O ABSOLUTELY NO ONE'S SURPRISE, CRENSHAW HIGH'S FABULOUS ALL-AROUND HARDCOURT PERFORMER JOHN WILLIAMS WAS AGAIN UNANIMOUSLY NAMED LOS ANGELES CITY 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR, AS THE 47TH ANNUAL L.A. CITY ALL-STAR EAMS WERE SELECTED BY FIRST INTERSTATE BANK ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S ALL-LOS ANGELES CITY BOARD OF THLETICS. EUGENE JACKSON, WHO LEAD RESEDA HIGH'S REGENTS TO THE 3-A DIVISION CITY TITLE, WAS LSO A UNANIMOUS MVP CHOICE.

Although losing the L.A. City 4-A title to Banning last year, Crenshaw advanced brough the regionals to defeat Bishop O'Dowd of Oakland 62-55 in 1983. This season, with John illiams again leading the way, the Cougars whipped Westchester 112-59 in the 4-A finals...with ohn scoring 41 points, 15 rebounds, six blocked shots and four steals. In four playoff games he cored 156 points breaking the old mark of 148 set by Manual Arts' Dwayne Polee in 1981.

Awarded a bye in the first round of the regionals, Crenshaw got over North Riveride 67-63 before losing to Long Beach Poly 58-54 in the finals. Poly went on to the state final eating St. Ignatius of San Francisco 65-45. Crenshaw's final season record was 22-3.

Three-A City Champion Reseda...51-39 over Wilson...was led to a 21-4 season by -3, guard Eugene Jackson, called by coach Bill Hughes, "the best guard in the city...maybe Califraia." He averaged 25.9 points per game and nine assists. The Regents lost to Foothill of Bakresfield, 60-57, in the first round of the regionals.
