

CHRIS MILLS (FAIRFAX) & GARY GRAY (GRANADA HILLS) NAMED L.A. CITY 4-A & 3-A DIVISION MVPs FOR THE 1987 BASKETBALL SEASON

CHRIS MILLS, FAIRFAX HIGH SCHOOL FRONT-COURT STAR WHO LED COACH HARVEY KITANI'S COLONIALS TO THE VALLEY 4-A LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE L.A. CITY CHAMPIONSHIP (86-58) OVER 4-A LEAGUE RUNNER-UP CLEVELAND, HAS BEEN VOTED LOS ANGELES CITY 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES HIGH SCHOOL BOARD OF ATHLETICS.

In annual all-star team selections, held at the Athletic Foundation in mid-town Los Angeles, Gary Gray of Granada Hills High School was a unanimous pick as 3-A Division MVP. The Highlanders defeated Northwest Valley League champion Birmingham 60-55 in the 3-A title-decider, as Gray scored 25 points for high-point honors.

In the 4-A final Chris Mills led all scorers with 24 points and had 11 rebounds. He was named the tournament MVP, as Fairfax concluded its L.A. City basketball season 25-0. The Colonials and the Granada Hills Highlanders both advanced into the California State Playoffs and at this writing Fairfax has yet to play, while the Highlanders have been eliminated by Edison of Fresno, 73-72. Granada Hills' Gary Gray scored 31 points in a losing cause and was high-point man.

Fairfax defeated Washington (79-66), Manual Arts (82-75) and Dorsey (79-66) before whipping Cleveland for the fourth time in the finals, 86-58. The Cavaliers wound up the season 19-4.....all losses to the undefeated Colonials.

Granada Hills won playoff games over Roosevelt (93-77), North Hollywood (66-59) and San Fernando (80-67, before the title contest.

All players named to the All-Los Angeles City 4-A and 3-A Division all-star teams will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles certificate awards. Championship coaches and players of the year will also be honored with special recognitions.

MATER DEI'S 6-11 CENTER, LERON ELLIS, UNANIMOUS SELECTION AS 5-A CIF BASKETBALL PLAYER OF YEAR..

FOR RELEASE: TUESDAY AFTERNOON, APRIL 7 & Wed. am's

LERON ELLIS, COACH GARY McKNIGHT'S "SUPER SENIOR", LED MATER DEI HIGH SCHOOL TO ITS THIRD STRAIGHT C.I.F. DIVISION 5-A BASKETBALL CROWN AND LATER THE SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA AND STATE DIVISION ONE CHAMPIONSHIPS AS THE MONARCHS COMPLETED A 31-1 SEASON. FOR HIS EFFORTS, THE RETURNING ALL-CIF SELECTION, WAS THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES UNANIMOUS 5-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR...AS VOTED BY ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS.

In the words of coach McKnight, "He (Ellis) is in a class by himself this year. There's no comparison between LeRon and anyone else around."

Ellis had 21 points and 15 rebounds (both game highs) in the Monarchs' 53-52 win over Millikan for the 5-A Division title. He had 22 points and 16 board against Fairfax, as Mater Dei eliminated the previously undefeated Colonials 46-42 to win the Southern Cal title. At Oakland's Coliseum Arena, Mater Dei's stellar senior scored 28 of his team's 69 points, added four blocks and six rebounds, as the Santa Ana area Monarchs defeated Ygnacio Valley (69-51) and collected the school's first state title.

Mater Dei defeated Fountain Valley (64-42), St. Anthony (68-57), St. Monica (48-47) and Millikan in the finals for the CIF 5-A Championship. Millikan, the Moore League Champion, won games over St. Paul (72-56), Servite (49-45) and Lakewood (67-57) before the finals.

All players named for 5-A Division all-star team honors will be recipients of framed scroll awards from First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles. Title-winning coaches and MVPs will also receive awards.

DON MacLEAN, SIMI VALLEY JUNIOR CENTER, PICKED MVP IN 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL FOR '87 SEASON...

SIMI VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL'S JUNIOR CENTER, DON MacLEAN WHO ALREADY HAS THE SCHOOL'S ALL-TIME SCORING RECORD, HAS BEEN VOTED 4-A DIVISION CIF PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES HIGH SCHOOL SELECTION COMMITTEE. THE 6-10 JUNIOR SCORED 1,335 POINTS FOR THE MAROON AND GOLD PIONEERS THUS FAR IN HIS CAREER AND THIS YEAR AVERAGED 25.3 POINTS AND 11.4 REBOUNDS. HE SCORED 20 OR MORE POINTS IN 23 OF 27 GAMES IN WHICH HE PLAYED IN '87.

MacLean was a 63% field goal shooter and was 85% from the charity line. Although Simi Valley was eliminated in the quarter-finals of the 4-A Division playoffs, MacLean was the Foundation board's majority MVP choice over three other candidates.

Santa Monica won the 4-A title, 62-60, over Westlake. The Vikings, Ocean League champs, beat Morse (San Diego) in the Southern Cal Regionals, but then fell before LA City champion Fairfax, 83-65.

First Interstate Bank and Foundation awards will go to all honored 4-A Division players, with Santa Monica coach Cliff Hunter and Simi Valley MVP Don MacLean also receiving special recognitions. Four-A honor teams follow:

ROLLING HILLS HIGH'S DOUG GEHR IS VOTED TOP PERFORMER IN CIF 3-A BASKETBALL FOR 1987...

DOU**G** GEHR, WHO LED COACH CLIFF WARREN'S ROLLING HILLS TITANS TO THE BAY LEAGUE CHAMPIONSHIP AND THE FINALS OF THE 3-A DIVISION PLAYOFFS, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN HIS DIVISION BY MEMBERS OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS PREP SELECTION BOARD. AVERAGING OVER 20 POINTS IN A 25-4 SEASON, GEHR WAS ALSO HIS TEAM'S LEADING REBOUNDER, AS THE TITANS LOST TO SAUGUS, 66-53, FOR THE CHAMPIONSHIP.

In winning the division title, Saugus became only the second team to do so coming from a "wild-card" berth. The Centurians best Katella in an opening-round over-time game, 69-68, and then dispatched California, 67-63, Tustin, 59-56, and Palos Verdes, 45-41, before beating Rolling Hills for the crown. In Div. II Southern California playoff action, Saugus beat Oceanside, 47-39, before losing to eventual State Champion Woodbridge, 65-53.

This marks the 50th year that Southern California all-star basketball teams have been selected by southland sports journalists. Over this period, some of the nation's top players have been accorded recognition for their play. Awards will be presented to all honored players by First Interstate Bank and the Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles. Coaches and division MVPs also receive awards.

A DAM KEEFE, COACH BILL SHANNON'S 6-8, JUNIOR CENTER WHO GUIDED THE WOODBRIDGE WARRIORS TO THE 2-A DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP, WAS VOTED THE DIVISION'S TOP PLAYER BY MEMBERS OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS, AS ANNUAL SELECTIONS WERE HELD RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY. THE WARRIORS, PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE CHAMPIONS, DEFEATED SUNKIST LEAGUE KINGPINS BANNING, 68-60, IN THE OVER-TIME CHAMPIONSHIPS GAME.

Keefe, who was his league's MVP, scored 32 game-high points in the championship game with Banning before being ejected for fighting with 4:37 remaining in regulation play. Keefe, among the state's top junior players, took the Warriors from their over-time Southern Section win all the way to the state championship. Woodbridge won the Div. II State Championship over North Coast De Anza 89-53. Woodbridge, finishing its State Championship season 28-5, whipped Washington of the CIF Central Section (71-66) and Saugus 3-A Southern Section Champion (65-53) to advance to the title game in Oakland.

CHRIS BROWN, LEADER OF CROSSROADS HIGH SCHOOL'S DIVISION III CALIFORNIA STATE CHAMPIONS, HAS BEEN NAMED SOUTHERN SECTION CIF DIV. 1-A PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S HIGH SCHOOL SELECTION BOARD. THE BOARD'S 50TH ANNUAL SELECTIONS MEETING WAS HELD RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY, WITH ALL-STAR TEAMS BEING NAMED IN EACH OF THE SOUTHERN SECTION'S SIX DIVISIONS OF PLAY.

Crossroads, the defending 1-A Division champion (70-61 over Whit.Chr. in '86) won the title 58-48 over Whittier Chr. again this year. Chris Brown, who coach David Benezra says, "takes over in big games," did just that in the title-decider. He scored 16 of his game-high 26 points in the 4th quarter against the Whittier Christian Heralds.

The Delphic League Champions swept through the Southern Section's 1-A Division over Flintridge Prep (69-54), Montclair Prep (75-49) and Harvard (79-55) before dispatching Whittier Christian 58-48. Then the Roadrunners beat Riverdale of the Central Section (59-42) and Whitney, Southern Section Small Schools Champions (74-46) before taking the California State title, 83-65, over Colusa of the Northern Section of the CIF. Crossroads completed its state-championship season 26-5.
