

**MATT BEEUWSAERT (MATER DEI) NAMED PLAYER OF
YEAR IN 4-A DIV. BASKETBALL FOR 1983 SEASON**

MATHEW BEEUWSAERT, ANGELUS LEAGUE MVP AND LEADER OF THE 4-A DIVISION C.I.F. CHAMPION MATER DEI MONARCHS, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN HIS DIVISION BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL ON ALL-STAR TEAMS RELEASED TODAY THROUGH THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. THE 6-6 JUNIOR, WHO CAN PERFORM AT EITHER FORWARD OR GUARD, WAS A THIRD-TEAM PICK LAST SEASON AND THIS YEAR LED HIS TEAM TO THE ANGELUS LEAGUE TITLE AND THE 4-A CHAMPIONSHIP 62-44 OVER LONG BEACH POLY.

Beeuwsaert is called by his coach Gary McKnight, "a great all-around player and person." Averaging around 16 points, the 190-pound swingman led the Monarchs to wins over Beverly Hills (65-56), Ocean View (75-44), St. John Bosco (62-53) and Verbum Dei (50-48) before downing Long Beach Poly in the finals. In Southern California regional play Mater Dei eliminated the L.A. City 3-A Champion Reseda (73-50), but lost to eventual state champ Crenshaw (52-48).

PLAYER OF YEAR ON FOUNDATION HARDCOURT TEAM...**

REGGIE MILLER, RIVERSIDE POLY'S "DOES IT ALL" TYPE OF BALL PLAYER, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S PREP SELECTION BOARD ON ANNUAL HARDWOOD ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS RELEASED TODAY BY THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. MILLER, WHO LED THE POLY BEARS TO THE SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISIONAL TITLE (76-53 OVER PALM SPRINGS), WAS A SECOND TEAM CHOICE LAST YEAR.

Miller was the Ivy League's MVP the last two years averaging 28.3 points over a 30-3 season. The 6-6 "swingman" (forward-guard) averaged 36.6 points in five 3-A Division playoff games, shooting 60 percent from the floor. Coach Arlo Gard's charges were never pressed in playoff action as they defeated Santa Ana Valley (89-67), Hart (91-73), Cerritos (83-69), and Capistrano Valley (73-61) before downing the Sunbelt League champs, Palm Springs, for the title. The Indians finished the year 27-2, gaining the finals with wins over Wilson of Hacienda Heights (80-56), Santa Ana (85-65), North Riverside (67-52) and Estancia (59-54).

MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL CAME UP DEAD EVEN IN 2-A DIVISION MVP VOTING BETWEEN SONORA HIGH SCHOOL'S JON SAMUELSON AND ARTESIA'S TOM TOLBERT....THUS CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR WERE NAMED AS THE FOUNDATION'S ANNUAL HARDCOURT SELECTIONS WERE RE-LEASED TODAY. SONORA, 2-A DIVISION CHAMPS (64-60 OVER GAREY) WHICH ADVANCED TO THE REGIONAL FINAL BEFORE LOSING TO SANTA CLARA (60-53), COMPLETED ITS SEASON 25-7. ARTESIA, THE SUBURBAN LEAGUE CHAMPION, REACHED THE 2-A DIVISION QUARTER-FINALS BEFORE LOSING TO GANESHA 59-56.

Coach Paul Bottiaux lauds his three-year varsity starting guard Jon Samuelson. "He can do it all at both ends of the court and led our team in every statistical category except rebounding....and he was second in that one." The 6-5, 190-pounder is the school's 2nd all-time leading scorer and rebounder and 1st all-time in assists.

The 6-7 Tolbert returns from last year's 2-A Division third team. He was a marked player, since Artesia had no outside threat to score, and was constantly double and triple teamed. He shot 60.4 per cent from the field and averaged around 11 rebounds and his coach, Gordon Ackerman, called his '83 achievements "outstanding."

In winning the 2-A Division Sonora defeated Whitmont (49-46), Saugus (62-45), Nogales (71-56) and Ganesha (75-62) before grounding Garey in the finale. Garey, winding up 1983 20-9, beat Glenn (66-55), Brea-Olinda (80-73), La Habra (61-58) and Bonita (62-59) to reach the finals.

Framed scroll awards will be presented to all first team performers, with Foundation bronze medallions going to Division MVPs at the 46th annual Basketball Awards Program to be held at First Interstate Bank on Saturday morning, April 30 at 10:30 a.m. Collegiate coaches will be invited to take part in the award presentation ceremonies.

SANTA CLARA HIGH'S JOE WALLACE NAMED PLAYER OF YEAR IN 1-A DIVISION BASKETBALL FOR 1983

JOE WALLACE, WHO WAS THE DRIVING FORCE BEHIND SANTA CLARA HIGH SCHOOL'S RUN FOR THE 1-A DIVISION BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1983 BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S HIGH SCHOOL AWARDS BOARD. WALLACE, ALONG WITH ALL MEMBERS OF THE 1-A DIVISION FIRST TEAM, WILL BE HONORED AT THE 46TH ANNUAL FOUNDATION BASKETBALL AWARDS PROGRAM ON SATURDAY, APRIL 30TH.

Wallace, a 6-6 senior forward who coach Lou Cvijanovich calls "the finest player I have coached," is apparently headed for Washington State in the Pac-10. The 190-pound front court star averaged just a shade over 20 points over a 26-5 season, which saw the Santa Clara Saints defeat Blair (52-49) for the 1-A Division Championship.

Advancing to regional play, Santa Clara won over La Jolla (57-56) and Sonora (60-53) to take southern regional honors, but dropped a hard-fought, 53-51, championship engagement to the Central Coast Section Division II champions Menlo School.

In the 1-A Division playoffs, Santa Clara defeated Moorpark (77-65), L.A. Lutheran (47-39), Banning (62-58) and St. Joseph (52-50) before downing Blair for the title. To reach the finals Blair had eliminated Leuzinger (74-47), Perris (52-46), Notre Dame of Riverside (76-51) and Valley Christian (66-56). Blair concluded the season 26-4.

JEFF TODD, COACH ELLIOT TURETT'S FRONT-COURT PHENOM WHO LED THE CROSSROADS ROAD-RUNNERS TO THE SOUTHERN SECTION "SMALL SCHOOLS" BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP 64-53 OVER CHADWICK IN THE TITLE-DECIDER, WON UNANIMOUS BACKING AS THE DIVISIONS MVP AS ANNUAL HARDWOOD HONOR TEAMS WERE RELEASED TODAY BY FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION. Banning was Pacific League titlist (8-2) and wound up city-season play 18-8. Banning was eliminated in the first round of the Southern Cal regionals, 79-77, by Riverside Poly, while Willie West's Crenshaw Cougars defeated Long Beach Poly (62-53) for the southern regional crown and Bishop O'Dowd of Oakland (62-55 in overtime) for the California State Division I Championship.

Coach William Hughes Reseda Regents emerged as L.A. City 3-A Division champs, defeating Valley 3-A runnerup Canoga Park 54-41. Reseda, the Valley 3-A champions (10-0), finished the city season 24-1. The Regents were eliminated in the first round of the southern regionals, 73-50, by Southern Section 4-A champion Mater Dei.
