

JOHN STAGGERS (CRENSHAW) & STEFON DAVIS (JORDAN) NAMED 4-A & 3-A DIVISION PLAYERS OF YEAR IN L.A. CITY BASKETBALL FOR 1988 SEASON

JOHN STAGGERS, COACH WILLIE WEST'S SENIOR FORWARD WHO LED HIS TEAM TO A PERFECT 26-0 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON WHICH GAVE THE CRENSHAW COUGARS THEIR 10TH L.A. CITY TITLE UNDER COACH WEST, HAS BEEN VOTED LOS ANGELES CITY'S 4-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1988. SELECTIONS, MADE ANNUALLY SINCE 1937, TOOK PLACE AT THE AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES....AS ALL-STAR TEAMS WERE NAMED IN BOTH 4-A and 3-A DIVISIONS.

Three-A Division MVP honors went to Jordan High School's Stefon Davis who, like Stagers, is a repeater from last year's City team.

All players named for 1988 All-City Team honors will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation certificate awards.

In winning its 10th City title under coach Willie West, Crenshaw defeated Manual Arts 83-67 with John Stagers leading the way with 22 points. Two other Cougars, Doug Meekins and Cornelius Holden (who join Stagers on the '88 4-A squad) scored 20 and 19 points respectively.

In winning its first L.A. City title since 1970, Jordan High's Bulldogs whipped Grant 56-41 with junior, 3-A MVP Stefon Davis scoring 29 points. Davis averaged 22.0 points on the year, slightly above his '87 season output when he was named to the team as a sophomore.

On its way to the 4-A title, Crenshaw defeated Palisades (101-72), Washington (107-86) and Fremont (98-74).

In winning the 3-A title, Jordan dispatched Lincoln (78-62), San Fernando (83-79) and Los Angeles (58-52) before the title showdown with Grant.

DARRICK MARTIN, ST. ANTHONY POINT GUARD, NAMED TOP PERFORMER IN 5-A DIV. BASKETBALL FOR 1988

FOR RELEASE: FRIDAY, APRIL 1 AMs and after

DARRICK MARTIN, DESCRIBED BY HIS COACH AS "THE BEST POINT GUARD IN THE NATION", HAS BEEN NAMED 5-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION'S BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS. THE ANNUAL SELECTIONS MARK THE 51ST YEAR THAT PREP WRITERS FROM SOUTHLAND NEWSPAPERS HAVE MET TO HONOR PLAYERS FOR THEIR HARDWOOD ACHIEVEMENTS. MARTIN RETURNS FROM LAST YEAR'S 5-A DIVISION TEAM, WHEN HE AVERAGE 31.0 ppg FOR THE SAINTS.

As was true in last year's playoffs, St. Anthony was eliminated in the early rounds after winning the Camino Real League title. Martin wound up the season as the Southern Section's top scorer, averaging 33.4 ppg. On his way to UCLA, Darrick scored 1,989 points during a three-year career of 77 games. In 33 of these engagements he was over 30 points.

Number two finisher Mater Dei turned the tables on number one Angelus League finisher Bishop Amat in the 5-A Division finals, in a 74-65 finale. Coach Gary McKnight's Monarchs, advancing to the Division I regional playoffs, lost to the Central Section's Hoover (Fresno), 64-63, in the first round. Bishop Amat suffered a similar fate, losing to Manual Arts -- eventual State Champion -- 94-91.

Mater Dei defeated Notre Dame (76-66), Edison (55-39) and St. Bernard (87-70) before its title match with Bishop Amat. The Angelus League's top team whipped Bosco Tech (76-56), Jordan of Long Beach (101-76) and Lakewood (62-54) before the title-decider.

All First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles all-star team selections are made by All-Southern California Board of Athletics, composed of southland sports journalists. All-star team players, MVPs and title-winnings coaches are honored at the close of each season with special recognitions from the bank and Athletic Foundation. Listing of past teams and records of those players are on file in the Athletic Foundation library.

DON MacLEAN, SIMI VALLEY CENTER, REPEATS AS 4-A DIVISION BASKETBALL PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1988

FOR RELEASE: THURSDAY, MARCH 31 AMs ... and after

DON MacLEAN, THREE-TIME ALL-SOUTHERN SECTION FIRST TEAM MEMBER ... TWO AS DIVISION MVP ... WAS A UNANIMOUS SELECTION AS 4-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR, AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS MADE ITS 51ST ANNUAL SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY.

MacLean, in scoring 1,008 points for the 4-A Division champion Simi Valley Pioneers, was the 5th ranked scorer in the Southern Section. He averaged 31.5 ppg and 12.3 rebounds. His career points (2,343) also placed him 5th among all-time southland prep scorers.

At 6-10 and 220 pounds, MacLean was a force on the backboards collecting a career 1,119 rebounds. This places him 8th on the Southern Section list. Leading the Pioneers to the Marmonte League title and a 27-3 season, MacLean was in double figures 29 out of the 30 games played. He scored over 20 points in 19 games. The Pioneers defeated Capistrano Valley 70-64, in an exciting overtime 4-A Division finale.

All players named for all-star team honors will be recipients of framed scroll awards from First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles. MVPs and championship division coaches will also be recognized.

LEO PARKER, JR., TUSTIN HIGH CENTER, IS NAMED TOP PLAYER IN 3-A DIV. CIF BASKETBALL FOR '88

FOR RELEASE: WEDNESDAY, MARCH 30 AMs and after

LEO PARKER, JR., COACH TOM McCLUSKEY'S SUPERIOR SENIOR CENTER, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN 3-A DIVISION SOUTHERN SECTION BASKETBALL FOR THE 1988 SEASON. PARKER WAS A UNANIMOUS SELECTION BY FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS. THE BOARD'S 51ST ANNUAL SELECTIONS WERE MADE RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY.

Parker, called "an excellent post player" by his coach, averaged 20.4 ppg as the Tillers advanced to the division final game before dropping a 58-54 overtime decision to Garden Grove League Champion Kennedy of La Palma. Tustin, runner-up to Saddleback in the Sea View League, finished the season 24-6, while Kennedy was 22-7. In the state playoffs Tustin went out in the first round, 75-50 losers to Madison of San Diego, while Kennedy went out one round later, falling to eventual State Div. II champ Foothill of Bakersfield, 71-64.

This marks the 51st year that Southern California all-star basketball teams have been selected by southland sports journalists. Over this period some of the nation's top players have been accorded recognition for their hardwood accomplishments. ADAM KEEFE, WOODBRIDGE SENIOR CENTER, NAMED 2-A DIV. BASKETBALL MVP FOR SECOND YEAR IN '88

FOR RELEASE: TUESDAY, MARCH 29 AMs ... and after

A DAM KEEFE, TWO-TIME CIF PLAYER OF THE YEAR AND SCHEDULED TO CONTINUE HIS BASKETBALL MAGIC AT STANFORD UNIVERSITY, WAS A UNANIMOUS CHOICE AS 2-A DIVISION MVP AS MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS MADE THEIR ANNUAL HARDCOURT SELECTIONS IN CULVER CITY. IT MARKED THE 51ST SEASON THAT THE ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD HAS MADE ITS ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS.

Keefe, who finished 10th among Southern Section large school scorers this past season with a 27.5 ppg average, led the Woodbridge Warriors to the Pacific Coast League title and to the finals of the 2-A playoffs before losing to Sunkist League champion Banning, 62-54. Last year, it was Woodbridge defeat-Banning 68-60 in overtime for the 2-A crown and then winning the state title, 89-63 over De Anza High of Richmond.

This year 2-A Champion Banning advanced to the state semi-finals, be-losing to Garces High of Bakersfield, 87-77. Woodbridge, in Div. II, also ad-vanced in state play to the semi-finals, losing its match with Madison High of San Diego, 67-64.

Keefe finished his prep career with over 2,000 points and 1400 re-bounds. All-star team players will receive special scroll awards from First In-terstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation. Honor teams follow:

MITCHELL BUTLER AND SCOTT HASKIN HAVE BEEN VOTED PLAYERS OF THE YEAR IN THEIR RESPECTIVE DIVISIONS (SMALL-SCHOOLS & 1-A) IN ANNUAL SELECTIONS MADE BY THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS. Both Butler and Haskin led their teams to division titles and both are repeaters from last year's all-star teams. Scott Haskin, in leading Beaumont to an 80-66 victory over Bellarmine-Jefferson in the 1-A title-decider, averaged 27.8 ppg this year, slightly higher than his 25.5 ppg of last season.
