The Southern Section's top regular-season scorer, Robbie Miller of Voyagers Christian is a member of the '85 Small Schools Team. Jake Devane of Cal Prep and MVP Boehm are also among the top ten season scorers.

SO CUT AND DRIED WAS THE 3-A MVP SELECTION. IN SOMEWHAT OF A SURPRISE, FAIRFAX HIGH'S SENSATIONAL SOPHOMORE, SEAN HIGGINS, RECEIVED A MAJORITY BOARD VOTE, ALTHOUGH TEAMMATE TONY
THOMAS HAD BEEN NAMED WESTERN LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR.

It was Thompson who led Crenshaw to its second straight 4-A Division crown and eighth overall title under coach Willie West. The 6-3, 175-pound guard averaged 28 points over the Central League season and scored 30 points in the Cougars title win over Manual Arts, 73-62 The Cougars advanced to the state championships with a Southern California Regional win over San Diego Section champion Poway, 79-61, and Central Section titlist Edison of Fresno, 100-62. Crenshaw boasts a perfect 23-0 record going into the Oakland Tournament of Champions.

Coach Harvey Kitani's Fairfax Colonials swept through Western League action 10-0 and won the 3-A Division crown with wins over Venice (71-51), South Gate (67-42), Wilson (59-45) and San Pedro's Pilots, 65-61. The Colonials lost in the first round of the regionals to Edison of Fresno, 72-62. Coach Kitani's crew finished the season, 25-2.

Los Angeles City Players of the Year Stephen Thompson and Sean Higgins, along with members of the 4-A and 3-A Division all-star teams, will be honored guests at the 48th annual All-Southern California Board of Basketball Awards Program. Presentation of awards on Saturday, April 27 will be made at First Interstate Bank in downtown Los Angeles. Ceremonies begin at 10:30 am.

Keith malone, serra high school's senior scoring leader and number seven scorer (25.6 points) in the southern section over the regular 1986 season, has been voted player of the year in 5-A division bas-ketball by members of first interstate bank/amateur athletic foundation of los angeles' all-southern california board of athletics.
