

STACEY AUGMON, MUIR HIGH'S 6-8 SENIOR SCORER, NAMED 1986 MVP IN 4-A DIV. BASKETBALL

STACEY AUGMON, SENIOR FRONT-COURT STAR FOR COACH MIKE O'CONNOR'S MUIR MUSTANGS, HAS BEEN VOTED SOUTHERN SECTION DIVISION 4-A PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION SELECTION BOARD MEMBERS. ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS WERE MADE RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY IN BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS DIVISIONS. AUGMON LED MUIR TO THE 1986 PACIFIC LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND TO THE 4-A DIVISION TITLE, 58-55, OVER MARMONTE LEAGUE CHAMPION SIMI VALLEY.

Although averaging 20 points during regular season play, Stacey Augmon scored but 13 in the title game against Simi Valley. Suffering from a severe headache, Augmon was below par until the final two minutes of the title decider, when he completed a three point play and pulled down three critical rebounds to give the Mustangs the 4-A championship.

Both Muir and Simi Valley were 27-2 going into the final game. Muir, advancing to the Southern Regional playoffs, fell before San Diego Section champ Poway, 77-74. In Southern Section playoff action, Muir defeated Warren (60-48), Mission Viejo (69-58), San Geronimo (74-70) and Dominguez (58-56).

All players named for 4-A Division all-star team honors will be recipients of framed scroll awards from First Interstate Bank in association with the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles. The 49th annual Basketball Awards honoring all first-team members will be held in May, with players, coaches and high school administrators as honored guests. All-star teams follow:

S COTT WILLIAMS, UNANIMOUS MVP SELECTION IN 3-A DIVISION BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF BASKETBALL AND LEADER OF COACH MIKE LOWE'S STATE CHAMPION WILSON WILDCATS, WILL BE AMONG HONORED GUESTS AT THE 49TH ANNUAL SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BASKETBALL AWARDS PROGRAM TO BE HELD IN MAY UNDER THE AUSPICES OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK IN ASSOCIATION WITH THE AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES. ANNUAL ALL-STAR BASKETBALL TEAMS, PICKED BY A BOARD OF SOUTHLAND SPORTS JOURNALISTS, WERE NAMED RECENTLY IN MEETINGS HELD IN CULVER CITY.

Williams, a repeater from last year's 3-A Division first team, was a major force in the Wildcats' 31-3 season. He had 27 points and 16 rebounds in the 3-A Division finale against Ganesha, a team that came into the championship game 28-1. The 6-10 center had big games in the Southern Cal Regionals, as Wilson registered consecutive 18-point-spread wins over Washington (Fresno)...52-34, and El Camino (Oceanside)...64-46. Wilson overpowered Northern Cal champion Aptc 72-46 for the state crown.

On its way to the 3-A Division championship the Wildcats defeated La Quinta (92-67), Valencia (63-50), Claremont (69-60) and Katella (52-50) before shading Ganesha for the title.

EMORY LEWIS, CALLED BY HIS COACH SCOTT KAY... "A GREAT PLAYER... BEST IN SAN BERNARDINO HIGH SCHOOL HISTORY" ... HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN CIF 2-A DIVISION BASKETBALL BY THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD OF HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS. ANNUAL TEAMS WERE SELECTED LAST WEEK IN CULVER CITY BY PREP SPORTS JOURNALISTS FROM THROUGHOUT SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA.

Lewis, 6-9 center who led the Cardinals to the San Andreas League title and into the semi-finals of the playoffs, was the CIF's sixth high scorer in '86 with a 26.2 point average. He was also among the section's top rebounders averaging 12 "boards" per outing.

A top-seeded team in its division, San Bernardino lost to eventual champion Murphy (53-51) in the 2-A semi-finals. The Cardinals wound up '86...26-4.

Coach Jim Tinker's Murphy Nobles, Santa Fe League Champions, defeated San Dimas (61-58), Banning (63-60), South Pasadena (66-61), and San Bernardino (53-51) before meeting Charter Oak in the final game. The Nobles beat an extremely cold Lancers five by 18 points, 47-29. Murphy concluded its season 20-8 after losing to El Camino of Oceanside in the Southern California Regionals 58-45. Charter Oak closed out its season 22-5.

JAMES JOHNSON, CHADWICK HIGH-SCORING SENIOR FORWARD, VOTED TOP 1-A DIV. PLAYER FOR 1986

CHADWICK HIGH SCHOOL'S JAMES JOHNSON WAS VOTED CIF 1-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1986 BY ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS AT THE BOARD'S ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION MEETING HELD IN CULVER CITY LAST WEEK. IT MARKED THE 49TH YEAR THAT SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE SELECTION BOARD, UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK IN ASSOCIATION WITH THE AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES.

With James Johnson leading the way, Chadwick completed a perfect 8-0 Prep League season and went to the quarter-finals before losing to Marshall Fundamental, 63-50. Johnson finished high among Southern Section scorers with a 24.2 point average and pulled down an average of 13 rebounds per contest. A 6-5, 205-pound forward, Johnson is described by his coach, Tom Maier, as "an outstanding scorer, great rebounder...strong...tough athlete." Chadwick won the 1-A Championship last year, 63-56, over this year's winner Crossroads.

As defending champion and Prep League Champ, Chadwick was seeded in the playoffs as were Whittier Christian (top seed), L.A. Baptist and Crossroads. Whittier Christian entered the playoffs undefeated (22-0) and went to the final before losing to Crossroads, 70-61. The Roadrunners defeated Ontario Christian (77-70), Twentynine Palms (65-63), and L.A. Baptist (45-42) before meeting Whittier Christian. Crossroads won the Southern Cal Regionals 94-60 over Whitney.

Before losing in the finals, the Olympic League kingpins dispatched Beaumont (93-31), Tehachapi (84-45), and Marshall Fundamental (77-51). Coach Elliot Turret's Roadrunners appeared in the finals for the fifth straight year. They finished the '86 season 20-7.

All honored players and championship coach, Elliot Turret will receive beautiful framed scroll awards at the 49th annual Basketball Awards Program to be held in May. The awards ceremonies will be under the ongoing auspices of First Interstate Bank and the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles.

MATT BOWLEY, OF CIF SMALL SCHOOLS CHAMPION WHITNEY HIGH SCHOOL, AND MARK BAUER, WHO LED HIS VENTURA TEMPLE CHRISTIAN TEAM TO THE DIVISION SEMI-FINALS, HAVE BEEN VOTED CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR FOR 1986 BY MEMBERS OF THE AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD ATHLETICS. ONE TWELVE-MAN TEAM WAS SELECTED IN ANNUAL SELECTIONS AT CULVER CITY, WITH PLAYERS BEING HONORED WITH FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION AWARDS AT SPECIAL CEREMONIES TO BE HELD IN MAY.

Matt Bowley led the Whiney Wildcats to the CIF Small Schools Division Championship, 76-58 over Bel-Air Prep. Coach Bruce Carlisle's "Cats" completed the '86 season 22-5 with wins over St. Vincent (87-67), Cal Lutheran (74-51), Silver Valley (71-49) and Bel-Air Prep in the finals.

Located in Cerritos, Whitney ran away from Bel-Air Prep in the second half of the title decider, winning by 18 points. Bowley finished the game with 18 points and nine rebounds, as all Wildcat starters finished in double figures. Just a junior, Bowley averaged 18 points for the year and is called by his coach, Bruce Carlisle, "the best player in the small schools."

Co-MVP Mark Bauer, who led Temple Christian's Knights to the semi-finals of the playoffs, averaged 20.8 points and was high among Southern Section rebounders, averaging 12 per game. The Knights, top-rated Small Schools team going into the playoffs with a 20-1 record, defeated Holy Martyrs (66-45), Windward (56-43), and Yeshiva (76-54) before losing to Whitney (55-54). They finished the season 23-2.

The 49th annual Basketball Awards Program conducted by First Interstate Bank in association with the Amateur Athletic Foundation will be held in May... date to be announced. STEPHEN THOMPSON (CRENSHAW) REPEATS AS L.A. CITY 4-A BASKETBALL MVP...JERRY SIMON (MARSHALL) WINS UNANIMOUS VOTE AS 3-A MVP FOR 1986

STEPHEN THOMPSON AND JERRY SIMON ARE AMONG SEVEN REPEATERS ON THIS YEAR'S ALL-CITY BASKETBALL TEAMS, AS SELECTED IN ANNUAL MEETING OF ALL-LOS ANGELES CITY BOARD OF ATHLETICS AT THE LOS ANGELES BOARD OF EDUCATION LAST WEEK. THOMPSON, WHO LED COACH WILLIE WEST'S COUGARS TO THEIR THIRD STRAIGHT L.A. CITY TITLE, WAS THE CITY MVP LAST YEAR, TOO. CRENSHAW WON THE STATE TITLE IN '85, LED BY THOMPSON, AND AT THIS WRITING ARE ON THEIR WAY TO OAKLAND AGAIN TO PLAY FOR THE STATE TITLE. THOMPSON WAS CITY PLAYOFF MVP.

JERRY SIMON, MARSHALL HIGH SCHOOL'S PROLIFIC SCORER, LED THE BARRISTERS TO THE NORTHERN LEAGUE TITLE (10-0) AND TO THE 3-A CROWN. MARSHALL WAS ELIMINATED IN THE FIRST ROUND OF THE SOUTHERN REGIONALS BY EDISON HIGH SCHOOL OF FRESNO. SIMON SET A NEW L.A. CITY SCORING RECORD OF 378 POINTS (10 LEAGUE GAMES) AND A SINGLE-GAME MARK OF 69 POINTS AND 25 REBOUNDS IN A LEAGUE ENCOUNTER WITH BELMONT.

It was Willie West's ninth L.A. City Championship, as the 4-A Division "Super Power" whipped Cleveland in the finals, 95-79. On its way to the finale Crenshaw dispatched Dorsey (98-76), Manual Arts (103-79) and Carson (90-82). In the Southern Regionals, the Cougars got a bye in the first round and then defeated Poway of San Diego (82-73) and Mater Dei, Southern Section 5-A champ, (59-57) in overtime.

Simon, who reportedly is off to the University of Pennsylvania next fall, led the Barristers to a 23-4 season. The Northern League Champions defeated Chatsworth (65-51), San Fernando (82-67) and Van Nuys (57-55) before downing University (62-47). Simon had 28 points and 17 rebounds in the title decider.

It is interesting to note that the L.A. City scoring record set by Marshall High's Jerry Simon, broke the mark set by another Barrister player. John Starkins averaged 36.9 points during the 1969 season.
