tustin 69-54 for the '81 crown. The Sea Kings concluded the season 22-5 and felled Los Amigos (79-39), Poly of Riverside (70-53), San Geronio (58-49) and La Quinta (48-29) on their way to the title round. Runners-up to La Quinta last season, Corona del Mar became the first school to win the 3-A title twice (1977 the other occasion) since the division was formed in 1969. **A** PAIR OF SOUTHLAND PREP BASKETBALL STARS WHO BROUGHT THEIR RESPECTIVE TEAMS (GLENDALE & BLAIR) TO THE FINALS OF THE 2-A DIVISION PLAYOFFS — DUANE BICKETT (GLENDALE) AND SHAWN HOLIDAY (BLAIR) HAVE BEEN SELECTED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN SOUTHERN SECTION, CIF BASKETBALL FOR 1981 BY VOTE OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. Glendale and Blair, finishing 1-2 in the Foothill League, met for the 3rd time in the 2-A finals...the Dynamiters winning on each occasion. Finishing the season 23-5, Glendale won the three games by a total of five points, one by three points in overtime and the other two by one point.

Glendale defeated La Mirada (100-70), San Luis Obispo (50-35), Pomona (66-61), and Sunny Hills (68-43) before the one-point victory over Blair. The Vikings bested Garey (87-54), Righetti (84-62), La Serna (85-71) and Nogales (68-66) before losing ... AGAIN ... to the Dynamiters.

...NAMED L.A. CITY BASKETBALL'S BEST IN '81**

**I**T IS THE THIRD TIME MANUAL ARTS HIGH SCHOOL'S DWAYNE POLEE FINDS HIMSELF ON THE ALL-LOS ANGELES CITY BASKETBALL TEAM AND IT PROVES TO BE "THE CHARM", AS THE CITY'S TOP SCORER FOR THE 1981 BASKET-SEASON FINDS HIMSELF PLAYER OF THE YEAR. THE 6-5, 180-POUND SENIOR DID EVERYTHING ASKED OF HIM DURING A 24-1 SEASON, INCLUDING TAKING THE TOILERS TO THE L.A. CITY CHAMPIONSHIP WITH AN 82-69 VICTORY OVER CRENSHAW.

THE CITY MVP VOTE WAS A CLOSE ONE AMONG CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION PREP BOARD MEMBERS, WHO DEBATED THE PLAYING MERITS OF POLEE AND KENNEDY HIGH'S STUART GRAY, LAST YEAR'S MOST VALUABLE PLAYER. FOLLOWING CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION, IT WAS POLEE WINNING OUT ON THE STRENGTH OF HIS OVERALL SEASON PLAY INCLUDING A RECORD-BREAKING PLAYOFF.

AGAINST CRENSHAW -- MANUAL ARTS ENDED THE COUGARS THREE YEAR REIGN AS CITY CHAMPIONS -- POLEE SCORED 43 OF HIS TEAM'S 82 POINTS...THE MOST EVER IN A CITY CHAMPIONSHIP GAME. IN THE FOUR PLAYOFF GAMES HE SCORED 148 POINTS, AN AVERAGE OF 37 POINTS PER GAME...THE MOST BY A FORWARD OR GUARD IN PLAYOFF HISTORY.

All first team All-City Basketball players will be honored at the 44th annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program on Saturday morning, April 25th at Azusa Pacific College. First team players, their coaches and Athletic Foundation Board members will gather at Azusa Pacific, along with high school administrators and collegiate coaches to pay tribute to the area's premier players of 1981.

Foundation scrolls, beautifully framed, along with medallion awards for Players of the Year will be presented to the honored players in ceremonies commencing at 10:30 am.

Where the 4-A Division MVP vote between Dwayne Poley and Stuart Gray took considerable soul searching by Foundation Board members, the selection of the 3-A MVP was virtually unanimous. Manual Arts, which averaged 83½ points in four playoff battles, bettered University (73-63), Hamilton (95-78) and Carson (84-64) before crushing Crenshaw (82-69).

Three players return from last year's All-City Team. Dwayne Poley, Stuart Gray and Crenshaw's Gary Maloncon all were first team performers in 1980. Poley was also a first teamer in 1979. Seven under-classmen are on the two teams, four Juniors on the first team and three on the second.

**C**HERYL MILLER, WHO LED RIVERSIDE POLY HIGH SCHOOL TO ITS SECOND 4-A DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1981 (THE BEARS WERE ALSO 3-A CHAMPIONS IN 1979) HAS REPEATED AS DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR AS MEMBERS OF THE CITIZENS SAVINGS ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD MADE ITS ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS. MILLER HAS LED POLY TO A 57-1 RECORD OVER THE LAST TWO TITLE-WINNING SEASONS...28-1 IN '80 AND 29-0 THIS YEAR. THE BEARS WERE 24-3 IN THE 3-A DIVISION IN '79.

With another season of eligibility remaining at Poly, Cheryl Miller stands today as perhaps the premier prep player in the country. This year she averaged 39.4 points and 16.3 rebounds, while shooting 75 percent from the field. In one contest (vs. Norte Vista) Cheryl tanked 77 points. In the 4-A Division finale against San Gabriel, Cheryl contributed 30 points. Cheryl was a first team pick both as a freshman and sophomore, averaging 25.1 ppg in '79 and 31.6 ppg in 1980.

In playoff action Poly toyed with its opposition, the average spread in five games being 37.8 points. The Bears demolished Pacific in the 4-A first-round, 89-30. Then they devastated Marina, 85-36 and continued with one-sided victories over St. Joseph, 71-46, Long Beach Poly, 73-37, and San Gabriel, 64-44. Poly placed four players on the honor teams, two of them juniors. It just may be more of the same for Poly opponents in 1982.
