## SAN GORGONIO HIGH'S GERRY WRIGHT WINS MVP VOTE IN CIF 3-A BASKETBALL FOR 1982 SEASON . . . .

GERRY WRIGHT, 6-7 SENIOR FORWARD INTENDING TO PLAY HIS COLLEGIATE BASKETBALL AT UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, HAS BEEN VOTED SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD. WRIGHT, WHO AVERAGED 22.4 POINTS IN 28 GAMES AND LED THE SPARTANS TO THE CITRUS BELT LEAGUE CROWN (10-0), IS CONSIDERED BY VETERAN OBSERVERS "THE MOST EXCITING" PLAYER TO COME OUT OF SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY IN THE PAST 35 YEARS.

THE SPARTANS' GERRY WRIGHT HAD 14.3 REBOUNDS AND 6.5 BLOCKED SHOTS IN 1982 TO GO ALONG WITH HIS 22.4 POINT AVERAGE. HE LED HIS TEAM THROUGH 27 STRAIGHT WINS, BEFORE A DOUBLE-OVERTIME, 80-78 LOSS TO LOS ALTOS ENDED THE TEAMS DREAM OF A PERFECT SEASON.

Mission League Champion St. Bernard emerged as eventual 3-A Division winners, defeating Foothill Loop titlist Hoover, 57-49, for the CIF, 3-A crown. It was the Vikings 18th straight win, as they wound up season play 27-2. The Vikings defeated Hanford 61-44 in the state regionals, but lost to 1-A Division Banning in the title game.

## DALTON HEYWARD, BURROUGHS HIGH FORWARD, NAMED TOP PLAYER IN CIF 2-A BASKETBALL FOR 1982....

DALTON HEYWARD, BURROUGHS OF RIDGECREST'S 6-5 SENIOR FORWARD WHO SCORED 21 POINTS AND HAD 18 REBOUNDS IN HIS TEAM'S 66-55 2-A DIVISION TITLE WIN OVER CAPISTRANO VALLEY, WAS VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1982 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS. HEYWARD, WHO AVERAGED 16.8 POINTS OVER BURROUGHS 23-5 SEASON, WAS A FIRST TEAM 2-A SELECTION LAST YEAR.

COACHED BY LARRY BIRD, THE BURROUGHS BURROS DEFEATED NORTHVIEW (66-53), SAN BERNARDINO (72-62), RIGHETTI (53-44), LA SERNA (62-56) AND CAPISTRANO VALLEY (17-9 for '82) IN THE FINAL GAME. THE BURROS DEFEATED WASHINGTON OF FRESNO IN THE SEMI-FINALS OF THE SOUTHERN REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS, BUT LOST TO BANNING IN THE FINALS.

In Burroughs 11-1 Golden League Championship season, forward Dalton Heyward averaged 13.8 rebounds and had the league's top field goal percentage, 58.8. He was also the second high assist player on his team.
