Dave Farmer

At 90 years young, Dave Farmer continues to inspire as one of the CIF Southern Section's most dedicated officials—and is believed to be the oldest active high school referee in the nation. A graduate of the University of Redlands in 1956, Dave built a lifelong career as a teacher, coach, and official. He taught physical education and driver's education for 38 years while coaching multiple sports and shaping generations of student-athletes who still know him simply as "Coach Farmer." As an official, Dave has donned the black and white stripes for more than six decades across football, volleyball, basketball, and softball. His passion for fairness, consistency, and respect for the game has made him a fixture on fields and courts throughout the Inland Empire. Off the field, Dave's devotion extends to his family and community. He started a small landscaping and sprinkler business to support his late wife during her battle with Alzheimer's, and he continues that work today - directing the proceeds toward his great-grandchildren's futures. Known for his tireless work ethic, upbeat spirit, and love of athletics, Dave Farmer embodies what it means to dedicate a lifetime to sports, students, and service. He remains active, respected, and deeply admired - an extraordinary example of perseverance and passion.

Jon Hamro

Jon Hamro's contributions to the CIF Southern Section over the past three decades have been nothing short of extraordinary. As a long-serving Athletic Director at San Clemente High School, he demonstrated consistent leadership, professionalism, and dedication to student-athletes. Mr. Hamro successfully managed one of the section's largest and most competitive athletic programs, ensuring compliance with CIF regulations while promoting equity and sportsmanship across more than two dozen sports. He played an active role in the broader Southern Section community—participating in league governance, playoff site coordination, and eligibility reviews. He collaborated closely with CIF officials to support initiatives focused on academic accountability, athlete safety, and fair competition. As Head Coach, he led San Clemente's football team to a CIF Championship appearance in 2012, reinforcing his deep connection to the student-athlete experience. Mr. Hamro's influence extends well beyond wins and titles—he mentored new athletic directors, supported coaches, and modeled ethical leadership at every level. He remains widely respected throughout the Southern Section for his integrity, advocacy, and lasting impact. His service represents the highest standard of commitment to the mission and values of CIF.

Rich Shearer

Shearer, who came to the Southern Section in 2019 after serving a successful stint as teacher, coach and athletic director at Citrus Hill High School in Perris for more than 14 years, served as administrator at the CIF-SS in the sports of football, boy's and girl's wrestling and baseball. Shearer entered the field of education in 1991 after earning bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of California at Riverside. Prior to taking the role at Citrus Hill, Shearer taught, coached basketball and was the athletic director at Norte Vista High School in Riverside. He was named the Press Enterprise Riverside Basketball Coach of the Year in 2000. Shearer was named Citrus Belt Area Athletic Director of the Year in 2011 and California Coaches Association Athletic Director of the Year in 2019. His achievements also include induction into the Citrus Belt Area Athletic Directors Association Hall of Fame in 2019. Rich's work has left a lasting mark. In wrestling, he helped grow the girl's program by adding four new divisions for dual team championships. He also developed and implemented a more efficient one-day Masters Wrestling Qualifier, helping schools and athletes navigate the postseason more smoothly. In baseball, he led the addition of two new championship divisions, creating more competitive opportunities for programs of all sizes. And in football, Rich took on the challenge of implementing same-season competitive equity playoff divisions. His success in this implementation led to a transformation in the way playoff divisions are structured in most CIF Southern Section sports.

Inducted in 2023 into both the Orange County Wrestling Coaches Hall of Fame and the National Wrestling Hall of Fame. Earned 400+ Win Recognition from the National Wrestling Coaches' Association.

Compiled an overall Varsity Football record of 206–105–6, including 158–76–1 at Tustin. Led Tustin to
11 League Championships, 10 CIF SS Semi-Final appearances, 4 CIF SS Finals, and the 2011 CIF

Southwest Division Championship. Named Orange County Coach of the Year and CIF SS Southwest

Division Coach of the Year in 2011. In 2008, Tustin High School had 6 alumni playing in the NFL—the
most of any high school in the nation. Previously served as Head Coach at Costa Mesa High School
(1992–1994), winning a League Championship (1993) and reaching the CIF Finals, earning LA Times
and OC Register Coach of the Year honors. Head Coach at Ramona High School (1989–1991), leading
the team to a League and CIF SS Championship (1989) and being named Division 4 Coach of the Year.

Gwen Ritzau

Swim Coach
In the early 1970s, Gwen was among the first female athletes to compete in CIF-Southern Section swimming after Title IX. Returned in 1984 to her alma mater to coach the girls' swim program, leading it for 34 years. Her girls' swim teams went undefeated in league meets from 1984–2008 (25 straight years). Collected 26 league swim titles and a CIF-Southern Section championship in 2002. Coached eight swimmers who won individual CIF-SS titles. Also coached girls' golf, winning five league titles. Career totals: 41 league titles and one CIF-SS championship. Served on the CIF-SS Coaches Advisory Committee until her 2013 retirement.

Bob Timberlake

Golf Coach
Founded Mira Costa High School golf program in 1992 and coached for 22 years (354–72 record, 83% winning margin). Won 12 league titles, including 10 straight Bay League championships (2002–2011). Captured 3 CIF Southern Section Divisional Championships (2004, 2006, 2010) and 4 CIF runner-up finishes. Produced 7 league individual champions and 8 CIF SS individual finalists. Mentored 24 golfers to college careers, including 16 Division I players and 8 at HBCU programs. Earned 10 League Coach of the Year awards and multiple city honors from Hermosa Beach and Manhattan Beach. Served 10 years on CIF SS Golf Advisory Board; tournament director at Lakewood, Mountain Meadow, and Montebello; helped implement major rules changes (yardage lasers, coaching advice).
