TERRY CANNON, CRENSHAW, NAMED 4 - A DIVISION L.A. CITY  
BASKETBALL PLAYER OF YEAR ..... BRENT LOFTON, EL CAMINO  
REAL H. S., VOTED HONOR IN 3 - A DIVISION FOR 1989

CRENSHAW HIGH SCHOOL'S TERRY CANNON, WHO LED COACH WILLIE WEST'S COUGARS TO THEIR SECOND STRAIGHT CITY TITLE AND FIFTH OUT OF THE LAST SIX, HAS BEEN NAMED 4-A DIVISION PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-LOS ANGELES CITY BOARD OF ATHLETICS. BRENT LOFTON, WHO LED EL CAMINO REAL HIGH SCHOOL TO THE WEST VALLEY LEAGUE TITLE AND TO THE SEMI-FINALS OF THE 3-A DIVISION PLAYOFFS, WAS VOTED TOP PERFORMER IN 3-A DIVISION PLAY FOR '89.

In winning its 11th city championship under coach Willie West, Crenshaw defeated Manual Arts 85-72. It was the Toilers first '89 loss, leaving them 24-1 following the championship game. Crenshaw beat Manual Arts 83-67 for the title in last year's finale.

Crenshaw defeated Kennedy (62-48), Westchester (97-80) and Fairfax (60-47) before the title encounter with the Toilers. Manual eliminated Narbonne (97-47), Washington (80-69) and Carson (50-44) on its way to the title round.

El Camino Real's Brent Lofton, a 4-A Division selection last year, was named Player of the year in a close vote over last year's MVP

Stefon Davis of Jordan and Fremont High's Tyrone Phillips for 3-A Division MVP honors.

Fremont won the 3-A Division Championship, 65-48, over Los Angeles High School. Fremont defeated Eagle Rock (96-57), University (58-51) and El Camino Real (66-63) before testing the Romans. Los Angeles got over Poly (86-73), Bell (55-53) and Wilson (53-39) before losing to the Pathfinders. Fremont finished its city season 26-3, while L.A. wound up 17-9.

In Southern California playoff action, Crenshaw repeated its city playoff victory over Manual Arts, 84-72, to advance to the state finals against Skyline High of Oakland. Crenshaw had defeated Edison of Fresno in the semi-final of the Southern Cal tournament....110-92.

Manual Arts eliminated 3-A champion Fremont 65-64 in overtime to advance to the Southern Cal finals. Fremont had disposed of Millikan (66-60) in the first round, while Manual eliminated Capistrano Valley (69-63).

All players named for All-City Basketball Team honors will receive beautiful scroll awards from First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles. Medals and plaques will be awarded Players of the Year and championship coaches.

ED STOKES, ST. BERNARD HIGH SCHOOL, UNANIMOUS MVP OF  
CAMINO REAL LEAGUE, NAMED TOP PLAYER IN DIVISION I FOR 1989

EDWARD STOKES, 6-11 SENIOR CENTER FROM ST. BERNARD HIGH SCHOOL, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION I BASKETBALL FOR THE 1989 SEASON BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK- AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

In leading St. Bernard to the El Camino League title, Ed Stokes scored an average of 25 points per game and averaged five blocks. He was 5th in the C.I.F. Southern Section in rebounds with an average of 15 over the team's 29-game season (23-6).

St. Bernard advanced to only the second round of the Southern Section playoffs before losing to Citrus Belt League kingpin Redlands, 65-56. Millikan won the 5-AA title game, 62-59 in overtime, against Saddleback.

In the 5-A playoffs, Capistrano Valley won the title. The South Coast League Champions defeated league runner-up Irvine, 76-49, in the finale advancing to the Southern Cal Playoffs.

Neither Division I entry got past the first round of play in the state playoffs. Millikan lost to Fremont of Los Angeles (66-60), while Capistrano Valley was dropped by LA's Manual Arts (69-63).

All players named for all-star team honors will be recipients of First Interstate Bank - Amateur Athletic Foundation of Los Angeles scroll awards. Players of the Year will receive medallion awards, while championship team coaches will be recognized with plaques.

All-star teams have been selected by the Athletic Foundation's All Southern California Board of Athletics for 52 years. All teams named by the Foundation's selection board are on file in the AAF library, located in the Paul Ziffren Sports Resource Center.

TRACY MURRAY, GLENDORA HIGH SCHOOL, STATE SCORING RECORD  
BREAKER, NAMED DIVISION II PLAYER OF YEAR IN UNANIMOUS VOTE

TRACY MURRAY, 6-8, 220-POUND SENIOR FORWARD AND THREE-TIME BASE-LINE LEAGUE MVP, HAS BEEN VOTED PLAYER OF THE YEAR IN DIVISION II BASKETBALL BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS.

OVER A 31-3 CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON, MURRAY AVERAGED 44.26 POINTS PER GAME...A C.I.F. SOUTHERN SECTION AND CALIFORNIA STATE RECORD. IN THE FINAL WEEK OF THE REGULAR SEASON, MURRAY HAD ALREADY BECOME THE STATE'S TOP ALL-TIME CAREER SCORER (2,705 POINTS).

Playing every position on the floor at one time or another during the season, Murray led the Tartans to the Baseline League Championship and into the Southern Section 4-AA playoff. Although Murray scored 41 points in the title game against San Bernardino, the Tartans lost 72-69 to the Cardinals who completed a perfect 30-0 season.

Both Glendora and San Bernardino qualified for the Southern Cal playoffs, meeting in the semi-final game. The Tartans defeated San Bernardino this time, 52-46 and then edged Dominguez, the Southern Section 4-A champ, 61-57, for the Southern Cal title.

Advancing to the State Championships against Menlo-Atherton of the Central Coast Section, Murray scored 64 points in a losing cause. Menlo School won the Division II crown, 89-83.

Dominguez, the San Gabriel Valley League champs, won the 4-A Southern Section title with wins over Cypress (64-33), Rosemead (86-66), Barstow (54-36) and Artesia in the final (78-49). Dominguez beat Monache of the Central Section (78-37) and Torrey Pines (78-70) before going down before Glendora (61-57)....in the Southern Cal Playoffs.

RICK SWANWICK, TRABUCO HILLS CENTER, WINS UNANIMOUS ACCLAIM  
AS TOP PLAYER IN DIVISION III FOR THE 1989 SEASON .....

RICK SWANWICK, WHO LED THE TRABUCO HILLS MUSTANGS ALL THE WAY TO THE CALIFORNIA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP ONLY TO FALL ONE POINT SHY (62-61 TO CENTRAL VALLEY...NEAR REDDING), HAS BEEN NAMED THE SOUTHERN SECTION'S DIVISION III PLAYER OF THE YEAR FOR 1989 BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTER-STATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES AWARDS BOARD.

CALLED BY HIS COACH RAINER WULF, "THE MOST DOMINANT PLAYER IN EVERY ONE OF OUR GAMES THIS YEAR," SWANWICK SCORED EVERY SECOND-HALF POINT IN TRABUCO HILLS' LOSS TO THE NORTHERN CALIFORNIANS. AT 6-10 AND 225 POUNDS (HE HAD TRIMMED OFF 65 POUNDS OVER LAST SUMMER) SWANWICK WAS TRULY A "DOMINANT" FORCE.

Winner of the Pacific Coast League, the Mustangs had few problems in capturing the Southern Section 3-A championship.
