Martin Luther King High School Emergency Action Plan

Martin Luther King High School has a written emergency plan that should be followed in the event of a medical emergency. All coaches should be familiar with this document and their role and responsibility in an emergency. Any questions should be directed to the Head Athletic Trainer, Athletic Director, or school administrator.

An emergency is the need for Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to give further medical attention and/or transport an athlete to the hospital. It is important in these situations that coordination between the Athletic Trainer, coaches, and administrators be efficient and effective. This guide is intended to delineate roles and outline the protocol to be followed should an emergency occur.

Situations when 911 should be called are:

- An athlete is not breathing
- An athlete has lost consciousness
- It is suspected that an athlete may have a neck or back injury
- An athlete has an open fracture (bone has punctured through the skin)
- Severe heat exhaustion or suspected heat stroke
- Severe bleeding that cannot be stopped

*The highest person in the chain of command who is present at the scene will be the designated person in charge, or leader. That person is responsible for the following:

- Monitoring the athlete and administering necessary first aid until EMS arrives
- Designating someone to call 911
- Designating someone to get AED/ emergency equipment
- Designating someone to unlock all necessary gates and direct EMS to the venue; and/or notify a campus security/custodian to do so
- Designating someone to find the athlete's emergency card and notifying their emergency contact

Hierarchy

- The supervising Certified Athletic Trainer (ATC) working the event will assume responsibility of the care of the athlete until emergency personnel arrive.
- Once emergency personnel arrive, the EMTs or Paramedics will assume responsibility of the care.
 - o If at any time emergency personnel take action that the ATC believes will cause harm to the athlete, the ATC has the right to assist EMS or resume care of the athlete if necessary.
- At no time will any other school official, bystander, parent, or guardian assume control over the care of the injured athlete unless allowed by the supervising ATC.

Duties

- Certified Athletic Trainer
 - o Responsible for health care of injured athlete/s and activating the EAP

- Including, but not limited to: CPR, first aid, injury assessment, implementation of EAP, decision to move/not to move athlete, use of AED, and directing others to assist
- o Responsible for maintaining cervical stabilization in the event of a possible c-spine injury

Head Coach

o Responsible for calling EMS, ensure access to site, direct EMS to injured athlete, communicating with parents/athlete after transportation, emergency first-aid in event absence of ATC

Assistant Coach

 Responsible for retrieving emergency card and contacting emergency contact, assist with crowd control, accompanying injured athlete with EMS transportation from event if parents are unable

Campus Supervisor/Security

o Responsible for directing EMS to site of athlete with injury and ensuring gates are accessible for EMS, maintain crowd control

• Athletic Department Personnel and other Administrators

 Responsible for contacting campus supervisor/security and ensuring all gates are accessible for EMS, assist with crowd control

• Athletic Training Student Aides

 Responsible for assisting the ATC as directed, meeting EMS at designated location/guide to scene, retrieving Emergency Cards for ATC/Coaches/EMS

Sport Officials

o Maintain crowd control

Emergency Medical Personnel

o Responsible for care and transportation of the athlete

Transportation

- In the case of a non-life threatening injury that requires transportation to an emergency care facility, the designated emergency contact will be responsible for transportation unless otherwise requested.
 - o If the designated emergency contact is unavailable, EMS will transport the athlete and a designated school representative (assistant coach) will travel with athlete.
- In the case of a life-threatening injury and the need for immediate EMS transportation, the designated emergency contact is first in line to travel with the athlete if already on-site; otherwise the designated school representative (assistant coach) will travel with the athlete.
- An ambulance will be on-site for all home football games.
 - This ambulance CANNOT transport athletes nor leave the field; the on-site EMS is responsible for contacting a second ambulance to arrive for transportation.

Communication

- The primary means of communication is cell phones
- The secondary means of communication is landlines
- Email will be utilized for follow-up communication
- Communication with parents:
 - o In the event that an athlete requires transportation to an emergency care facility, the parents of the athlete must be contacted and informed of which facility they will be going to.
 - Emergency cards must be readily available at each practice/competition/event.

Example Athletics Emergency Procedures

Certified Athletic Trainer on Scene:

- The *Athletic Trainer* ensures scene safety and makes a primary evaluation with assessment of the ABCs; begins performing appropriate emergency protocol to care for the athlete.
- The *head coach* calls 911.
- An assistant coach retrieves the emergency card and contacts athlete's emergency contact.
- The assistant coach, campus supervisor, or an administrator will clear access to the site and will then meet EMS at the designated meeting site and direct them to the injured athlete.
- Assistant coaches and administrators are to assist with crowd control to ensure that medical personnel have room to function.
- Other trained personnel (coaches and administrators) may assist the AT until EMS arrives.
- Once EMS arrives, the *head coach* or *parent/emergency contact* relays all necessary medical information to EMS from the emergency card. The *Athletic Trainer* will relay information regarding the current situation.
- If parent/emergency contact is unavailable, EMS will transport the athlete and the designated school representative will travel along.
- The *Athletic Trainer* and *Athletic Director* will complete the appropriate medical documentation and continue to contact the athlete's emergency contact.

Certified Athletic Trainer on Campus, but NOT on Scene:

- The *head coach* ensures scene safety and makes a primary evaluation with assessment of the ABCs; begins performing appropriate emergency protocol to care for the athlete.
- An assistant coach calls 911 and locates the athlete's emergency card.
- Contacting the Athletic Trainer: assistant coach contacts Athletic Trainer after calling 911; OR a second assistant coach contacts Athletic Trainer right away; OR coaches send an athlete to get Athletic Trainer right away.
- Athletic Trainer arrives on site and assumes leadership role of EAP.
- The *head coach* then contacts the designated emergency contact via emergency card information.
- The *assistant coach, campus supervisor*, and/or an *administrator* will clear access to the site and will then meet EMS at the designated meeting site and direct them to the injured athlete.
- Assistant coaches and administrators are to assist with crowd control to ensure that medical personnel have room to function.
- Other trained personnel (coaches and administrators) may assist the AT until EMS arrives.
- Once EMS arrives, the *head coach* and/or *assistant coach* relay all necessary medical information to EMS from the emergency card. The *Athletic Trainer* will relay information regarding the current situation.
- If parent/emergency contact is unavailable, EMS will transport the athlete and the designated school representative will travel along.
- The *Athletic Trainer* and *Athletic Director* will complete the appropriate medical documentation and continue to contact the athlete's emergency contact.

Certified Athletic Trainer NOT PRESENT:

- The *head coach* ensures scene safety and makes a primary evaluation; begins performing appropriate emergency protocol to care for the athlete.
- An assistant coach calls 911 and then the athlete's emergency contact; or have a second assistant coach contact the emergency contact while the other calls 911.
- A *coach* or an athlete will contact an *administrator* to clear access to the site and will then meet EMS at the designated meeting site and direct them to the injured athlete.
- Assistant coaches and administrators are to assist with crowd control to ensure that medical personnel have room to function.
- Once EMS arrives, the *assistant coach* or *parent/emergency contact* relays all necessary medical information to EMS from the emergency card. The *head coach* will relay information regarding the current situation.
- If *parent/emergency contact* is unavailable, EMS will transport the athlete and the designated school representative will travel along.
- The *head coach* will complete an incident report and he/she, along with the *Athletic Director*, will continue to contact the athlete's emergency contact.
- The *head coach* will notify the *Athletic Director* and *Head Athletic Trainer* of the incident within 24 hours, and the *Head Athletic Trainer* will complete appropriate medical documentation.

AWAY GAME/COMPETITION:

- When you arrive at an away game/competition, ask the opposing coach if they have an athletic trainer on site and where he/she will be located during your time there.
- The *host athletic trainer* is in charge of all injury/emergency situations and return to play decisions for our athletes.
- The *host athletic trainer* will ensure scene safety, make a primary evaluation with assessment of the ABCs, and begin performing appropriate emergency protocol to care for the athlete.
- The *head coach* and *assistant coaches* should be at the scene to assist the *host athletic trainer* with things like calling 911 and contacting the athlete's emergency contact.
- Once EMS arrives, a *coach* or *parent/emergency contact* relays all necessary medical information to EMS from the emergency card.
- If *parent/emergency contact* is unavailable, EMS will transport the athlete and the designated school representative will travel along.
- The *head coach* will complete an incident report and he/she, along with the *Athletic Director*, will continue to contact the athlete's emergency contact. The *head coach* may also receive an incident report from the *host athletic trainer* if possible.
- The *head coach* will notify the *Athletic Director* and *Head Athletic Trainer* of the incident within 24 hours, and the *Head Athletic Trainer* will complete appropriate medical documentation.
