BOARD OF BASKETBALL. THE ANNUAL ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTIONS, MADE BY SOUTHLAND  
SPORTS JOURNALISTS, WERE MADE RECENTLY IN CULVER CITY.

Killum, a member of last year's Division I first team, led  
the Knights of Lynwood to the San Gabriel Valley League title and a seeded  
spot in the Southern Section playoffs. Going into playoff action Lynwood  
boasted a 25-1 record. Killum wound up 6th among Southern Section scorers.

Lynwood lost to the Moore League's number one five, Long  
Beach Poly, 60-58 in the 5-AA Division finals. In the first round of the  
Southern Cal tournament, Lynwood defeated Sweetwater 82-79, but ran up against  
Long Beach Poly in the semi-final and lost again to the Jackrabbits 69-59.

In the finals of the Southern Cal playoffs, Poly lost to  
eventual state champion Mater Dei 46-45.

UNANIMOUS CHOICE AS DIVISION II PLAYER OF YEAR...

ED O'BANNON, ARTESIA HIGH SCHOOL'S 6-9 SENIOR CENTER WHO MAKES HIS THIRD APPEARANCE ON THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-SOUTHERN SECTION FIRST TEAM, WAS A UNANIMOUS CHOICE AS DIVISION II PLAYER OF THE YEAR AS MEMBERS OF ALL-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA BOARD OF ATHLETICS MET IN CULVER CITY RECENTLY TO MAKE ITS ANNUAL HARDCOURT SELECTIONS.

O'Bannon, who led Artesia to the Suburban League title, the Southern Section Div. IV championship, the Southern Cal Div. II crown and the State title, concluded the regular season as the section's 19th top scorer.

In the title game against Fremont of Sunnyvale, O'Bannon had 26 points, including four three-pointers to lead the Pioneers to a 57-50 victory and the school's first state title.

Artesia coach Wayne Merino lauded his senior star, stating... " he can shoot it from the outside and today (against Fremont) he got a chance to do it when we needed it. Every time we needed to have a basket, he came through for us.

In Southern Section playoff action Artesia whipped four opponents by an average of 40 points. In Southern California playoff games the average margin of victory was 12 points. The Pioneers defeated San Marcos 75-47 for the Division 4-A title; Glendora (the Southern Section's 4-AA champs)

IN A DEAD EVEN VOTE BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' BOARD OF SPORTS JOURNALISTS, CO-PLAYERS OF THE YEAR HAVE BEEN NAMED IN DIVISION III SOUTHERN SECTION BASKETBALL. CHRIS GAINES, WHO LED DOS PUEBLOS TO THE 3-A DIVISION TITLE, AND TYRONE PAUL, MORNINGSIDE'S HIGHLY REGARDED SENIOR FORWARD, ARE THE PLAYERS SHARING PLAYER OF THE YEAR HONORS.

Chris Gaines hit the winning basket in the Chargers 39-38, overtime win against Corona del Mar. The 6-6 senior center averaged 20 points during the year and guided his at-large entry to the championship. Dos Pueblos won twice in Southern Cal playoff action, but lost 3-AA runner-up Servite 46-29 for the Southern Cal crown.

Tyrone Paul led a highly regarded Morningside team to the Ocean League title (14-0) and into the 3-AA plaoff top-seeded. The Monarchs were upset in the quarter-finals 83-80 by Lompoc, the Northern League's top team.

The Ocean League MVP, Paul led Morningside to a 24-4 season record averaging 20.5 points, eight rebounds and five assists. He boasts a 46-inch vertical leap.

The Eagles beat Western of Tulare in the first round of the Southern Cal playoffs, but dropped its semi-final engagement to Dos Pueblos 63-57. In winning the Southern Cal Div. III play-off, Servite won its first state title when the Friars shot a sizzling 72% from the floor to whip Mt. Eden of Hayward 67-51.

Steve Marusich, Servite's 6-7 center who made the Div. III first team, scored 21 points in the championship contest.

SHON TARVER, SANTA CLARA'S STATE CHAMPION  
STAR, REPEATS AS DIV. IV PLAYER OF THE YEAR...

" I SIMPLY THINK THAT HE IS THE BEST HIGH SCHOOL PLAYER IN THE COUNTRY," IS THE FORTHRIGHT STATEMENT OF COACH LOU CVIJANOVICH, WHO SHOULD CERTAINLY KNOW A TOP PLAYER WHEN HE SEES ONE AFTER 32 YEARS OF COACHING.

SHON TARVER HAS CERTAINLY DONE NOTHING TO DETRACT FROM THIS BOLD STATEMENT, LEADING THE SAINTS TO A 28-0 STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON AND A RECORD OF 55-1 (plus two forfeits) DURING HIS PREP CAREER.

The Saints repeated as State Div. IV Champions with a 56-38 victory over Vanden in the Oakland Coliseum. This victory brought Santa Clara its 45th straight win. Tarver, a 6-5 190-pound guard, averaged 31.6 points... 5th best in the Southern Section. He was a 54 % field goal shooter and 70.5 % from the line. He averaged 9.2 rebounds, four blocks, 3.5 assists and 2.8 steals. His point total was highest in Ventura County.

Santa Clara, in winning the 2-AA Southern Section title, defeated its four opponents by an average spread of 24 points. In the Div. IV Southern Cal playoffs, the Saints' average winning spread in three encounters was 28. The margin against Vanden in the state title game was 18 points.

In 2-A Division play, St. Joseph of Santa Maria defeated Laguna Beach 70-68 for the championship. And the Knights weren't all that shabby in collecting points either, averaging a spread of 24 points over four games. In the Southern Cal Div. IV finals, St. Joseph lost to Santa Clara by 26 points, 91-65. In this game Tarver had 40 points, 15 boards, six assists

Faith Baptist won the I-A Division title 65-59 over Brethren, an at-large entry from the Olympic League. The Contenders then advanced to the finals of the Southern Cal Div. V Playoffs losing to Christian School of El Cajon, 80-72. Faith Baptist concluded its season 20-11.

Ribet Academy of La Canada, Small Schools champs 68-60 over St. Margaret's, lost in the Division V Southern Cal playoffs to Faith Baptist 61-57 in the semi-finals. The Fighting Frogs finished the season 25-3.

CITY BASKETBALL PLAYER OF YEAR .... DANA JONES, NORTH  
HOLLYWOOD, VOTED TOP PLAYER IN 3 - A DIVISION PLAY FOR 1990

MANUAL ARTS HIGH SCHOOL'S WILLIAM CELESTINE, WHO LED COACH RANDOLPH SIMPSON'S MANUAL ARTS TOILERS TO THEIR FIRST L.A. CITY 4-A DIVISION TITLE SINCE 1981, HAS BEEN NAMED PLAYER OF THE YEAR BY MEMBERS OF THE FIRST INTERSTATE BANK - AMATEUR ATHLETIC FOUNDATION OF LOS ANGELES' ALL-LOS ANGELES CITY BOARD OF ATHLETICS. DANA JONES, WHO LED NORTH HOLLYWOOD TO THE 3-A DIVISION CHAMPIONSHIP, WAS THE BOARD'S CHOICE IN HIS DIVISION OF PLAY. STEVE MILLER COACHED THE HUSKIES.

In winning its first title in nine years, Manual Arts defeated perennial city kingpin Crenshaw, 84-72. And it was senior 6-6 center William Celestine leading the way with 25 points and 12 rebounds...20 of his points coming in the second half. In last year's 4-A finale, Crenshaw defeated Manual 85-72.....the Toilers first loss of the season leaving them 24-1 following the title game.

Manual Arts defeated San Pedro (104-58), Washington (86-43), and Dorsey (72-48) before the face-off with the Cougars.

Dana Jones, North Hollywood's 6-6 senior center headed for Pepperdine, was a unanimous pick (as was Celestine) as the 3-A MVP.

Jones led the North Hollywood Huskies to their first-ever basketball title by upsetting 28-2 Fremont, 76-71 in the 3-A title game. He dominated the game at both ends of the floor, scoring 29 points, grabbing 29 boards, and blocking seven shots.

The Huskies wound up 23-3 in city championship play. They defeated Lincoln (94-68), Hamilton (78-77) and Grant (85-69) before downing a formidable Fremont Five.

In Southern California playoff action, Manual Arts was defeated by eventual Div. I titlist Mater Dei, 72-64. The Toilers won in the first round beating Bakersfield, 73-72. North Hollywood, also performing in Div. I, got an unlucky draw also losing to Mater Dei 76-64.
